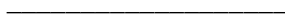

Senate Chamber
Friday, August 24, 2018

In accordance with law, as set forth in the Constitution of the State of North Carolina, and pursuant to the Joint Proclamation issued on August 23, 2018, upon the receipt of written requests of three-fifths of all the members of the Senate and the House of Representatives, the Senate of the 2017 General Assembly convenes in Second Extra Session 2018 at the hour of 9:00 a.m. in the Senate Chamber of the Legislative Building in the City of Raleigh.

The Honorable Phil Berger, President *Pro Tempore*, presides and calls the Senate to order.

Prayer is offered by The Honorable Joyce Waddell, Senator from Mecklenburg County, as follows:

“Dear heavenly Father, blessed Savior, and merciful God, today in this special session in the Senate chamber, may your goodness and love be present among us. Help us to remember that you are our strength in the times of trouble. Take charge of our decisions, and help us as you renew our faith. Give us the humility always to seek you first. This prayer we offer in the name of Jesus. And all the people said, ‘Amen.’”

PROCLAMATION OF AN EXTRA SESSION

The President *Pro Tempore* instructs the clerk to read the Joint Proclamation issued by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives as follows:

**JOINT PROCLAMATION TO CONVENE THE
GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA IN EXTRA SESSION**

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 11(2) of the Constitution of North Carolina authorizes and requires the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate to convene the General Assembly in extra session by joint proclamation upon receipt of written requests signed by three-fifths of all members of the House of Representatives and the Senate, and

WHEREAS, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives has each received written requests from three-fifths of all the members of the House of Representatives and the Senate,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the President of the Senate do hereby proclaim that the General Assembly of North Carolina shall convene in extra session in the City of Raleigh, North Carolina, in the State Legislative Building at 9:00 o'clock a.m. on Friday, August 24, 2018, to consider bills concerning any matters the General Assembly elects to consider.

A copy of the Proclamation shall be delivered to each member of the House of Representatives, and the Senate, and a copy to the Governor of North Carolina and the Secretary of State.

ADOPTION OF RULES

Senator Rabon submits a resolution for filing, introduction, and immediate consideration. The resolution is presented to the Senate, read the first time, and disposed of as follows:

By Senator Rabon:

S.R. 1, A SENATE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE SENATE FOR THE 2018 SECOND EXTRA SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The resolution is read a second time and placed before the Senate for adoption.

The text of the resolution is as follows:

S.R. 1, A SENATE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE SENATE FOR THE 2018 SECOND EXTRA SESSION OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Be it resolved by the Senate:

SECTION 1. The permanent rules of the 2017 Regular Session, with the following amendments, are the rules governing the 2018 Second Extra Session of the General Assembly:

RULE 32. List of standing/select committees. – The standing committees shall be:

Senate Select Committee on Elections
Rules and Operations of the Senate

All committees shall be comprised of the members who were appointed to those committees during the 2017 Regular Session.

RULE 40. Introduction of bills. – Every bill introduced shall contain on the Senate e-jacket the title of the document and the name of the Senator or Senators presenting it. The Principal Clerk of the Senate shall receive, number, and present each bill to the Senate for first reading on the day it is filed.

August 24, 2018

RULE 40.1. Limitation on introduction and consideration of resolutions and bills. – The only resolutions that may be introduced or considered in the Senate are resolutions establishing the rules governing the Second Extra Session and adjourning the Second Extra Session sine die. The only bills, parts of bills, or amendments to bills that may be introduced or considered in the Senate are bills, parts of bills, or amendments to bills proposing amendments to the North Carolina Constitution.

RULE 41. (Reserved).

RULE 43. First reading; reference to committee. – All bills introduced and all House bills received upon a message from the House of Representatives, upon presentation to the Senate, shall be read in the regular order of business by their number and title, which shall constitute the first reading of the bill on the day on which they are received. The Chair of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate or in the Chair's absence the Vice-Chair of the Committee, or the President Pro Tempore may refer to a Senate committee all bills introduced in the Senate or received from the House of Representatives. Upon the referral being made, the Chair of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate shall notify the Principal Clerk of the Senate of the referral, and the Reading Clerk shall announce the referral of the bill. The Principal Clerk shall inform the Presiding Officer of the referral. The title and referral shall be entered upon the Journal. Bills may be referred to more than one committee serially.

RULE 43.1. Second reading. – All bills reported by committee shall be placed before the Senate for second reading and immediate consideration upon passage.

RULE 45.1. Action on amendment or committee substitute. – If any committee recommends adoption of an amendment or committee substitute of a bill or resolution, the amendment or committee substitute shall be considered adopted upon the reading of the committee report. The bill or resolution, as amended, or its adopted committee substitute may be placed on the calendar for the same legislative day or re-referred if the bill or resolution was serially referred. The committee substitute's original bill or resolution shall lie on the table.

RULE 50. Third reading requirements. – When a bill or resolution has passed its second reading, it shall be placed on the calendar for immediate consideration on its third reading, unless prohibited by Section 23 of Article II of the North Carolina Constitution.

RULE 56.1. Amendments and committee substitutes adopted by the House to bills originating in the Senate. – (a) Whenever the House has adopted an amendment or a committee substitute for a bill originating in the Senate and has returned the bill to the Senate for concurrence in that amendment or committee substitute, the Senate may concur in that amendment or committee substitute on the same legislative day.

RULE 59. (Reserved).

SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption.

WOODARD: “Mr. President, if I could request of the Chair or Senator Pate if we could adjourn in honor of a great American and a true patriot, Senator John McCain.”

SENATOR SMITH: “At 4:28 p.m. on Saturday, August 25, a great American hero, Senator John Sydney McCain III, passed away. I was most impressed with Senator McCain, as he took a difficult position to stand firm to advocate for right, whether it was from the right or whether it was from the left. He challenged his colleagues with words following the Charlottesville riots of last year. In his words, he said, ‘There is nothing in their hate-driven racism that can match the strength of a nation conceived in liberty and comprising 323 million souls of different origins and opinions, who are equal under the law...We are the country that led the free world to victory over fascism and dispatched communism to the ash heap of history. We are the superpower that organized not an empire, but an international order of free, independent nations that has liberated more people from poverty and tyranny than anyone thought possible in the age of [colonialism],’ and I will end with this: ‘We seem [to be] convinced that majorities exist to impose their will with few concessions and that minorities exist to prevent the party in power from doing anything important. That’s not how we were meant to govern. Our entire system of government—with its checks and balances, its bicameral Congress, its protections of the rights of the minority—was designed for compromise. It seldom works smoothly or speedily. It was never expected to. It requires pragmatic problem solving from even the most passionate partisans. It relies on compromise between opposing sides to protect the interests that we share. We can fight like hell for our ideas to prevail. But we have to respect each other, or at least respect the fact that we need each other.’ My school system opened today, and I was very excited—the band, the students, the teachers, all of us there, knowing that we have a common interest, and that is to build productive citizens. I rushed from convocation and opening day celebrations to come here to the General Assembly. I am so tired of coming to a place where I feel that my vote does not matter and that I’m constantly going to be outnumbered and, what’s even worse, not even heard. We’ve done a disservice, but I do ask that we adjourn, and that the words be spread upon the journal, in honor of Senator of McCain, and that may his words from last year inspire us today to do better to govern together as we were elected to do.”

Senator Pate offers a motion that, in accordance with **H.J.R. 2**, the Senate do adjourn *sine die*, in memory of the late Senator John McCain, subject to the standard stipulations set forth in Senate Rule 24.1, the ratification of bills, and the receipt of messages from the House of Representatives, seconded by Senator Smith, which motion prevails.
