Section 1. Section 2.1 of the Charter of the Town of Summerfield, being 6 Chapter 426, Session Laws of 1995, reads as rewritten:

18 intersection of the northern boundary of Lot 2.

19 Thence in a generally eastern direction along the northern boundary of Lot 2, and

20 Guilford county Tax Map ACL-10-654, Block 984, Lot 6 and Lot 4 until reaching a

21 point in the middle on the western edge of Belford Road.

22 Thence in a generally northern direction along the eenter line western edge of

23 Belford Road to a point due west of the intersection of the southern corner of





Short Title: Iredell-Mooresville School Boundaries. (Local) Sponsors: Representatives Mitchell and Brawley. Referred to: A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO RATIFY AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE IREDELL-STATESVILLE SCHOOLS **BOARD EDUCATION** OF AND THE MOORESVILLE GRADED SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF EDUCATION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. The Agreement entered into on April 30, 1996, between the 7 Iredell-Statesville Schools Board of Education and the Mooresville Graded School 8 District Board of Education, as approved by the State Board of Education on May 2, 9 1996, and the Board of Commissioners of the County of Iredell on May 7, 1996, is 10 ratified as if it had been an act of the General Assembly. 



(b) Eliqible Investment Amount. -- The eliqible investment amount is the lesser of (i) the cost of the machinery and equipment and (ii) the amount by which the cost of all of the taxpayer's machinery and equipment that is in service in this State on the last day of

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(d) Expiration. -- If, in one of the seven years in which the installment of a credit accrues, the machinery and equipment with respect to which the credit was claimed are sold or moved out of State, the credit expires and the taxpayer may not take any remaining installment of the credit. The taxpayer may, however, take the portion of an installment that accrued in a previous year and was carried forward to the extent permitted under G.S. 105-129.5.

If, in one of the seven years in which the installment of a credit accrues, the machinery and equipment with respect to which the credit was claimed are moved to an area in a higher-numbered distress tier, the remaining installments of the credit are allowed only to the extent they would have been allowed if the machinery and equipment had been placed in service initially in the area to which they were moved.

§ 105-129.9. Credit for research and development.

A taxpayer who claims for the taxable year a federal income tax credit under section 41 of the Code for increasing research activities is allowed a credit equal to five percent (5%) of the State's apportioned share of the taxpayer's expenditures for increasing research activities. The State's apportioned share of a taxpayer's expenditures for increasing research activities is the excess of the taxpayer's qualified research expenses for the taxable year over the base amount, as determined under section 41 of the Code, multiplied by a percentage equal to the ratio of the taxpayer's qualified research expenses in this State for the taxable year to the taxpayer's total qualified research expenses for the taxable year. As used in this section, the terms 'qualified research expenses' and 'base amount' have the meaning provided in section 41 of the Code. "





(c) Forfeiture. -- A taxpayer forfeits a credit allowed under this Article if the taxpayer was not eligible for the credit at the time the taxpayer applied for the credit. <u>(a) Tax Election. -- The credits provided in this Article are</u> allowed against the franchise tax levied in Article 3 of this Chapter and the income taxes levied in Article 4 of this Chapter. The taxpayer shall elect the tax against which a credit will be claimed when filing the application for the credit. This election is binding. Any carryforwards of the credit must be claimed against the same tax elected in the application.

(b) Cap. -- The credits allowed under this Article may not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the tax against which they are claimed for the taxable year, reduced by the sum of all other credits allowed against that tax, except tax payments made by or on behalf of the taxpayer. (a) Application. -- To claim the credits allowed by this Article, the taxpayer must provide with the tax return the certification of the Secretary of Commerce that the taxpayer meets all of the eligibility requirements of G.S. 105-129.4 with respect to each credit. A taxpayer shall apply to the Secretary of Commerce for certification of eligibility. The application must be on a form

To claim a credit allowed by this Article, the taxpayer must provide any information required by the Secretary of Revenue. Every taxpayer claiming a credit under this Article shall maintain and make available for inspection by the Secretary of Revenue any records the Secretary considers necessary to determine and verify the amount of the credit to which the taxpayer is entitled. If the new machinery and equipment are placed in service in a distress tier one area, the percentage rate is ten percent (10%). If the new machinery and equipment are placed in service in another area, the percentage rate is seven percent (7%). The credit may not be taken for the taxable year in which the equipment is placed in service but shall be taken in equal installments over the seven years following the taxable year in which the equipment is placed in service.

