FOCUSED

Growing North Carolina's defense and homeland-security economy is the Foundation's sole focus. In 2006, when the Foundation was launched, military installations and defense-related industry had an \$18 billion impact on N.C.'s economy. Today, that figure is closer to \$24 billion and growing.

INNOVATIVE

The Foundation's **Defense Asset Inventory and Target Industry Cluster Analysis** pinpoints where the state's core strengths in industry, academia and R&D coincide with the emerging needs of the military. This strategy — actionable by industry and economic developers across the state — promotes innovation clusters for six target markets where North Carolina can best compete: C4ISR (Command, Control, Communications, Computers, Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance); Fuel and Power Sources; Human Factors; Performance Materials; RESET Support Activities; and Unmanned Systems.
