The Auxiliary sites are linked to the Main site through videoconferencing.

May 3, 2001, Thursday at 7 p.m. – Durham

Main site:

North Carolina School of Science & Math (Durham), Lecture Hall

FROM I-40: Take the Durham Freeway (147). Take Swift Avenue (Exit 14) heading North. Swift Avenue becomes Broad Street at Main Street. Immediately after the intersection at Club Blvd, turn left into the parking lot. Signs will direct participants to enter the Bryan Lobby and direct them to the Lecture Hall.

Auxiliary Sites:

Vance-Granville Community College (Henderson), Building 6, Rm. 6105. Building 6 is located on backside of the campus.

From Raleigh via U.S. 1: Take U.S. 1 North to Henderson and exit at Highway 39. At the top of the ramp, turn left and take Highway 39 through town to the junction with I-85 (about two miles). Cross the bridge over I-85 and turn right onto the ramp, which circles around and merges into I-85 South. Go about five miles on I-85 South and take Exit 209. From the exit ramp, the VGCC campus will be visible to the right. Turn in first driveway to campus, and take road all the way around to back parking lot. Go up the road to the middle parking lot, which is the second parking lot on left. You'll see a daycare center, and Building 6 is adjacent to the daycare center.

Edgecombe Community College (Tarboro), Building A, Room 139.

From Raleigh, take US 64 to Tarboro. Just before reaching Tarboro, take exit 484. Turn right. Proceed about 1 mile to a T-intersection. Turn left. Proceed about 1 mile. ECC is on the right. The front center building is Building A (the McIntyre Building). The building is identified with an A. There are 5 parking lots, park in any and walk to main building.

May 4, 2001, Friday at 7 p.m. – Greensboro

Main Site:

UNC-Greensboro (Greensboro), Telelearning Center, McNutt Building.

On I-85 South in Greensboro, take Exit 128 to Lee Street (Highway 6), and drive about 4 miles. Turn right onto Tate Street, and go two blocks to Spring Garden Street. Turn left onto Spring Garden Street and you will be on campus. Turn left at the second traffic light onto Forest Street. McNutt Building will be on your left. Parking will be along left side where there are orange cones. Because this event will be after hours, please enter through the back door of the building.

Auxiliary Sites:

Winston-Salem State (Winston-Salem), Anderson Center Room G-22

Directions from Raleigh: I-40 West to Business 40 after the Sandy Ridge Road exit on the west side of Greensboro. Exit on Hwy 52 South inside Winston-Salem city limits. Exit Stadium Drive. Turn left onto Stadium Drive. At light, turn right onto MLK Jr Drive. Go through two lights. Turn right into parking lot. A small brown sign on the right says "Anderson Center." This turn is where Reynolds Park Boulevard intersects with MLK Jr Drive. The Center is located between MLK Dr. and Vargrave St. Signs should be posted indicating the correct room.

Guilford Tech (High Point), Rm. 156, H1 Building, High Point Campus

From Raleigh, take I-85 south. Exit on 311 North which is South Main Street in High Point. The address is 901 South Main St. As you travel north on 311, the campus is on your right. Make first right into campus into a large parking lot. Come in main entrance into the H1 building.

May 5, 2001, Saturday at 9:30 a.m. – Charlotte

Main Site:

Central Piedmont Comm. College (Charlotte), Central Campus on Elizabeth Avenue in the Hagemeyer Learning Resources Center in Rms. LR-035 and 033 on ground floor.

From Raleigh take I-85. Take right exit 38, immediate left to I-77S • Exit 10-B (Trade, 5th St.) • Stay on Trade through town. Trade becomes Elizabeth. The Hagemeyer Learning Center will be on your right as you enter campus, before you hit the parking deck.

Auxiliary Sites:

A.L. Brown High School (Kannapolis), Rm. ALB1

From Raleigh are as follows: Take I-85 and exit at Exit 63. Turn right onto Lane Street.

Go approximately 3 miles to the stoplight. Turn left onto Cannon Boulevard (US 29-601).

Go approximately 1 mile and exit to the right immediately before the overpass onto East First Street. At the second street on the right, turn right onto Denver Street. Immediately turn left into the small parking lot. The sidewalk leads directly to the Cyber Campus entrance. The portico is labeled Cyber Campus.

Catawba Valley Comm. College (Hickory), CVCC RM#1 - EW 326.

Coming from Raleigh: from I-40 take Exit #126, turn left at stoplight at top of exit ramp onto McDonald Parkway, at the second stoplight after left turn, turn left (from the second lane from the left) onto US Highway 70, get into far right lane, at next stoplight, turn right onto the CVCC Main Campus. There are two entrances and parking lots next to both. If come in first entrance (across from Wal-Mart), and park, can come in side door, and walk along corridor to auditorium. If you use the second entrance, parking lot is at bottom of hill, come in side entrance of building and walk along corridor to auditorium.

May 5, 2001, Saturday at 3:30 p.m. – Asheville

Main Site:

UNC-Asheville (Asheville), Robinson Hall, Room 129

Traveling west from Raleigh on I-40 take the I-240 exit (53B) which will bring you into Asheville.

Take exit 5A which is Merrimon Avenue. Turn right at the stop light and travel north (Hwy. 25 North) to the third stop light. At this light you will see a Boston Pizza on your right. Turn left onto Weaver Blvd. Proceed on Weaver until you see the UNC Asheville sign. Turn right onto the campus. At the top of the hill take the left fork and continue to Robinson Hall which is the first building on the right. There is ample parking beside and in front of Robinson Hall.

Auxiliary Sites:

Appalachian State University (Boone), Media Services in Belk Library.

From the east via Interstate 40 and Interstate 85: Proceed to Winston-Salem on I-40. Exit onto Highway 421 North in Winston-Salem and travel approximately 86 miles to Boone. In Boone follow signs to campus. 421 takes you into downtown and becomes King St.. Stay on King St. into downtown Boone, then take left onto College St. Before the next curve, parking lot is on your right next to Whitener Hall. Once you park, Belk Library is directly in front of you down the hill. Directional signs to hearing are inside the library.

Western Carolina University (Cullowhee), Teleconferencing Center, Suite 133, Rm.133-B. Take I-40 W., Take the US-19/GREAT SMOKEY MOUNTAINS EXPRESSWAY exit, exit number 27, towards CLYDE/WAYNESVILLE/MURPHY/ATLANTA/MAGGIE VALLEY. Keep RIGHT at the fork in the ramp. Merge onto US-19 S. Take US-23 S. Take the US-23-BR exit, exit number 85, towards NC-107/CULLOWHEE/W CAROLINA UNIV. Merge onto US-23 BR. Turn LEFT onto NC-107. Follow 107 to main Campus entrance. At main entrance go right to intersection of University way. Turn Right and cross bridge into parking lot of University Outreach Center. Entrance to Teleconferencing Center is at the upper end of the parking lot. Reception area is just inside main entrance.
