Section 2. It is unlawful to discharge a firearm from, onto, across, or 10 11 down the right-of-way of any public road, street, highway, or thoroughfare. 12

Section 3. Section 1 of Chapter 791 of the 1983 Session Laws reads as 13 rewritten:

"Section 1. It is unlawful to use a center-fire rifle in hunting on the land of 15 another or from any road or right-of-way adjoining the land of another without the 16 written permission of the owner or lessee of that land. The written permission shall 17 be dated, it shall be effective for only 12 months after it is granted, it shall not be 18 transferable, and it shall be carried on the person of anyone using a center-fire rifle to 19 hunt."

20 Section 4. Violation of Section 1 or 2 of this act is a Class 3 21 misdemeanor.

Section 5. This act is enforceable by law enforcement officers of the 23 Wildlife Resources Commission, by sheriffs and deputy sheriffs, by officers of the 24 Highway Patrol, and by other peace officers with general subject matter jurisdiction.

Section 6. This act applies only to Harnett County.

"§ 147-64.10. Powers of appointment.

The Auditor may, subject to the provisions of the State Personnel Act, appoint all 8 employees necessary to perform the duties and functions assigned to him by the 9 provisions of this Article. Certain performance audit functions require personnel 10 who have unique blends of skills and experiences that do not fall within the 11 traditional classifications for auditors; therefore, the Auditor is authorized to waive 12 the accounting requirements established by State Personnel for appointments to 13 auditor and management positions when the State Auditor deems it appropriate.

Except where otherwise provided in this Article, all powers and duties vested in 15 the Auditor may be delegated by him to deputies, assistants, employees, or other 16 auditors, consultants, professionals, and experts, whose services are obtained in accordance with the provisions of this act; but the Auditor shall retain responsibility 18 for the powers and duties so delegated."

Section 2. Article 5A of Chapter 147 is amended by adding a new 19 20 section to read as follows:

21 "§ 147-64.7.1. Obstruction of audit.

Any person who shall willfully make or cause to be made to the State Auditor or 23 his designated representatives any false, misleading, or unfounded report for the 24 purpose of interfering with the performance of any audit, special review, or 25 investigation, or to hinder or obstruct the State Auditor or the State Auditor's

(b) Local boards of education shall review their school attendance districts or 17 zones and shall establish a process for modifying them to promote community-based 18 schools. Local boards of education shall also review the relative merits of schools 19 within their units and shall consider reallocating resources, if appropriate, to enhance 20 parental satisfaction with schools within each community. Local boards of education 21 shall report to the State Board of Education on an annual basis on the

A city council may enter into and carry out contracts with another city, county, or combination thereof under which the parties agree to create and support a joint inspection department for the enforcement of State and local laws specified in the agreement. The governing boards of the contracting parties are authorized to make any necessary appropriations for this purpose.

In lieu of a joint inspection department, a city council may designate an inspector from any other city or county to serve as a member of its inspection department with the approval of the governing body of the other city or county, or may contract with an individual who is not a city or county employee but who holds one of the applicable certificates as provided in G.S. 160A-411.1 or G.S. 153A-351.1. G.S. 153A-351.1, or may contract with the employer of an individual who holds one of the applicable certificates for the services of that individual. The inspector, if designated from another city or county under this section, shall, while exercising the duties of the position, be considered a municipal employee. The city shall have the same potential liability, if any, for inspections conducted by an individual who is not an employee of the city as it does for an individual who is an employee of the city. The individual with whom the city contracts shall have errors and omissions and other insurance coverage acceptable to the city.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 130A-50(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) The sanitary district board shall be composed of either three or five members 8 as the county commissioners in their discretion shall determine. The members first 9 appointed shall serve as the governing body of the sanitary district until the next 10 regular election for municipal and special district officers as provided in G.S. 163-11 279, which occurs more than 90 days after their appointment. At that election, their 12 successors shall be elected. The terms of the members shall be for two years or four 13 years and may be staggered as determined by the county board of commissioners so 14 that some members are elected at each biennial election. The members of the sanitary 15 district board shall be residents of the district. The county board of commissioners 16 shall notify the county board of elections of any decision made under this subsection.

If the sanitary district board consists of three members, the county commissioners 18 may at any time increase the sanitary district board to five members. The increase 19 shall become effective with respect to any election where the filing period for 20 candidacy opens at least 30 days after approval of the expansion to five members. 21 The effective date of the expansion is the organizational meeting of the sanitary 22 district board after the election.

The county commissioners may provide for staggering terms of an existing sanitary 24 district board whose members serve two-year terms by providing for some of the 25 members to be elected at the next election to be for four-year terms. The change shall


