History of the Program

- First year of the program was 2016-2017 school year
- Year one of the program had 12 industry partners
- The program started with only one pathway: Advanced Manufacturing





Special Features of the Program

- Student earns an associate degree during apprenticeship at no cost to him/her
- Student starts at \$11 per hour and can earn up to \$18 per hour as an apprentice in the program
- Student finishes with a journeyman's certificate
- Student finishes with a job with the company







Steps for Selection into the Program

- 1. Information Sessions
- 2. Application
- 3. Orientation Week
- 4. Interviews with Industry Partners
- 5. Draft Day
- 6. Pre-Apprenticeship
- 7. Signing Day





Summary

- Any high school junior or senior in Randolph County is eligible for this program
- Through the end of the 2020-2021 school year, 90
 apprentices have been selected for this program....71 of
 these individuals were students in the Randolph County
 School System
- Two pathways have been added since the start of the program: Automotive Systems and Information Technology
- Randolph Community College has been a very important partner in making this program a reality
- This program is a clear example of blending academic rigor with hands-on learning and the application of learning
