"(a) Every person, firm, or corporation person engaged in the business of giving, offering or managing any form of entertainment or amusement not otherwise taxed or 8 specifically exempted in this Article, for which an admission is charged, shall pay an 9 annual license tax of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each room, hall, tent or other place 10 where such the admission charges are made.

In addition to the license tax levied above, such person, firm, or corporation the 12 taxpayer shall pay an additional tax upon the gross receipts of such the business at 13 the rate of three percent (3%). Reports shall be made to the Secretary of Revenue, 14 in such form as he may prescribe, within the first 10 days of each month covering all 15 such taxable gross receipts for the previous month, and the additional tax herein 16 levied gross receipts tax shall be paid monthly at the time such the reports are made. 17 The annual license tax herein levied shall be treated as an advance payment of the 18 tax upon gross receipts herein levied, and the annual license tax gross receipts tax 19 and shall be applied as a credit upon or advance payment of the gross receipts tax.

Every person, firm, or corporation person giving, offering, or managing any dance 21 or athletic contest of any kind, except high school and elementary school athletic 22 contests, for which an admission fee in excess of fifty cents (50¢) is charged, shall pay 23 an annual license tax of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for each location where such the 24 charges are made, and, in addition, a tax upon the gross receipts derived from 25 admission charges at the rate of three percent (3%). 

4 5 "(b1) At the time of the application for a new mining permit or a permit modification that adds owners of record lands adjoining the permit boundaries, the operator shall request each local government having jurisdiction over any part of the land on which the proposed mining operation is to be located to issue a determination as to whether the local government has in effect a zoning or 10 subdivision ordinance applicable to the operation and whether the proposed mining 11 operation would be consistent with the ordinance. The request to the local 12 government shall be accompanied by a copy of the permit application and shall be 13 delivered to the clerk of the local government personally or by certified mail. The 14 determination shall be verified or supported by affidavit signed by the official 15 designated by the local government to make the determination and, if the local 16 government states that the proposed mining operation is inconsistent with a zoning or 17 subdivision ordinance, shall include a copy of the ordinance and the specific reasons 18 for the determination of inconsistency. A copy of any such determination shall be 19 provided to the applicant when it is submitted to the Department. The Department 20 shall not act upon an application for a permit under this section until it has received 21 a determination from each local government requested to make a determination by 22 the applicant. Unless the local government makes a subsequent determination of 23 consistency with all ordinances cited in the determination or the proposed mining 24 operation is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be consistent with the 25 cited ordinances, the Department shall attach as a condition of the permit a

The State Board shall also consider ways to focus 12 resources to address the needs of those students.

The State Board of Education shall report the results of this study to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee prior to November 15, 1998.





The Indians now residing in Halifax, Warren and adjoining counties of North 10 Carolina, originally found by the first permanent white settlers on the Roanoke River 11 in Halifax and Warren Counties, and claiming descent from certain tribes of Indians 12 originally inhabiting the coastal regions of North Carolina, shall, from and after April 13 15, 1965, be designated and officially recognized as the Haliwa Saponi Tribe of North 14 Carolina, and they shall continue to enjoy all their rights, privileges and immunities 15 as citizens of the State as now or hereafter provided by law, and shall continue to be 16 subject to all the obligations and duties of citizens under the law."

Section 2. G.S. 143B-407(a) reads as rewritten:



There shall be two degrees in the crime of burglary as defined at the common law. 8 If the crime be committed in a dwelling house, or in a room used as a sleeping 9 apartment in any building, and any person is in the actual occupation of any part of 10 said dwelling house or sleeping apartment at the time of the commission of such 11 erime, it shall be burglary in the first degree. If such crime be committed in a 12 dwelling house or sleeping apartment not actually occupied by anyone at the time of 13 the commission of the crime, or if it be committed in any house within the curtilage 14 of a dwelling house or in any building not a dwelling house, but in which is a room 15 used as a sleeping apartment and not actually occupied as such at the time of the 16 commission of the crime, it shall be burglary in the second degree. For the purposes 17 of defining the crime of burglary, larceny shall be deemed a felony without regard to 18 the value of the property in question.

(a) First degree burglary. -- It is first degree burglary if a person does the 20 following: with the intent of committing a larceny or felony breaks or enters without consent a dwelling house or a room used as a sleeping apartment in any building with the intent of committing a felony, and any person is in the actual occupation of any part of the dwelling house or sleeping apartment at the time of the entry.

(b) Second degree burglary. -- It is second degree burglary if a person does the following: with the intent of committing a larceny or felony breaks or enters without

Whereas, after he was awarded a master of arts degree from the 17 university at the age of 64, he continued his studies, concentrating on his fascination 18 with the War Between the States and especially the role of North Carolina in that 19 conflict. His doctoral dissertation, a biography of Colonel Henry K. Burgwin, Jr., was 20 published by the University of North Carolina Press in 1985 under the title Boy 21 Colonel of the Confederacy; and

Whereas, during his career he was so esteemed that he was elected not 22 23 only as President of the 18,000 member American Bankers Association but also 24 President of the 5,000,000 member United States Chamber of Commerce, the only 25 man ever to be head of both organizations; and







Local school administrative units may use these assessment instruments provided to them by the State Board for first and second grade students, and shall not use standardized tests. students. Local school administrative units also may use valid, age-appropriate standardized tests or assessments in kindergarten and first and second grades so long as they are used for individual student diagnostic or program evaluation purposes. If a test or an assessment is used for individual diagnostic purposes or if the results are placed in a student's record, the school shall provide the results to that student's parent or legal guardian. Local school administrative units are encouraged to notify parents and guardians of students in kindergarten and first and second grades before administering tests or assessments to those students."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.



The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

"(d) The Commission shall be authorized, consistent with the public interest and 9 notwithstanding any other provision of law, to adopt procedures for the purpose of 10 allowing shared use and/or resale of any telephone service provided to persons who 11 occupy the same contiguous premises (as such term shall be defined by the 12 Commission); provided, however, that there shall be no 'networking' of any services 13 authorized under this subsection whereby two or more premises where such services 14 are provided are connected, and provided further that the certificated local exchange 15 telephone company shall be the only provider of any certificated local provider or 16 any other provider authorized by the Commission may provide access lines or trunks 17 connecting such authorized service to the telephone network, and that the local 18 service rates approved by the Commission for local exchange lines or trunks being 19 shared or resold shall be fully compensatory and on a measured usage basis where 20 facilities are available or on a message rate basis otherwise.
