The room occupancy and tourism development tax that 17 may be levied under Section 1 of this act shall be levy a room occupancy and tourism 18 development tax at the rate of three percent (3%) of the gross receipts derived from 19 the rental of any room, lodging, or similar accommodation furnished by any hotel, 20 motel, inn, tourist camp, or other similar enterprise within the county now subject to 21 the three percent (3%) sales tax imposed by the State under G.S. 105-164.4(a)(3).

22 This tax is in addition to any local sales tax.

Additional Occupancy Tax. -- In addition to the tax authorized by 23 24 Section 1 of this act, the Craven County Board of Commissioners may levy a room 25 occupancy tax of three percent (3%) of the gross receipts derived from the rental of

AN ACT TO MODIFY THE PENALTIES FOR THE TRANSYLVANIA COUNTY 3 ROOM OCCUPANCY TAX.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. Section 1 of Chapter 969 of the 1985 Session Laws, as it applies to Transylvania County, reads as rewritten:

"Section 1. Transylvania Occupancy Tax. (a) Authorization and Scope. The 8 board of commissioners of a county Transylvania County may by resolution, after not 9 less than 10 days' public notice and after a public hearing held pursuant thereto, levy 10 a room occupancy tax of three percent (3%) of the gross receipts derived from the 11 rental of any room, lodging, or similar accommodation furnished by a hotel, motel, 12 inn, or similar place within the county that is subject to sales tax imposed by the 13 State under G.S. 105-164.4(3). This tax is in addition to any State or local sales tax. 14 This tax does not apply to accommodations furnished by nonprofit charitable, 15 educational, or religious organizations.

16 (b) Administration. A tax levied under this section shall be levied, administered, collected, and repealed as provided in G.S. 153A-155. The penalties provided in 17 18 G.S. 153A-155 apply to a tax levied under this section. Collection. Every operator of a business subject to the tax levied under this act shall, on and after the effective date of the levy of the tax, collect the tax. This tax shall be collected as part of the charge for furnishing a taxable accommodation. The tax shall be stated and charged separately from the sales records, and shall be paid by the purchaser to the operator of the business as trustee for and on account of the county. The tax shall be added to 24 the sales price and shall be passed on to the purchaser instead of being borne by the

25 operator of the business. The county shall design, print, and furnish to all

Each 14 applicant for a license as a real estate salesman shall, within five three years 15 preceding the date application is made, have satisfactorily completed, at a school 16 approved by the Commission, a real estate fundamentals course consisting of at least 17 30 75 hours of classroom instruction in subjects determined by the Commission, or 18 shall possess real estate education or experience in real estate transactions which the 19 Commission shall find equivalent to the course. - 9 (a) No insurer shall require the use of an aftermarket part in the repair of a new 10 motor vehicle as a condition of payment under a policy covering damages to the motor vehicle. No insurer shall require additional payment for the use of new and original manufacturer equipment in repairing a new motor vehicle.
- (b) No insurer shall require the use of an aftermarket part in the repair of a motor 14 vehicle that is not new as a condition of payment under a policy covering damages to 15 the motor vehicle unless the aftermarket part is at least equal to the original part in 16 terms of fit, quality, performance, and warranty. Insurers specifying the use of 17 aftermarket parts shall include in the estimate the costs of any modifications made 18 necessary by the use of aftermarket parts, including modifications necessary to attain 19 satisfactory fit, finish, and corrosion protection.
- 20 (c) Every insurer that writes motor vehicle insurance in this State and that intends 21 to require or specify the use of aftermarket parts must disclose to its policyholders in 22 writing, either in the policy or on a sticker attached thereto, the following
- 23 <u>information in no smaller print than ten point type:</u>
- 24 'IN THE REPAIR OF YOUR COVERED AUTO UNDER THE PHYSICAL
- 25 DAMAGE COVERAGE PROVISIONS OF THIS POLICY, WE MAY REQUIRE



(a) It is declared by the General Assembly that the regulation of firearms is 10 properly an issue of general, statewide concern, and that the entire field of regulation 11 of firearms is preempted from regulation by local governments except as provided by The General Assembly further declares that the lawful design, 13 marketing, manufacture, distribution, sale or transfer of firearms or ammunition to 14 the public is not an unreasonably dangerous activity and does not constitute a 15 nuisance per se and furthermore, that it is the unlawful use of firearms and 16 ammunition, rather than their lawful design, marketing, manufacture, distribution, sale or transfer that is the proximate cause of injuries arising from their unlawful use. 17 18

Unless otherwise permitted by statute, no county or municipality, by 19 ordinance, resolution, or other enactment, shall regulate in any manner the 20 possession, ownership, storage, transfer, sale, purchase, licensing, or registration of 21 firearms, firearms ammunition, components of firearms, dealers in firearms, or dealers 22 in handgun components or parts.

