3 Be it resolved by the Senate:

4 Section 1. The permanent rules of the 1999 Regular Session, with the
5 following amendments, are the rules governing the Extra Session, 2000, of the
6 General Assembly:

7 **Rule 34.1. Committee of the Whole.**

8 It shall be in order to move into the Committee of the Whole. The President Pro
9 Tempore is chairman of the Committee of the Whole.

10 **Rule 40. Introduction of bills.**

11 Every bill introduced shall contain on the outside cover the title of the document
12 and the name of the Senator or Senators presenting it. Bills shall be delivered by the
13 primary sponsor of the document to the Senate Principal Clerk within one hour after
14 adoption of this resolution. The Principal Clerk shall receive, number, and present
15 said bill to the Senate for first reading.

16 **Rule 40.1. Limitation on resolutions and bills.**

17 The only resolutions that may be introduced or considered in the Senate are
18 resolutions adjourning the Extra Session sine die. No bills, parts thereof, or
19 amendments thereto may be introduced or considered in the Senate unless requested
20 by the Governor's Proclamation dated March 30, 2000, convening the Extra Session:
21 for the purpose of considering the adoption of a State law setting a maximum appeal
22 bond for noncompensatory damages at twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000). This
23 rule may not be suspended.

24 **Rule 41. (Reserved).**

25 **Rule 42. Reference of appropriation and finance bills.**

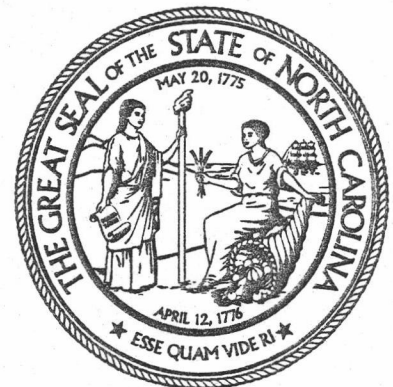



2 PURCHASE MORE NORTH CAROLINA TOBACCO.

3 Whereas, approximately 100,000 individuals in North Carolina are
4 involved in the producing of tobacco on the farm; and

5 Whereas, North Carolina-produced flue-cured and burley tobacco are
6 considered to be the finest tobacco grown in the world; and

7 Whereas, there has been an increase in the importation of lesser-quality
8 leaf for use in domestically produced cigarettes over the last 20 years; and

9 Whereas, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, the
10 purchase intentions by the major tobacco companies in 1995 for flue-cured and
11 burley tobacco was 570 million pounds and in 2000 had dropped to 286 million
12 pounds; and

13 Whereas, the basic quota available for production dropped from 934