(b) Eligible Investment Amount. -- The eligible investment amount is the lesser of (i) the cost of the machinery and equipment and (ii) the amount by which the cost of all of the taxpayer's machinery and equipment that is in service in this State on the last day of

(c) Threshold. -- The applicable threshold is the appropriate amount set out in the following table based on the distress tier of the area where the new machinery and equipment are placed in service during the taxable year. If the taxpayer places new machinery and equipment in service in more than one area during the taxable year, the threshold applies separately to the new machinery and equipment placed in service in each area.

(d) Expiration. -- If, in one of the seven years in which the installment of a credit accrues, the machinery and equipment with respect to which the credit was claimed are sold or moved out of State, the credit expires and the taxpayer may not take any remaining installment of the credit. The taxpayer may, however, take the portion of an installment that accrued in a previous year and was carried forward to the extent permitted under G.S. 105-129.5.

If, in one of the seven years in which the installment of a credit accrues, the machinery and equipment with respect to which the credit was claimed are moved to an area in a higher-numbered distress tier, the remaining installments of the credit are allowed only to the extent they would have been allowed if the machinery and equipment had been placed in service initially in the area to which they were moved.

§ 105-129.9. Credit for research and development.

A taxpayer who claims for the taxable year a federal income tax credit under section 41 of the Code for increasing research activities is allowed a credit equal to five percent (5%) of the State's apportioned share of the taxpayer's expenditures for increasing research activities. The State's apportioned share of a taxpayer's expenditures for increasing research activities is the excess of the taxpayer's qualified research expenses for the taxable year over the base amount, as determined under section 41 of the Code, multiplied by a percentage equal to the ratio of the taxpayer's qualified research expenses in this State for the taxable year to the taxpayer's total qualified research expenses for the taxable year. As used in this section, the terms



Any member who has served 20 years as an 'eligible fireman' or 'eligible rescue squad worker' in the State of North Carolina, as provided in G.S. 58-86-25 and G.S. 9 58-86-30, and who has attained the age of 55 years is entitled to be paid a monthly 10 pension from this fund. The monthly pension shall be in the amount of one hundred 11 thirty-five dollars (\$135.00) forty dollars (\$140.00) per month. Any retired fireman 12 receiving a pension of one hundred ten dollars (\$110.00) thirty-five dollars (\$135.00) 13 per month shall, effective July 1, 1995, 1996, receive a pension of one hundred 14 thirty-five dollars (\$135.00) forty dollars (\$140.00) per month.

Members shall pay ten dollars (\$10.00) per month as required by G.S. 58-86-35 16 and G.S. 58-86-40 for a period of no longer than 20 years. No 'eligible rescue squad member' shall receive a pension prior to July 1, 1983. No member shall be entitled to 18 a pension hereunder until the member's official duties as a fireman or rescue squad 19 worker for which the member is paid compensation shall have been terminated and 20 the member shall have retired as such according to standards or rules fixed by the 21 board of trustees.

A member who is totally and permanently disabled while in the discharge of the 23 member's official duties as a result of bodily injuries sustained or as a result of extreme exercise or extreme activity experienced in the course and scope of those 25 official duties and who leaves the fire or rescue squad service because of this





A person who instigates, promotes, conducts, is employed at, 5 provides a dog for, allows property under his ownership or control to be used for, or 6 profits from an exhibition featuring the fighting or baiting of a dog is guilty of a Class 7 I felony. A lease of property that is used or is intended to be used for an exhibition 8 featuring the fighting or baiting of a dog is void, and a lessor who knows this use is 9 made or is intended to be made of his property is under a duty to evict the lessee 10 immediately.

11 Sec. 2. A person who owns, possesses, or trains a dog with the intent that 12 the dog be used in an exhibition featuring the fighting or baiting of that dog is guilty 13 of a Class I felony.

14 Sec. 3. A person who participates as a spectator at an exhibition 15 featuring the fighting or baiting of a dog is guilty of a Class I felony.

Sec. 4. A person who commits an offense under Section 1 within three 17 years after being convicted of an offense under this section is guilty of a Class H 18 felony.

