FIRST DAY

Senate Chamber Tuesday, October 2, 2018

In accordance with law, as set forth in the Constitution of the State of North Carolina, and pursuant to the proclamation issued by Governor Roy Cooper on September 26, 2018, the Senate of the 2017 General Assembly convenes in Third Extra Session 2018 at the hour of 10:00 a.m. in the Senate Chamber of the Legislative Building in the City of Raleigh.

The Honorable Dan Forest, Lieutenant Governor, presides and calls the Senate to order.

Prayer is offered by The Reverend Paul A. Lowe, Jr., Senator from Forsyth County, as follows:

"Our God, our Father, we thank you for this day. We thank you for your grace and your mercy. We ask at this time that you would continue to be with us and to be with all North Carolinians during these difficult times. We ask that you would look down upon us and show your mercy and share your wisdom that we might do what's good and we might do what's right for the benefit of the Old North State. These things we pray in the name of He that orders our steps and meets us with mercy, in the name of Jesus the Christ. And all of the people said, 'Amen."

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Led by the President, members and guests remain standing and pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

PROCLAMATION OF AN EXTRA SESSION

The President instructs the clerk to read the Proclamation issued by the Governor, as follows:

EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2018 BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Hurricane Florence ("the Hurricane") made landfall off the coast of North Carolina on or about 14 September 2018 and has claimed the lives of thirty-six people in our State; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane has inflicted severe damage on public and private property; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane's impacts constitute a State of Emergency, as defined in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 166A-19.3(19), and declared in Executive Order No. 51 on 07 September 2018; and

WHEREAS, the State's residents have suffered losses and will likely suffer imminent further widespread damage within the scope of N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 166A-19.3(3) and 166A-19.21(b); and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane's impacts are extraordinary circumstances requiring the North Carolina General Assembly to convene in an extra session to respond to the damage created by the Hurricane; and

WHEREAS, the Governor, pursuant to N.C. Const. art. III, §5(7), issued a proclamation on 21 September 2018 for an extra session of the North Carolina General Assembly commencing Tuesday, 09 October 2018 at two o'clock in the afternoon to address the Hurricane's impacts; and

WHEREAS, after further consultation with the Speaker of the North Carolina House and the President Pro Tempore of the North Carolina Senate, all parties agree that the General Assembly should return in an extra session on Tuesday, 02 October 2018 at ten o'clock in the morning; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina has a constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed and uphold the Constitution and laws of the United States and of the State of North Carolina;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, pursuant to Article III, Section 5(7) of the North Carolina State Constitution, RESCIND THE EXTRA SESSION PROCLAMATION ISSUED 21 SEPTEMBER 2018¹ and hereby proclaim an "EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY" commencing Tuesday, 02 October 2018 at ten o'clock in the morning to address Hurricane Recovery.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the Great Seal of the State of North Carolina at the Capitol in Raleigh this twenty-sixth day of September in the year of our Lord two thousand and eighteen and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and forty-second.

ADOPTION OF RULES

Senator Rabon submits a resolution for filing, introduction, and immediate consideration. The resolution is presented to the Senate, read the first time, and disposed of as follows:

By Senators Rabon (Primary Sponsor); J. Davis, Gunn, Rabin, Tarte and Wade:

S.R. 1, A SENATE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE SENATE FOR THE 2018 THIRD EXTRA SESSION OF THE 2017 GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

The resolution is read a second time and placed before the Senate for immediate consideration.

The text of the resolution is as follows:

S.R. 1, A SENATE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE SENATE FOR THE 2018 THIRD EXTRA SESSION OF THE 2017 GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

Be it resolved by the Senate:

SECTION 1. The permanent rules of the 2017 Regular Session, with the following amendments, are the rules governing the 2018 Third Extra Session of the General Assembly:

RULE 32. List of standing/select committees. – The standing committees shall be:

Appropriations/Base Budget Education/Higher Education Finance Rules and Operations of the Senate All committees shall be comprised of the members who were appointed to those committees during the 2017 Regular Session.

RULE 40. **Introduction of bills.** – Every bill filed for introduction shall contain on the Senate e-jacket the title of the document and the name of the Senator or Senators sponsoring it. The Senate e-jacket shall be delivered by the primary sponsor of the document, or by that member's legislative assistant, with the prescribed authorization form signed by the primary sponsor and by that member's legislative assistant, to the Office of the Senate Principal Clerk.

