Whereas, most American families are working harder to make ends meet 9 and have nothing left for savings;

10 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate 11 concurring:

Section 2. The General Assembly believes that the current pay-as-you-go 17 social security system should be replaced with a funded system that is not vulnerable 18 to changing demographics and remains actuarially sound. It is in favor of a system 19 that allows workers to build savings for their retirement and earn interest on their 20 savings, and increase capital ownership for all Americans.

Section 3. The General Assembly further believes that a system should 22 provide savings incentives, thus increasing the nation's savings and investment rates 23 and the prosperity of the United States. It supports educating America's "grassroots" 24 about the challenges facing the current system and the options for reform.

"§ 153A-158.1. Acquisition and improvement of school property in certain counties.

(a) Acquisition by County. -- A county may acquire, by any lawful method, any 7 8 interest in real or personal property for use by a school administrative unit within the 9 county. In exercising the power of eminent domain a county shall use the procedures 10 of Chapter 40A. The county shall use its authority under this subsection to acquire 11 property for use by a school administrative unit within the county only upon the 12 request of the board of education of that school administrative unit and after a public 13 hearing.

(b) Construction or Improvement by County. -- A county may construct, equip, 15 expand, improve, renovate, or otherwise make available property for use by a school 16 administrative unit within the county. The local board of education shall be involved 17 in the design, construction, equipping, expansion, improvement, or renovation of the 18 property to the same extent as if the local board owned the property.

(c) Lease or Sale by Board of Education. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 19 20 115C-518 and G.S. 160A-274, a local board of education may, in connection with 21 additions, improvements, renovations, or repairs to all or part of any of its property, 22 lease or sell the property to the board of commissioners of the county in which the 23 property is located for any price negotiated between the two boards.



10 (a) Upon receipt of the budget requests and revenue estimates and the financial information supplied by the finance officer and department heads, the budget officer shall prepare a budget for consideration by the governing board in such form and detail as may have been prescribed by the budget officer or the governing board. The budget shall comply in all respects with the limitations imposed by G.S. 159-13(b), and unless the governing board shall have has authorized or requested submission of an unbalanced budget as provided in subsection (c) of this section, the budget shall be balanced.

18 (b) The budget, together with a budget message, shall be submitted to the governing board not later than June 1. The budget and budget message should, but need not, be submitted at a formal meeting of the board. The budget message should contain a concise explanation of the governmental goals fixed by the budget for the budget year, should explain important features of the activities anticipated in the budget, should set forth the reasons for stated changes from the previous year in program goals, programs, and appropriation levels, and should explain any major changes in fiscal policy.

(a) There is hereby created a Board of Transportation. The Board shall carry out 10 its duties consistent with the needs of the State as a whole and it shall not sacrifice 11 the general statewide interest to the purely local desires of any particular area. The 12 Board may, from time to time, provide that one or more of its members or 13 representatives shall hear any person or persons concerning transportation. 14

(b) The Board of Transportation shall have two ex officio members. The Secretary 15 of Transportation shall be an ex officio member of the Board of Transportation and 16 shall be the chairman of the Board of Transportation. The chairman of the North 17 Carolina Rail Council shall be an ex officio member of the Board of Transportation.

(e) The Board of Transportation shall have 20 members appointed by the 19 Governor. One member shall be appointed from each of the 14 transportation 20 engineering divisions and six members shall be appointed from the State at large. 21 One at-large member shall be a registered voter of a political party other than the 22 political party of the Governor. At least one at-large member shall possess a broad 23 knowledge of public transportation matters. No more than two members provided for 24 in this subsection shall reside in the same engineering division while serving in office.

If the State Board of Community Colleges determines that a community 8 college has not met the matching requirements of G.S. 115D-31(a)(1) by July 1, 1998, 9 1999, with respect to a capital improvement project for which bond proceeds are 10 allocated in subdivision I or pursuant to subdivision II of this subsection, the Board 11 shall certify that fact to the State Treasurer by October 1, 1998. 1999. All of these 12 bond proceeds with respect to which the Board certifies that the matching 13 requirement has not been met by July 1, 1998, <u>1999</u>, shall be placed by the State 14 Treasurer in a special account within the Community Colleges Bond Fund and shall 15 be used for making grants to community colleges. Bond proceeds in the special 16 account shall be allocated among the community colleges in accordance with the 17 following conditions:

> (1)The State Board of Community Colleges shall generate, by October 1, 1998, 1999, a priority ranking of legitimate community college capital improvement needs using a formula based on objective meaningful factors relevant to capital needs, including space to population ratio, population served ratio, capacity enrollment ratio, local to State and vocational education ratios, type of project, and readiness to implement.

If a person offers an entertainment or amusement that includes both a motion picture taxable under this section and an entertainment or amusement taxable under G.S. 105-37.1 or G.S. 105-38, the tax in G.S. 105-37.1 or G.S. 105-38, as appropriate, applies to the entire gross receipts and the tax levied in this section does not apply.

(b) Exemption. -- Gross receipts from a motion picture show promoted and managed by a qualifying corporation that operates a center for the performing and visual arts is exempt from the tax imposed under this section if the motion picture is shown at the center and if the showing of motion pictures is not the primary purpose of the center. As used in this subsection, 'qualifying corporation' and 'center for the performing and visual arts' have the same meaning as in G.S. 105-37.1(a)."

Section 2. This act becomes effective October 1, 1998.

Quarterly reporting periods end on the last day of March, June, September, and December; monthly reporting periods end on the last day of the month; and semimonthly reporting periods end on the 15th of each month and the last day of each month.

The Secretary shall monitor the amount of tax remitted by a taxpayer and shall direct a taxpayer who consistently remits at least twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) each month to file a return on a semimonthly basis. In determining the amount of tax due from a taxpayer for a reporting period the Secretary shall consider the total




