The Board may establish a program for the purpose of aiding in the recovery and rehabilitation of pharmacists who have become addicted to controlled substances or alcohol, and the Board may use money collected as fees to fund such a program.

(b) Membership. -- The Board shall consist of six members, one of whom shall be a representative of the public, and the remainder of whom shall be pharmacists.

(c) Qualifications. -- The public member of the Board shall not be a health care provider or the spouse of a health care provider. The public member of the Board shall be a resident of this State at the time of his appointment and while serving as a Board member. The pharmacist members of the Board shall be residents of this State at the time of their appointment and while serving as Board members.







- 18 (a1) If a claim is based on an oyster or other shellfish grantor a perpetual franchise for shellfish cultivation, the Secretary may, to resolve the claim, grant a shellfish lease to the claimant for part or all of the area claimed. If a claim of exclusive shellfishing rights was registered based upon a conveyance by the Literary Fund, the North Carolina Literary Board or the State Board of Education, and the claimant shows that the area had been cultivated by the claimant or his predecessor in title for the seven-year period prior to registration of the claim, the Secretary may, to resolve the claim, grant a shellfish lease to the claimant for all or part of the area

Section 2. Long Beach occupancy tax. (a) Authorization and scope. 11 The Long Beach Town Council may levy a room occupancy tax of up to three 12 percent (3%) of the gross receipts derived from the rental of any room, lodging, or 13 accommodation furnished by a hotel, motel, inn, tourist camp, or similar place within 14 the town that is subject to sales tax imposed by the State under G.S. 105-164.4(a)(3) 15 and from the rental of private residences and cottages, whether or not the residence 16 or cottage is rented for less than 15 days. This tax is in addition to any State or local 17 sales tax.

(b) Authorization of additional tax. In addition to the tax authorized by 19 subsection (a) of this section, the Long Beach Town Council may levy an additional 20 room occupancy tax of up to two percent (2%) of the gross receipts derived from the 21 rental of accommodations taxable under subsection (a). The levy, collection, 22 administration, and repeal of the tax authorized by this subsection shall be in 23 accordance with the provisions of this section. The governing body of a town may 24 not levy a tax under this subsection unless it also levies the tax authorized under 25 subsection (a) of this section.

Notwithstanding any provision of the North Carolina State Building Code or any general or local law to the contrary, including Chapter 143 of the General Statutes, a city may require, by ordinance, the installation of sprinkler systems in the following types of buildings that are constructed within the city or the city's extraterritorial planning jurisdiction after the effective date of any ordinance adopted by the city: (i) buildings in excess of 50 feet in height, (ii) nonresidential buildings regardless of height, and (iii) residential buildings that have three or more dwelling units regardless of height. The installation of sprinkler systems shall be completed within a reasonable period of time, which shall be provided in any ordinances adopted by the city.

Section 2. This act applies to the Town of Wrightsville Beach only.
