In response to the unique economic challenges of COVID-19, a consortium of public, private, and nonprofit partners have come together and launched an innovative recovery-lending program to help support entrepreneurs like you and stabilize North Carolina's small business sector.

Apply for a NC COVID-19 Rapid Recovery Loan

NC COVID-19 Rapid Recovery Loan Program

Bridge loans are designed to enable a business to operate while pursuing other long-term solutions.

- zero interest and no payments for up to six months
- the maximum amount a borrower is eligible for is equal to the lesser of two months of revenue or \$50,000
- expedited underwriting and release of funds

If not repaid or refinanced, bridge loans will automatically convert to a term loan at the end of six months with a 48 month term and an interest rate of 5.5 percent.

NC COVID-19 Rapid Recovery Loan Program

The goal of this program is to support as many businesses as possible until they are able to secure long-term financing or restart operations and generate revenue.

North Carolina businesses suffering documented losses as a result of COVID-19 are eligible for this program.

Applicants must have at least one employee, who could be the self-employed business owner.










Distribution of Loan Applications