19 Sec. 5. This act applies only to Brunswick, Cleveland, Duplin, Durham, 20 Gaston, Guilford, Jones, Lenoir, Onslow, Polk, Rutherford, Union, Wake, and Wayne 21 Counties.

22 This act becomes effective January 1, 1997, and applies to Sec. 6. 23 offenses committed on or after that date.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 153A-158.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 153A-158.1. Acquisition and improvement of school property in certain counties.

(a) Acquisition by County. -- A county may acquire, by any lawful method, any 9 interest in real or personal property for use by a school administrative unit within the 10 county. In exercising the power of eminent domain a county shall use the procedures 11 of Chapter 40A. The county shall use its authority under this subsection to acquire 12 property for use by a school administrative unit within the county only upon the 13 request of the board of education of that school administrative unit and after a public 14 hearing.

(b) Construction or Improvement by County. -- A county may construct, equip, 16 expand, improve, renovate, or otherwise make available property for use by a school 17 administrative unit within the county. The local board of education shall be involved 18 in the design, construction, equipping, expansion, improvement, or renovation of the property to the same extent as if the local board owned the property.

20 (c) Lease or Sale by Board of Education. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 21 115C-518 and G.S. 160A-274, a local board of education may, in connection with 22 additions, improvements, renovations, or repairs to all or part of any of its property, 23 lease or sell the property to the board of commissioners of the county in which the 24 property is located for any price negotiated between the two boards.

3:00 o'clock p.m.;

Friday until 2:00 o'clock p.m.

18 All bills shall be numbered by the Office of the Senate Principal Clerk when filed 19 and shall be considered introduced when presented to the Senate for the first reading. 20 Rule 40.1. Limitation on resolutions and bills.

The only resolutions that may be introduced or considered in the Senate are 22 resolutions adjourning the Extra Session sine die. All bills shall be excluded from 23 introduction or consideration in the Senate, other than any of the following:

(1) The Current Operations Appropriations Act of 1996, a bill making 25 general revisions in the State budget for fiscal year 1996-97.

At any time within 30-days-after payment, the applicable protest period, the taxpayer may demand a refund of the tax paid in writing from the Secretary of-Revenue and if the same-shall-not-be tax is not refunded within 90 days thereafter, may sue the Secretary of-Revenue in the courts of the State for the amount so demanded. The protest period for a tax levied in Article 2A, 2B, 2C, or 2D of this Chapter is 30 days after payment. The protest period for all other taxes is the period set by the statute of limitations in G.S. 105-266(c).

Such The suit may be brought in the Superior Court of Wake County, or in the county in which the taxpayer resides at any time within three years after the expiration of the 90-day period allowed for making the refund. If upon the trial it shall-be-determined-that such-a-tax-or-any-part-thereof is determined that all or part of the tax was levied or assessed for an illegal or unauthorized purpose, or was for any reason invalid or excessive, judgment shall be rendered therefor, with interest, and the-same the judgment shall be collected as in other cases. The amount of taxes for which judgment shall-be is rendered in such an action shall be refunded by the State; -provided, nothing-in-this-section-shall-be-construed-to conflict-with-or-supersede-the-provisions-of-G.S.-105-241.2. Section 1. (a) The Director of the Budget shall allocate from the Savings 6 Reserve Account, commonly referred to as the "Rainy Day Fund", the sum of up to 7 one hundred million dollars (\$100,000,000) for the 1996-97 fiscal year for disaster 8 relief activities in counties that have been officially declared disaster areas due to the 9 effects of the 1995-96 winter ice storm in the western part of the State, Hurricane 10 Bertha, and any other federally declared disasters that occur during the 1996-97 fiscal 11 year. Allocations shall be made by the Director as provided by the plan developed 12 by the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety in accordance with subsection 13 (b) of this section.

(b) The Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, Division of 15 Emergency Management, shall develop a plan for distribution of funds authorized 16 under this section. In developing the plan, the Department shall ensure that funds 17 are allocated in accordance with Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) 18 requirements such that the purposes for which allocations are made qualify for 19 federal disaster relief, that allocations meet federal assistance and matching 20 requirements, and that funds allocated in excess of matching requirements are 21 reimbursed to the State to the maximum extent allowable under federal law. 22 Notwithstanding G.S. 143-16.1, the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety 23 shall reimburse the State in the amount of federal funds received for the disaster 24 relief purposes stated in subsection (a) of this section.
