# 1 A HOUSE RESOLUTION TO URGE MAJOR TOBACCO COMPANIES TO PURCHASE MORE NORTH CAROLINA TOBACCO.

Whereas, approximately 100,000 individuals in North Carolina are involved in the producing of tobacco on the farm; and

Whereas, North Carolina-produced flue-cured and burley tobacco are considered to be the finest tobacco grown in the world; and

Whereas, there has been an increase in the importation of lesser-quality leaf for use in domestically produced cigarettes over the last 20 years; and

Whereas, according to the United States Department of Agriculture, the purchase intentions by the major tobacco companies in 1995 for flue-cured and burley tobacco was 570 million pounds and in 2000 had dropped to 286 million pounds; and

Whereas, the basic quota available for production dropped from 934 million pounds to 543 million pounds; and

Whereas, this increase in foreign-leaf importation has caused significant reduction in tobacco quota available for North Carolina producers under the federal tobacco price support program; and

Whereas, that reduction has resulted in diminished economic viability of many of North Carolina's rural areas; and

Whereas, in addition tobacco farmers in North Carolina have suffered significant economic harm from crop losses during the previous year as a result of droughts and Hurricanes Dennis, Floyd, and Irene, suffering a loss from Hurricane Floyd alone of over \$94 million; and


