



(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of any other statute and without regard for the 12 13 place of domicile of a parent or guardian, statute, the cost of a free appropriate 14 public education for a child with special needs who is placed in or assigned to a 15 group home, foster home or other similar facility, pursuant to State and federal law, 16 shall be borne by the local board of education in the county in which the child's 17 parent, guardian, or legal custodian resides. which the group home, foster home or 18 other similar facility is located. Nothing in this section obligates any local board of 19 education to bear any cost for the care and maintenance of a child with special needs 20 in a group home, foster home or other similar facility.

(b) The State Board of Education shall use State and federal funds appropriated 21 22 for children with special needs to establish a reserve fund to reimburse local boards 23 of education for the education costs of children assigned to group homes or other 24 facilities as provided in subsection (a) of this section."

(a) Credit. -- A taxpayer that is allowed for the taxable year a federal income tax 12 credit for low-income housing under section 42 of the Code with respect to a 13 qualified North Carolina low-income building, is allowed a credit under this Article 14 equal to a percentage of the total federal credit allowed with respect to that building. 15 For the purposes of this section, the total federal credit allowed is the total allowed 16 during the 10-year federal credit period plus the disallowed first-year credit allowed 17 in the 11th year. For the purposes of this section, the total federal credit is calculated 18 based on qualified basis as of the end of the first year of the credit period and is not 19 recalculated to reflect subsequent increases in qualified basis. For buildings that meet 20 condition (c)(1) of this section, the credit percentage is seventy-five percent (75%).

21 For other buildings, the credit percentage is twenty-five percent (25%).

(b) Timing. -- The credit must be taken in equal installments over the five years 22 23 beginning in the first taxable year in which the federal credit is claimed for that 24 building. During the first taxable year in which the credit allowed under this section 25 may be taken with respect to a building, the amount of the installment must be
