5 Section 1. Section 3 of Chapter 756 of the 1981 Session Laws, being  
6 Section 8.17 of the Charter of the City of Fayetteville, reads as rewritten:  
7 "Sec. 3. G.S. 160A-364 is amended by rewriting said paragraph to read as follows:  
8 (1) Before the City of Fayetteville may adopt or amend any ordinance pursuant to  
9 Part 3 of this Article, ~~the Cumberland County Joint Planning Board~~ a planning  
10 agency as defined by G.S. 160A-361 shall hold a public hearing on it. A notice of the  
11 public hearing shall be given once a week for two successive calendar weeks in a  
12 newspaper having general circulation in the area. The notice shall be published the  
13 first time not less than 10 days nor more than 25 days before the date fixed for the  
14 hearing. In computing such period, the day of publication is not to be included, but  
15 the day of the hearing shall be included.  
16 (2) Any person aggrieved by the recommendation of the ~~Cumberland County~~  
17 ~~Planning Board~~ planning agency shall have the right to appeal the action of the  
18 planning board in writing to the Clerk of the City of Fayetteville within 10 days of  
19 the action of the planning ~~board~~ agency. If an appeal is timely filed, then the city  
20 council shall hold a public hearing with prior notice being published in accordance  
21 with subparagraph (1).  
22 (3) If the planning ~~board's~~ agency's recommendation was to rezone the property,  
23 and no appeal is filed pursuant to subparagraph (2), then at its next regular council  
24 meeting following the expiration of the time provided for appeal in subparagraph (2)  
25 above, the city council shall have the right to adopt the rezoning without further

16 of Marine Fisheries and Wildlife Resources Commission.

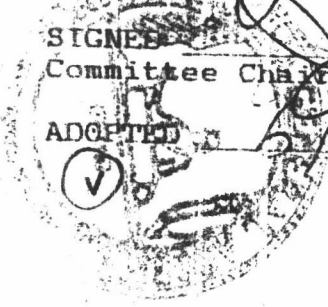

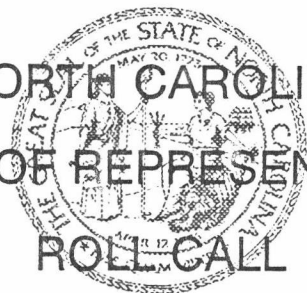

3 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

4 Section 1. A person who instigates, promotes, conducts, is employed at,  
5 provides a dog for, allows property under his ownership or control to be used for, or  
6 profits from an exhibition featuring the fighting or baiting of a dog is guilty of a Class  
7 I felony. A lease of property that is used or is intended to be used for an exhibition  
8 featuring the fighting or baiting of a dog is void, and a lessor who knows this use is  
9 made or is intended to be made of his property is under a duty to evict the lessee  
10 immediately.

11 Sec. 2. A person who owns, possesses, or trains a dog with the intent that  
12 the dog be used in an exhibition featuring the fighting or baiting of that dog is guilty  
13 of a Class I felony.

14 Sec. 3. A person who participates as a spectator at an exhibition  
15 featuring the fighting or baiting of a dog is guilty of a Class I felony.

16 Sec. 4. A person who commits an offense under Section 1 within three  
17 years after being convicted of an offense under this section is guilty of a Class I  
18 felony.

19 Sec. 5. This act applies only to Guilford County.

20 Sec. 6. This act becomes effective December 1, 1996, and applies to  
21 offenses committed on or after that date.

20 southwesterly direction with the boundaries of the Croatan National Forest to the  
21 East line of Whitehouse Forks Road; thence in a northeasterly direction with the East  
22 line of Whitehouse Forks Road to the South line of the Herbert and L.B. Page Tract  
23 containing approximately 76 acres and being identified as County tax parcel 15-27-01-  
24 9; thence with the common boundary line between the Page and Croatan National  
25 Forest Tracts in a northeasterly and northwesterly direction to Starkey's Creek Road;

6 Whereas, since early 1995, at least 30 predominantly Black churches have  
7 been burned in the South including three in North Carolina; and

8 Whereas, recently, bomb threats were left on the answering machine of  
9 the Durham County Chapter of the NAACP against three predominantly Black  
10 churches in Durham and bomb threats were left on the answering machine of a  
11 predominantly Black church in Charlotte; and

12 Whereas, these incidents have prompted various federal and state  
13 agencies and departments including the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the United  
14 States Justice Department, and the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms  
15 to investigate a possible connection between the incidents; and

16 Whereas, the Church Arson Prevention Act of 1996 has been introduced  
17 in Congress to clarify federal jurisdiction over offenses relating to damage to religious  
18 property, reflecting both bipartisan and biracial support; and

19 Whereas, there is a growing concern that these incidents may be acts of  
20 racially motivated domestic terrorism designed to intimidate African Americans and  
21 all Americans; and

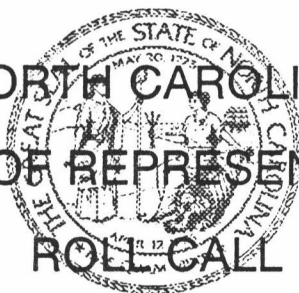
22 Whereas, the people of the State of North Carolina will not tolerate such

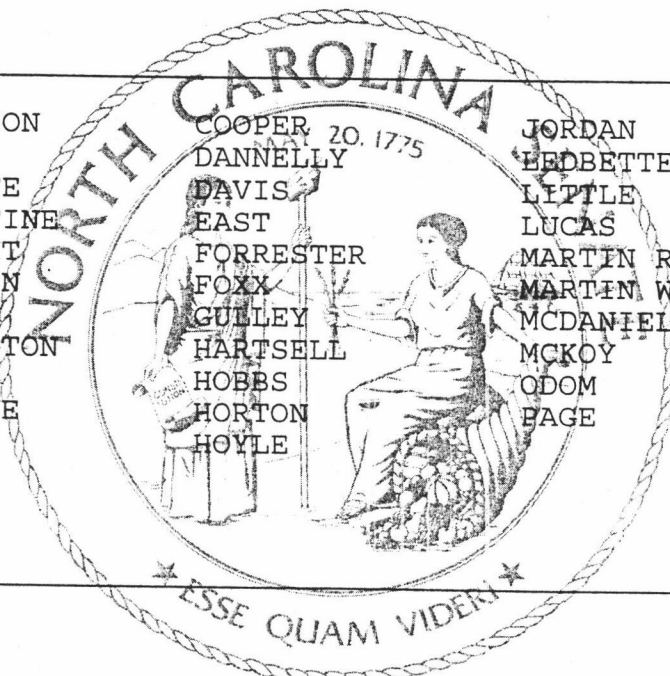
