With regard to marking the no-wake speed zone established in Section 1 of this act, the Town of Holden Beach, Brunswick County, or their designees may place and maintain the markers in accordance with the Uniform Waterway Marking System and any supplementary standards for such system adopted by the Wildlife Resources Commission. All markers of the no-wake speed zone shall be buoys or floating signs placed in the water and must be sufficient in number and size as to give adequate warning of the no-wake speed zone to the vessels approaching from various directions.

Section 3. This act is enforceable under G.S. 75A-17 as if it were a provision of Chapter 75A of the General Statutes.

Section 4. Violation of Section 1 of this act is a Class 3 misdemeanor.

Section 5. This act applies only to the Town of Holden Beach.



This tax is in addition to any State 14 or local sales tax. This tax does not apply to accommodations furnished by nonprofit 15 charitable, educational, or religious organizations when furnished in furtherance of 16 their nonprofit purpose.

(a1) Additional occupancy tax. In addition to the tax authorized by subsection (a) 17 18 of this section, the Currituck County Board of Commissioners may levy a room 19 occupancy tax of one percent (1%) of the gross receipts derived from the rental of 20 accommodations taxable under subsection (a). The levy, collection, administration, 21 and repeal of the tax authorized by this subsection shall be in accordance with the 22 provisions of this act. Currituck County may not levy a tax under this subsection 23 unless it also levies the tax under subsection (a).

The levy, collection, administration, and repeal of the tax 23 authorized by this subsection shall be in accordance with the provisions of this



# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN **ACT EXEMPTING** CERTAIN STATE **PROPERTY FROM FIRE** PROTECTION FEES IMPOSED BY UNION COUNTY. 3

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S 153A-236(c), as it applies to Union County pursuant to 6 Chapter 883 of the 1991 Session Laws, as amended by Chapter 61 of the 1995 Session 7 Laws, reads as rewritten:

"(c) Fees. -- The fees imposed by the county may not exceed the cost of providing 9 fire protection services within the district and may be imposed on owners of all real 10 property that benefits from the availability of fire protection and on owners of all 11 manufactured or mobile homes that benefit from the availability of fire protection. 12 protection; provided, however, that the fees shall not be imposed on the North 13 Carolina Department of Transportation for real property owned by the Department 14 and used solely for highway purposes. For the purpose of this section, the term 'fire 15 protection' includes furnishing emergency medical, rescue, and ambulance services to 16 protect persons in the district from injury or death. The county shall establish a 17 schedule of fees for different classes of property and the fee for each class of property 18 shall be proportional to the estimated cost of providing fire protection services to that 19 class of property. The schedule of fees shall include the following classes of property 20 and the fee on each class of property shall not exceed the following maximums:

A single-family dwelling or manufactured or mobile home, and appurtenant structures, plus up to five acres of surrounding land. The fee on this class of property may not exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) per site per year.



4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Purpose. It is the purpose of this act to place an equitable 5 6 share of the cost of providing adequate infrastructure upon all new inhabitants and 7 upon those associated with the development process by providing the Town of 8 Morrisville with the right, power, and authority to impose and collect fees to finance 9 transportation improvements within the Town's corporate limits and extraterritorial 10 jurisdiction.

Section 2. Authority to Impose Transportation Impact Fees. The Town 12 of Morrisville shall have the right, power, and authority to impose and collect a 13 transportation impact fee on all new construction within the Town's corporate limits 14 and extraterritorial jurisdictions. "New construction" means any new development, 15 construction, or installation that requires a building permit or action permitting real 16 property improvements for occupancy, excluding the renovation and repair of 17 existing structures and accessory uses and their structures.

Section 3. Basis of Transportation Impact Fee.

Section 3.(a) Before adopting or amending a transportation impact fee, 20 the Board of Commissioners shall hold a public hearing regarding the proposed adoption or amendment of the fee, and notice of the public hearing shall be given so 22 as to conform with G.S. 160A-364.

Section 3.(b) The amount of the transportation impact fee imposed and 24 collected shall be based upon reasonable and uniform consideration of capital costs to 25 be incurred by the Town as a result of new construction.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. The County of Durham, or any governing body, agency, 6 person, or other corporation that contracts with Durham County for the investment, 7 care, or administration of monies held by the County in its Community Health Trust 8 Fund may invest and reinvest monies constituting the Fund in one or more of the 9 types of securities or other investments authorized by State law for the State 10 Treasurer in G.S. 147-69.2.

Section 2. This act shall apply only to monies constituting the 12 Community Health Trust Fund. Limitations on investment and reinvestment of Fund

13 assets may be enacted by the Durham County Board of Commissioners.

Section 3. This act, insofar as it authorizes certain investments, amends 15 G.S. 159-30 with regard to the investment of the Durham County Community Health

16 Trust Fund only.

17 Section 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
