10 Whereas, the 1977, 1981, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986, and 1987 Sessions of the
11 North Carolina General Assembly recognized the value of a statewide revolving fund
12 for saving many important historic buildings in North Carolina by appropriating
13 funds to Preservation North Carolina for grants-in-aid; and

14 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina has succeeded in saving more than
15 400 endangered historic properties in more than 60 counties throughout the State;

16 Whereas, Preservation North Carolina is currently working to save more
17 than 60 endangered historic properties throughout North Carolina, including several
18 large historic industrial properties, and it is working with numerous local preservation
19 organizations to save other properties through the Association of North Carolina
20 Revolving Funds; and

21 Whereas, the Department of Cultural Resources relies heavily on
22 Preservation North Carolina, although a separate, independent organization, to serve
23 as its ally in the purchase of endangered properties and their resale under protective
24 covenants; and

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Capital City Art Gallery Association, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year for the Education Center at the Contemporary Art Museum in the City of Raleigh. The Center will house the Art Institute for Educators, which will serve the needs of art educators statewide in North Carolina's public schools, contain a preschool with a visual art focus for children from Wake County, and conduct educational programs designed for middle and high school students from across the State of North Carolina. These funds shall be allocated as follows:

(1) \$500,000 for capital improvements.

(2) \$500,000 for program planning, development, and implementation.

Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.

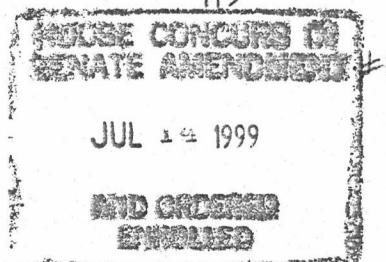

7 the years, various local governments in this State have been authorized to levy local
8 taxes and impact fees to generate revenues. These local revenue options are
9 important sources of support for local governments experiencing budget limitations in
10 light of growing needs and mandates. Local room occupancy taxes at a maximum
11 rate of six percent (6%) and one percent (1%) prepared meals taxes are two
12 examples of revenue sources that some or all local governments have been authorized
13 to levy.

14 Section 2. It is the intent of the General Assembly to authorize Camden,
15 Currituck, and Pasquotank Counties to choose from a menu of local revenue sources
16 that each county may levy if the levy is first approved by an affirmative vote of a
17 majority of the qualified voters of the county. The menu of revenue options
18 authorized by this act includes the following local revenue options that have been
19 authorized previously for other local governments in this State:

20 (1) Local room occupancy taxes at a maximum rate of six percent
21 (6%).

22 (2) One percent (1%) prepared meals taxes.

23 Section 3. The board of commissioners of the county may direct the
24 county board of elections to conduct an advisory referendum on the question of
25 whether a local tax authorized by this act will be levied. The election shall be held

22 as to conform with G.S. 160A-364.
23 Section 3.(b) The amount of the transportation impact fee imposed and

8 Fund may invest and reinvest monies constituting the Fund in one or more of the
9 types of securities or other investments authorized by State law for the State
10 Treasurer in G.S. 147-69.2.
11 Section 2. This act shall apply only to monies constituting the
12 Community Health Trust Fund. Limitations on investment and reinvestment of Fund
13 assets may be enacted by the Durham County Board of Commissioners.
14 Section 3. This act, insofar as it authorizes certain investments, amends
15 G.S. 159-30 with regard to the investment of the Durham County Community Health
16 Trust Fund only.
