			While it's fair to have differing opinions on whether particular epidemiological models are correct, there can be little doubtespecially by nowthat the models that influenced the governor to make the decision were grossly incorrect. The models used didn't take in to account differences in population density, age distribution, geography, climate, lifestyle, hospital capacity, ventilator availability, etc. Building models and not controlling for differences like that is bad science. This was known when the models were the basis for the declaration.
			Even now, we're being told that the stay at home orders are "working," but there's no factual basis for that. It seems to be a logical conclusion, but it would be impossible to make a factual analysis given how little data there still is about the state of the virus' spread in NC and its actual impact on the health, life, and death rates.
			What IS clear, though, is that we have an economic crisis on our hands. And, per an immunologist from NIH (interview on TWiV), the vaccine will probably be more in line with the annual flu vaccine as coronaviruses tend to shift/ mutate and a "one size fits all, one shot and done" vaccine is highly unlikely. So, if this becomes an annual flu/COVID season we will have to learn to live in that environment. Continuing social distancing is fine, but we can't stay locked up month after month. Let's get NC back to work. The governor's extension of the stay at home order until May 8 was a gross miscarriage of his power.

This information should also be detailed in these news briefings given by our state leaders, Governor Roy Cooper and Dr. Mandy Cohen. NC DHHS has not made pre-existing health conditions available to the public but in NY, 94% of deaths had a pre-existing condition, with over half presenting with hypertension. Hypertension is a disease that typically does not present by itself but rather presents with another condition, e.g. obesity,diabetes. Median age of deaths in NY is 63, which is in line with our numbers. We have a very clear, defined patient population that is being treated for all intents in purposes the same as John Q. public. These should be the focus of care, treatment and policy. There is no guarantee of treat mentor vaccine on the horizon. We are inevitably delaying a re-opening of the state while creating more damage in the long term, then good in the short term. This is not only wrong but irresponsible on innumerable levels. Our state is estimated to lose 25-40 billion dollars in GDP over the course of our stay at home order, a deficit I worry we will never climb back from. Towns and business who will never be made whole again to no fault of their own. This shelter in place order is not a sustainable practice and was never meant to act as one. The data supports a better set of policies and a more expedited re-opening of the state, even on a phased approached.