(c) Notwithstanding subsection (b) of this section, a county or municipality, by 23 24 zoning or other ordinance, may regulate or prohibit the sale of firearms at a location 25 only if there is a lawful, general, similar regulation or prohibition of commercial





- 16 (e) Within the meaning of this section, a charitable hospital purpose is a hospital 17 purpose that has humane and philanthropic objectives; it is a hospital activity that 18 benefits humanity or a significant rather than limited segment of the community 19 without expectation of pecuniary profit or reward. In 11 the absence of the physician or with the physician's approval, the certificate may be 12 completed and signed by an associate physician, the chief medical officer of the 13 hospital or facility in which the death occurred or a physician who performed an 14 autopsy upon the decedent under the following circumstances: the individual has 15 access to the medical history of the deceased; the individual has viewed the deceased 16 at or after death; and the death is due to natural causes. When specifically approved 17 by the State Registrar, an electronic or facsimile signature of the physician shall be 18 acceptable. The physician shall state the cause of death on the certificate in definite 19 and precise terms. A certificate containing any indefinite terms or denoting only 20 symptoms of disease or conditions resulting from disease as defined by the State 21 Registrar, shall be returned to the person making the medical certification for 22 correction and more definite statement." 23 Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.



5 "(c) The petition must include a proposed name for the city, a map of the city, a 6 7 list of proposed services to be provided by the proposed municipality, the names of 8 three persons to serve as interim governing board, a proposed charter, a statement of 9 the estimated population, assessed valuation, degree of development, population 10 density, and recommendations as to the form of government and manner of election. 11 The petition must contain a statement that the municipality will offer four of the 12 following services and have in place an ad valorem tax at the rate of not less than 13 twenty cents (20¢) no later than the first day of the third fiscal year following the 14 effective date of the incorporation: (i) police protection; (ii) fire protection; (iii) solid 15 waste collection or disposal; (iv) water distribution; (v) street maintenance; (vi) street 16 construction or right-of-way acquisition; (vii) street lighting; and (viii) zoning. In 17 order to qualify for providing police protection, the municipality must propose either 18 to provide police service or to have services provided by contract with a county or 19 another municipality that proposes that the other government be compensated for 20 providing supplemental protection. 





Except as otherwise provided, the rules of evidence as applied in 9 the trial division of the General Court of Justice shall be followed; but, when 10 evidence is not reasonably available under the rules to show relevant facts, then the 11 most reliable and substantial evidence available shall be admitted. On the judge's 12 own motion, an administrative law judge may exclude evidence that is inadmissible 13 under this section. The party with the burden of proof in a contested case must 14 establish the facts required by G.S. 150B-23(a) by a preponderance of the evidence. 15 It shall not be necessary for a party or his attorney to object at the hearing to 16 evidence in order to preserve the right to object to its consideration by the administrative law judge in making a recommended decision, by the agency in making a final decision, or by the court on judicial review." 19

Except as provided in G.S. 150B-36(c), in each contested case the administrative law judge shall make a recommended decision or order that contains findings of fact and conclusions of law. The findings of fact shall be supported by a preponderance of the evidence admissable under G.S. 150B-29, 150B-30, or 150B-31."

After notice to the employer and the insurance carrier, after an opportunity to be heard by all interested parties, and with or without the consent of the employer, the judge shall determine, in his discretion, the amount, whether based on accrued or prospective compensation, if any, of the employer's lien and the amount of cost of the third-party litigation to be shared between the employee and employer. If the matter is pending in the federal district court such determination may be made by a federal district court judge of that division."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to judgments entered against third parties on or after that date pursuant to G.S. 97-10.2.
