
# WE NEED TO CLOSE THE EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT GAP IN NORTH CAROLINA.




That starts with an ambitious goal: ensuring that by 2030, **2 million North Carolinians** have a high-quality credential or a postsecondary degree.

Only 31 out of every 100 North Carolina high school graduates finishes a degree or credential within 6 years of completing high school.

By 2023, nearly 67 percent of jobs in our state will *require* a post-secondary degree or high-quality credential.







- In 2016, conversations shifted from college or career readiness to college and career readiness at all grade levels.
- Expanded resources and platforms to help students with college planning and course tracking.
- Increased partnerships with local businesses and community organizations.
- Created new learning opportunities in schools.

- Elementary Level Exposure
  - ✓ Implemented college visits for fourth-grade students
  - ✓ Participated in annual College Colors Day
  - ✓ Implemented AVID (Advancement via Individual Determination) at Walter Bickett, Wingate and Marshville elementary schools
  - Enhanced college awareness throughout the school buildings through pennants and signage
  - Participated in Wake up to Ag Day in cooperation with Union County Cooperative Extension



- Middle Exploration
  - ✓ Introduced Wayfind at Monroe and East Union middle schools
  - ✓ Implemented college visits for seventh-grade students
  - Offering students the opportunity to visit colleges virtually (VR headsets)
  - ✓ Major Clarity all middle schools have achieved Power User status (16,489 student usage)
  - Expanded Career and Technical Education (CTE) enrollment and courses offered
  - Added two middle school career development coordinators
  - Participated in Make it in Union, Equipment Rodeo activities
  - Developed Speakers Bureau




- High Experience
  - Increased ACT and SAT prep courses
  - Increased Advanced Placement and Career and College Promise courses
  - Expanded International Baccalaureate (Fall of 2022)
  - College representatives visit schools
  - SCOIR college guidance management system
  - Expanded Career and Technical Education (CTE) enrollment and courses offered
  - Increased enrollment in CTE course pathways
  - Increased the number of academy options at each high school



- Since 2020, UCPS has added two new academy options (Agriculture Mechanics and Robotics Engineering)
- For the 2022-2023 school year, 22 academy options will be available.
- Approximately 1,300 students are identified as CTE Concentrators. These students have completed a CTE course pathway in a specific area.

- Free college-access program with a foundation in mentorship for Monroe Middle, East Union, Monroe High and Forest Hills High students.
- Scholars are paired with Wingate University students to learn about college planning, financial aid, SAT and ACT prep, college visits, etc.
- There are 70 Wayfind scholars and 20 new scholars representing the class of 2026 were inducted in February.

A college and career pathway for UCPS students













- In 2016, UCPS identified six schools with low engagement and student achievement.
- Schools were identified as D/F schools by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction.
- Focus areas:
  - ✓ Effective leadership
  - ✓ Effective teachers
  - ✓ Daily, in school, intensive tutoring
  - ✓ Mental and behavioral health support
  - ✓ School Culture
  - ✓ More time in school



- The Health Sciences Academy at Monroe Middle began in the fall of 2017.
- The vision:
  - ✓ Increase and expand student and community engagement
  - ✓ Create relevant learning opportunities for students through a partnership with Atrium Health Union
  - ✓ Develop a K-12 health sciences program in the Monroe cluster
  - ✓ Align an innovative college and career pathway with education partners



#### Health Sciences at the middle school level

- Started in the fall of 2017 at Monroe Middle
- Curriculum includes a variety of related arts courses focusing on health sciences—medical investigators, neuroscience and biotechnology
- Atrium Health provides a healthcare specialist who is a liaison between the school and hospital
- Career-building experiences, watch live surgeries, externships









#### Health Sciences at the elementary school level

- Started in the fall of 2020 at East and Walter Bickett
- Curriculum includes neuroscience, nutrition and project-based learning
- Atrium Health provides a healthcare specialist who is a liaison between the school and hospital
- Hands-on experiences, career fairs, parent engagement events









#### Health Sciences at the high school level

- Started in the fall of 2020 at Monroe High
- 55 students enrolled in 2020 and 60 students enrolled in 2021
- Atrium Health provides a healthcare specialist who is a liaison between the school and hospital
- Experiences and opportunities include:
   Project Lead the Way curricula, Career and College Promise, patient care and medical emergency simulations, hospital tours, clinical experiences and surgery and procedure observations
- Staff works closely with CTE Department for course interests, development and pathways

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#### **Achievements**

- Over fourteen community and core team meetings have been held online, in person, and hybrid to accommodate attendees needs.
- Stakeholders from twenty-five organizations are attending and participating in collaborative meetings.
- The collaborative adopted the following vision statement: Our Future in UNiSON leverages community resources to increase educational attainment in Anson and Union counties by 16% by 2030. In our work, we will empower individuals to be successful, build a talent pipeline that meets labor-market needs, and expand economic development to reduce generational poverty.
- The collaborative set the following attainment goals: (1) 651 additional degrees/credentials (16% increase) by 2030 for population 25-44 in Anson County;
   (2) 4,218 additional degrees/credentials (16% increase) by 2030 for population 25-44 in Union County.
- Working teams were created based on target audiences. Teams defined their goals, outcomes, and criteria for success.
