



No benefits are to be provided for services under this subsection that are not performed by or upon the direction of a dentist, doctor, or other professional provider approved by the Plan nor for services and materials that do not meet the standards accepted by the American Dental Association."

AN ACT TO ENABLE THE COUNTY OF MACON TO ESTABLISH AN 3 **AIRPORT** AUTHORITY FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF **AIRPORT** FACILITIES IN THE COUNTY.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is hereby created the "Macon County Airport 7 Authority" (for brevity hereinafter referred to as the "Airport Authority"), which shall be a body both corporate and politic, having the powers and jurisdiction 9 hereinafter enumerated and such other and additional powers as shall be conferred 10 upon it by general law and future acts of the General Assembly.

Section 2. The Airport Authority shall consist of five members, who shall 12 be residents of Macon County and who shall be appointed to staggered terms of six 13 years by the Macon County Board of Commissioners. Members may succeed 14 themselves in office and serve more than one term. Two initial appointments to the 15 Airport Authority shall be for two years, two initial appointments to the Airport 16 Authority shall be for four years, and the remaining initial appointment to the 17 Airport Authority shall be for six years.

18 When vacancies occur in the membership of the Airport Authority, for 19 any reason, the remaining members of the Airport Authority shall submit a list of two 20 or more candidates to the Macon County Board of Commissioners. The Board of 21 Commissioners shall either select one from that list to fill the unexpired term of the 22 vacant office or shall request that the Airport Authority submit additional candidates.

23 The Airport Authority shall submit additional candidates upon request until the 24 Board of Commissioners selects a member from the candidates submitted.

If any lessor, landlord, or agent seizes possession of or interferes with a 7 tenant's access to a tenant's or household member's personal property in any manner 8 not in accordance with G.S. <u>44A-2(e)</u>, 42-25.9(d), 42-25.9(g), 42-25.9(h), or 42-36.2 9 the tenant or household member shall be entitled to recover possession of his 10 personal property or compensation for the value of the personal property, and, in any 11 action brought by a tenant or household member under this Article, the landlord 12 shall be liable to the tenant or household member for actual damages, but not 13 including punitive damages, treble damages or damages for emotional distress."

Section 2. G.S. 42-25.9(g) reads as rewritten:


"(g) Ten days after being placed in lawful possession by execution of a writ of 15 possession, a landlord may throw away, dispose of, or sell all items of personal property remaining on the premises. Except that in the case of the lease of a space 18 for a manufactured home as defined in G.S. 143-143.9(6), G.S. 44A-2(e) shall apply to the disposition of a manufactured home by a landlord after being placed in lawful 20 possession by execution of a writ of possession. During the 10-day period after being 21 placed in lawful possession by execution of a writ of possession, a landlord may move 22 for storage purposes, but shall not throw away, dispose of, or sell any items of personal property remaining on the premises unless otherwise provided for in this 24 Chapter. Upon the tenant's request prior to the expiration of the 10-day period, the 25 landlord shall release possession of the property to the tenant during regular business

5 "\$ 153A-158.1. Acquisition and improvement of school property in certain counties.

7 (a) Acquisition by County. -- A county may acquire, by any lawful method, any 8 interest in real or personal property for use by a school administrative unit within the 9 county. In exercising the power of eminent domain a county shall use the procedures 10 of Chapter 40A. The county shall use its authority under this subsection to acquire 11 property for use by a school administrative unit within the county only upon the 12 request of the board of education of that school administrative unit and after a public 13 hearing.

14 (b) Construction or Improvement by County. -- A county may construct, equip, 15 expand, improve, renovate, or otherwise make available property for use by a school 16 administrative unit within the county. The local board of education shall be involved 17 in the design, construction, equipping, expansion, improvement, or renovation of the 18 property to the same extent as if the local board owned the property.

19 (c) Lease or Sale by Board of Education. -- Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 20 115C-518 and G.S. 160A-274, a local board of education may, in connection with 21 additions, improvements, renovations, or repairs to all or part of any of its property, 22 lease or sell the property to the board of commissioners of the county in which the 23 property is located for any price negotiated between the two boards.

24 (d) Board of Education May Contract for Construction. -- Notwithstanding the 25 provisions of G.S. 115C-40 and G.S. 115C-521, a local board of education may enter

Development rights shall be computed on a per acre basis. The pilot program may authorize the Town to purchase, hold, and convey such rights or to facilitate the direct voluntary transfer of rights between properties. The transfer of rights from or to property shall not be deemed a rezoning of the property requiring compliance with Article 19 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes.

The State Board of Education shall distribute these funds on a grant 12 basis to local school administrative units that match State funds on a dollar-for-dollar 13 basis by committing federal funds received under Title I of the Improving America's 14 Schools Act, Smart Start funds, and other non-State funds to the program.

than age 80 expires five years after the date of issuance, or on the person's eightieth

birthday, whichever is earlier. A drivers license issued to a person age 80 or over

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 7A-16 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 7A-16. Creation and organization.

The Court of Appeals is created effective January 1, 1967. It shall consist initially 7 8 of six judges, elected by the qualified voters of the State for terms of eight years. The 9 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court shall designate one of the judges as Chief Judge, 10 to serve in such capacity at the pleasure of the Chief Justice. Before entering upon 11 the duties of his office, a judge of the Court of Appeals shall take the oath of office 12 prescribed for a judge of the General Court of Justice.

The Governor on or after July 1, 1967, shall make temporary appointments to the 13 14 six initial judgeships. The appointees shall serve until January 1, 1969. Their 15 successors shall be elected at the general election for members of the General 16 Assembly in November, 1968, and shall take office on January 1, 1969, to serve for 17 the remainder of the unexpired term which began on January 1, 1967.

Upon the appointment of at least five judges, and the designation of a Chief Judge, 19 the court is authorized to convene, organize, and promulgate, subject to the approval 20 of the Supreme Court, such supplementary rules as it deems necessary and 21 appropriate for the discharge of the judicial business lawfully assigned to it.

22 Effective January 1, 1969, the number of judges is increased to nine, and the 23 Governor, on or after March 1, 1969, shall make temporary appointments to the 24 additional judgeships thus created. The appointees shall serve until January 1, 1971. 25 Their successors shall be elected at the general election for members of the General


