Bostic, Jr., who was elected in 1994 for a four-year term, is designated as the member from District 5. Warren Dorsett, who was elected in 1994 for a four-year term, is designated as the member from District 7.

Section 1. G.S. 115D-4.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 115D-4.1. College transfer program approval: approval; standards for programs.

(a) Enrollment in the college transfer program of a community college that 9 offered this program before July 1, 1987, shall not exceed its current percent of 10 college transfer enrollment or fifteen percent (15%) of the institution's total budget 11 full-time equivalent students or 132 full-time equivalent students, whichever is 12 greater. The State Board of Community Colleges may, in its own discretion, make 13 exception to this requirement where the inherent market demand of a community 14 eauses an institution to exceed the fifteen percent (15%), or its current enrollment 15 percentage.

The State Board of Community Colleges may approve the addition of the 16 17 college transfer program to a community college. If addition of the college transfer 18 program to an institution would require a substantial increase in funds, State Board 19 approval shall be subject to appropriation of funds by the General Assembly for this 20 purpose.

(c) Addition of the college transfer program shall not decrease an institution's 22 ability to provide programs within its basic mission of vocational and technical 23 training and basic academic education. Enrollment in the college transfer program 24 shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of an institution's total budget full-time 25 equivalent students or 132 full-time equivalent students, whichever is greater, in each







The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G. S. 105-187.3(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Retail Value. -- The retail value of a motor vehicle for which a certificate of 7 8 title is issued because of a sale of the motor vehicle by a retailer is the sales price of 9 the motor vehicle, including all accessories attached to the vehicle when it is 10 delivered to the purchaser, less the amount of any allowance given by the retailer for 11 a motor vehicle taken in trade as a full or partial payment for the purchased motor 12 vehicle. The retail value of a motor vehicle for which a certificate of title is issued 13 because of a sale of the motor vehicle by a seller who is not a retailer is the market 14 value of the vehicle, less the amount of any allowance given by the seller for a motor 15 vehicle taken in trade as a full or partial payment for the purchased motor vehicle. 16 A transaction in which two parties exchange motor vehicles is considered a sale 17 regardless of whether either party gives additional consideration as part of the 18 transaction. The retail value of a motor vehicle for which a certificate of title is issued 19 because of a reason other than the sale of the motor vehicle is the market value of 20 the vehicle. The market value of a vehicle is presumed to be the value of the vehicle 21 set in a schedule of values adopted by the Commissioner."

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995, and applies to certificates 22

23 of title issued on or after that date.
