- North Carolina Law Enforcement Accreditation Program
 - Affordable for all agencies
 - Provides uniformity and structure
 - To be managed by a program manager within the NC Criminal Justice Standards Division
 - Budgetary needs moving forward

Law Enforcement Agency Accreditation

- Draft Program Guide currently includes requirements to have policies on:
 - Use of Force
 - Early Warning Systems
 - Background Investigations in Hiring
 - Ethics
 - Internal Investigations
 - Field Training Programs
