It is further declared to be in the public interest and highly advantageous to the economic development of the State that tobacco producers be permitted by referendum to levy upon themselves an assessment not to exceed ten cents (10¢) per hundred pounds of tobacco marketed to provide funds through the North Carolina Tobacco Research Commission for research and dissemination of research facts concerning tobacco."

Section 2. G.S. 106-568.8(a) reads as rewritten:

"(a) Fertilizer and feed assessments. In the event two-thirds or more of the eligible farmers and producers participating in said referendum vote in favor of such assessment, then said assessment shall be collected for a period of six years under





Whenever a person has a valid defense to the enforcement of the collection 10 of a tax, the person shall pay the tax to the proper officer, and that payment shall be 11 without prejudice to any defense of rights the person may have regarding the tax. At 12 any time within the applicable protest period, the taxpayer may demand a refund of 13 the tax paid in writing from the Secretary and if the tax is not refunded within 90 14 days thereafter, may sue the Secretary in the courts of the State for the amount 15 demanded. The protest period for a tax levied in Article 2A, 2C, or 2D of this 16 Chapter is 30 days after payment. The protest period for all other taxes is one year 17 after payment: the period set in G.S. 105-266(c).

The suit may be brought in the Superior Court of Wake County, or in the superior 19 court of the county in which the taxpayer resides at any time within three years after 20 the expiration of the 90-day period allowed for making the refund. Vocational and technical education teachers who are employed for 11 or 13 12 months may, with prior approval of the principal, work on annual vacation leave 14 days designated in the school calendar and may use those annual vacation leave days 15 during the eleventh or twelfth month of employment.

On a day that pupils are not required to attend school due to inclement weather, 17 but employees are required to report for a workday, a teacher may elect not to report 18 due to hazardous travel conditions and to take an annual vacation day or to make up 19 the day at a time agreed upon by the teacher and the teacher's immediate supervisor 20 or principal. On a day that school is closed to employees and pupils due to inclement 21 weather, a teacher shall work on the scheduled makeup day.

All vacation leave taken by the teacher will be upon the authorization of the 22 23 teacher's immediate supervisor and under policies established by the local board of 24 education. Annual vacation leave shall not be used to extend the term of 25 employment.







Every register of deeds shall, upon proper application, issue a license for the 8 marriage of any two persons if it appears that such these persons are authorized to 9 may be married in accordance with the laws of this State. In making a determination 10 as to whether or not the parties are authorized to may be married under the laws of 11 this State, the register of deeds may require the applicants for the license to marry to 12 present certified copies of birth certificates or birth registration cards provided for in 13 G.S. 130-73, or such or any other evidence as the register of deeds deems necessary 14 to such this determination. The register of deeds may administer an oath to any 15 person presenting evidence relating to whether or not parties applying for a marriage 16 license are eligible to be married pursuant to the laws of this State. Each applicant 17 for a marriage license shall provide on the application the applicant's social security 18 number. If the applicant does not have a social security number and is ineligible to 19 obtain one, the applicant shall present a statement to that effect, sworn to or affirmed 20 before a notary public. Upon presentation of such a statement, the register of deeds 21 shall issue the license, provided all other requirements are met, and shall retain the 22 statement with the register's copy of the license. The register of deeds shall not issue 23 a marriage license unless all of the requirements of this section have been met." 24

"(e) The State Board of Elections shall determine, in the manner provided by law, the form and content of ballots, instruction sheets, pollbooks, talley sheets, abstract and return forms, certificates of election, and other forms to be used in primaries and elections. The Board shall furnish to the county and municipal boards of elections the registration application forms required pursuant to G.S. 163-67. 163-82.3. The State Board of Elections shall direct the county boards of elections to purchase a sufficient quantity of all forms attendant to the registration and elections process. In addition, the State Board shall provide a source of supply from which the county boards of elections may purchase the quantity of pollbooks needed for the execution of its responsibilities. In the preparation of ballots, pollbooks, abstract and return forms, and all other forms, the State Board of Elections may call to its aid the Attorney General of the State, and it shall be the duty of the Attorney General to advise and aid in the preparation of these books, ballots and forms."

Section 2. Article 4 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes is amended 20 by adding a new section to read:

21 "§ 163-37. Duty of county board of commissioners.

The respective boards of county commissioners shall appropriate reasonable and adequate funds necessary for the legal functions of the county board of elections, including reasonable and just compensation of the director of elections."

In conducting this study the Legislative Research 22 Commission should consider the studies undertaken prior to the enactments of the 23 North Carolina Condominium Act and the North Carolina Planned Community Act 24 and the procedures developed in other states for the prevention, regulation, and 25 remedying of abuses by townhome associations and townhome managers.



Provisions that require the payment of damages upon termination of the principal agreement may include damages related to competition."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to covenants or agreements executed or renewed on and after that date.



If the safety and supervision of children does not allow a daily duty free period during regular student contact hours for a given teacher, the funds provided by the General Assembly for the duty free period for that teacher shall revert to the general fund."

Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999, and applies to all school years beginning with the 1999-2000 school year.

(a) The Board may, whenever in its opinion the conditions of the locality where 11 12 the applicant resides are such as to render it advisable, make any modifications of the 13 requirements of G.S. 90-9, 90-10, and 90-11 as in its judgment the interests of the 14 people living in that locality may demand, and may issue to the applicant a special 15 license, to be entitled a "Limited License," authorizing the holder of the limited 16 license to practice medicine and surgery within the limits only of the districts 17 specifically described therein. A resident's training license shall expire at the time its 18 holder ceases to be a resident in the training program or obtains any other license to 19 practice medicine issued by the Board. The holder of the limited license practicing 20 medicine or surgery beyond the boundaries of the districts as laid down in said 21 license shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall only be 22 fined not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) for 23 each and every offense; and the Board may revoke the limited license, in its 24 discretion, after due notice. 25
