Section 1. G.S. 44A-27 reads as rewritten:

"§ 44A-27. Actions on payment bonds; service of notice.

(a) Subject to the provision of subsection (b) hereof, any claimant who has performed labor or furnished materials in the prosecution of the work required by any contract for which a payment bond has been given pursuant to the provisions of this Article, and who has not been paid in full therefor before the expiration of 90 days after the day on which the claimant performed the last such labor or furnished the last such materials for which he claims payment, may bring an action on such payment bond in his own name, to recover any amount due him for such labor or materials and may prosecute such action to final judgment and have execution on the judgment.

(b) Any claimant who has a direct contractual relationship relationship, valued at more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000), with any subcontractor but has no contractual relationship, express or implied, with the contractor, may bring an action on the payment bond only if he has given written notice to the contractor within 180 days from the date on which the claimant performed the last of the labor or furnished the last of the materials for which he claims payment, stating with substantial accuracy the amount claimed and the name of the person for whom the work was performed or to whom the material was furnished. if:

(1) The contractor, within 30 days of the date established in the notice to proceed issued by the owner, has filed with the Office of State
