Short-Term Response

- Executive Order (3/20/2020)
 - Postponed 11th Congressional District Republican Second Primary to June 23, 2020
 - Protest proceedings stayed until May 20, 2020
 - Voting data by precinct extended
 - Suspended absentee request form drop off log
- Online Voter Registration Application launched in partnership with NCDMV (3/30/2020)





Long-Term Response

 - Legislative changes
 - Guidance from all-mail states
- Beyond all-mail balloting
 - Outside the box solutions
 - Basic improvements

Legislative Recommendations

- Expand options for absentee requests
- Establish online portal for absentee requests
- HAVA document allowed with absentee request form
- Pre-paid postage for returned absentee ballots
- Reduce or eliminate the witness requirement
- Modify procedure for counting ballots on Election Day
- Temporarily modify restrictions on assistance in care facilities
- Clarify authorization for telephonic meetings



Legislative Recommendations (cont.)

- Expand student poll worker program
- Make Election Day a holiday
- Increase poll worker pay
- Eliminate requirement that a majority of poll workers reside in precinct
- Temporarily suspend purchase and contract requirements
- Match HAVA funds (CARES Act funds now also available)
- Flexibility in conducting one-stop early voting



Federal Grants

- HAVA Grant (authorized late December 2019)
 - Federal share: \$11,625,810; State share: \$2,324,962; TOTAL: \$13,949,772
 - Categories
 - Voting equipment replacement and upgrades
 - Election auditing
 - Voter registration systems and management
 - Cyber vulnerabilities
 - Training
 - Communication
 - Additional categories requested by States
 - May be used for COVID-19:
 - Cleaning supplies and protective masks for staff and pollworkers, resources to meet an
 unanticipated increased demand for mail ballots due to self-isolation and quarantine in
 response to COVID19, and temporary staff to process the increased absentee ballot demand.
 - Funds may also be used for costs incurred to communicate law changes that could result from the pandemic.

Federal Grants

- CARES Act Grant (effective March 28, 2020)
 - Federal share: \$10,897,295; State share within 2 years: \$2,179,459
 - TOTAL: \$13,076,753
 - Categories
 - Increase the ability to vote by mail
 - Expand early voting and online registration
 - Improve the safety of voting in-person by providing additional voting facilities and more poll workers
