NCCCS Response to COVID-19

NC CC

- Shifted to online instruction for most courses
- Continuing in-person public health and public safety training *in compliance with CDC guidelines* and agreement by faculty and students
- Increased flexibility for colleges
- Created <u>www.nccommunitycolleges.edu/covid-19-</u> response for students and faculty
- Key community partners in local response

Current Challenges

- Completing classes that were suspended and cannot be taught online
- Student emergency needs
 - Awaiting guidance about federal CARES Act timing and permissible uses

Current Challenges (cont.)

Maintaining students' success

- Student access to technology and internet, especially in rural areas
- Online student support, simulation, and proctoring

Uncertain tuition collections in 2019-20

Immediate Needs

Critical need prior to June 30: Receipt shortfall reserve up to \$25M (NR) dependent upon summer enrollment

Funds for transitioning to online learning – cost TBD

NC CC Upcoming Challenges

- Uncertainty surrounding resumption of inperson instruction
- Uncertainty about permitted uses of federal CARES Act funding for instructional costs
- Preparing NC's workforce to respond postpandemic
 - Gearing up to drive NC's recovery from the resulting unemployment crisis, while some training cannot be done online

Future/Short Session Needs

- Critical Need for FY 2020-21: Enrollment growth funding – \$41.5M (R)
 - Stability and capacity
 - Funding critical to meet additional demand for online and to re-start face-toface instruction
