5 Section 1. The Charter of the Town of Rowland is revised and
6 consolidated to read as follows:
7 "THE CHARTER OF THE TOWN OF ROWLAND.
8 "ARTICLE 1. INCORPORATION, CORPORATE POWERS, AND
9 BOUNDARIES.
10 "Section 1.1 **Incorporation.** The Town of Rowland, North Carolina, in Robeson
11 County, and the inhabitants thereof, shall continue to be a municipal body politic and
12 corporate, under the name of the 'Town of Rowland', hereinafter at times referred to
13 as the 'Town'.
14 "Section 1.2. **Powers.** The Town shall have and may exercise all of the powers,
15 duties, rights, privileges, and immunities conferred upon the Town of Rowland
16 specifically by this Charter or upon municipal corporations by general law. The term
17 'general law' is employed herein as defined in G.S. 160A-1.
18 "Section 1.3. **Corporate Boundaries.** The corporate boundaries shall be those
19 existing at the time of ratification of this Charter, as set forth on the official map of
20 the Town and as they may be altered from time to time in accordance with law. An
21 official map of the Town, showing the current municipal boundaries, shall be
22 maintained in the office of the Town Clerk and shall be available for public
23 inspection. Upon alteration of the corporate limits pursuant to law, the appropriate
24 changes to the official map shall be made, and copies shall be filed in the office of

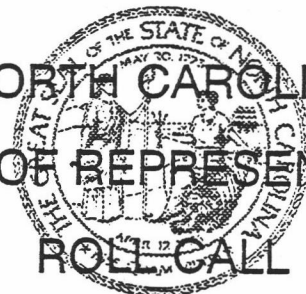

5 Section 1. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the
6 Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Social Services, the sum of
7 four million four hundred thousand nine hundred dollars (\$4,400,900) for the 1998-99
8 fiscal year to be allocated to the Child Caring Institution Grant-In-Aid Fund. These
9 funds shall be used as provided in subsections (b) and (c) of this act to increase the
10 private-child caring agency reimbursement rate for the State-funded portion of the
11 services to children who are not eligible for federal IV-E subsidies, and to add new
12 agencies to the list of agencies eligible to receive reimbursement from the Child
13 Caring Institution Grant-in-Aid Private Child Caring Institution Fund. Counties shall
14 not reduce their contributions as a result of additional appropriations of funds under
15 this act. County contributions to the cost of care shall continue to be negotiated
16 between the counties and the agencies. County contributions shall not be used to
17 reduce or offset State reimbursement for the cost of care in private child-caring

For purposes of this subsection, an unmarked vehicle is one without: (i) permanently attached signage or lettering identifying the vehicle as a law enforcement vehicle, (ii) a permanent governmental registration plate, and (iii) a roof mounted visor bar with blue lights."

Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1998-99 fiscal year to publicize the contents of Section 1 of this bill.

Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and Section 2 of this bill becomes effective July 1, 1998.
