10 the Town of Blowing Rock, refer to the municipal board of elections if city elections
11 are conducted by a municipal board of elections. The State Board of Elections may
12 adopt rules to regulate this section."

9 "Section 1.1. **Incorporation.** The citizens of the area described in Chapter II shall

11 Grandfather' and shall have all the powers, authority, rights, privileges, and
12 immunities conferred upon municipal corporations by the Constitution and general
13 laws of North Carolina.
14 "Sec. 1.2. **Powers.** The Town shall have all the powers, duties, rights, privileges,
15 and immunities now vested in the Town and now or hereafter granted to municipal
16 corporations by the laws of the State of North Carolina and by this Charter. The
17 Town shall exercise and enjoy all other powers, functions, rights, privileges, and
18 immunities necessary or desirable to promote or protect the safety, health, peace,
19 security, good order, comfort, convenience, and general welfare of the Town and of
20 its citizens, unless otherwise prohibited in this Charter.