RULE 40.1. Limitation on introduction and consideration of resolutions and bills. – The only resolutions that may be introduced or considered in the Senate are resolutions establishing the rules governing the Third Extra Session and adjourning the Third Extra Session sine die. The only bills, parts of bills, or amendments to bills that may be introduced or considered in the Senate are bills, parts of bills, or amendments to bills addressing disaster recovery related to Hurricane Florence.

RULE 41. (Reserved).

RULE 42. **Reference of appropriation and finance bills.** – (a) All bills introduced in the Senate providing for appropriations from the State, or any subdivision thereof, or waiving fees or other revenues payable to the State, its agencies, its licensing boards, or any of its subdivisions shall, before being considered by the Senate, be referred to the Committee on Appropriations/Base Budget and bills referred to other committees carrying any such provisions shall be reported to the Senate as being bills to be referred to the Appropriations/Base Budget Committee before proper action may be taken by the Senate.

RULE 43. **First reading; reference to committee.** – All bills introduced and all House bills received upon a message from the House of Representatives, upon presentation to the Senate, shall be read in the regular order of business by their number and title, which shall constitute the first reading of the bill on the day on which they are received. The Chair of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate or the President Pro Tempore may refer to a Senate committee all bills introduced in the Senate or received from the House of Representatives. Upon the referral being made, the Chair of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate shall notify the Principal Clerk of the Senate of the referral, and the Reading Clerk shall announce the referral of the bill. The Principal Clerk shall inform the Presiding Officer of the referral. The title and referral shall be entered upon the Journal. Bills may be referred to more than one committee serially.

RULE 43.1. **Second reading.** – All bills reported by committee shall be placed before the Senate for second reading and immediate consideration upon passage.

RULE 45.1. Action on amendment or committee substitute. – If any committee recommends adoption of an amendment or committee substitute of a bill or resolution, the amendment or committee substitute shall be considered adopted upon the reading of the committee report. The bill or resolution, as amended, or its adopted committee substitute may be placed on the calendar for the same legislative day or re-referred if the bill or resolution was serially referred. The committee substitute's original bill or resolution shall lie on the table.

RULE 50. **Third reading requirements.** – When a bill or resolution has passed its second reading, it shall be placed on the calendar for immediate consideration on its third reading, unless prohibited by Section 23 of Article II of the North Carolina Constitution.

RULE 56.1. Amendments and committee substitutes adopted by the House to bills originating in the Senate. – (a) Whenever the House has adopted an amendment or a committee substitute for a bill originating in the Senate and has returned the bill to the Senate for concurrence in that amendment or committee substitute, the Senate may concur in that amendment or committee substitute on the same legislative day.

RULE 59. (Reserved).

- RULE 59.2. **Vetoed bills.** (a) The Principal Clerk, or in the Clerk's absence an employee designated by the Principal Clerk, is designated the Senate Officer to receive bills vetoed by the Governor. If the veto message is received on a day when the Senate is in session, it may be read in the Senate on the day of its receipt. If the veto message is received on a day when the Senate is not in session, or if it was not read on the legislative day when it was received, it shall be read on the next legislative day.
- (b) Upon a veto message's being read in the Senate, the Chair of the Committee on Rules and Operations of the Senate, or in the absence of the Chair, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall either refer the bill and the Governor's objections and veto message to committee or place the bill on the calendar for a day certain.

SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption.

Upon motion of Senator Rabon, the Senate Resolution is adopted (44-0).

EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY 2018 BY THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA A PROCLAMATION

(Rescinded September 26, 2018)

WHEREAS, Hurricane Florence ("the Hurricane") made landfall off the coast of North Carolina on or about 14 September 2018; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane has placed North Carolina residents and visitors at substantial risk of death or injury, claiming the lives of thirty-one people; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane has inflicted significant damage on public and private property, disrupting essential utility services and systems and other critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the undersigned issued Executive Order No. 51 on 7 September 2018, which declares a State of Emergency; and

WHEREAS, N.C. Const. art. III § 5(7) provides that the undersigned, on extraordinary occasions, and with the concurrence of the Council of State, may convene the General Assembly in extra session by proclamation; and

WHEREAS, the weather events and impacts associated with the Hurricane are extraordinary circumstances and require the North Carolina General Assembly to convene in an extra session to consider Hurricane recovery, response, and relief; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina has a constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed and uphold the Constitution and laws of the United States and of the State of North Carolina;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, pursuant to Article III, Section 5(7) of the North Carolina State Constitution, do hereby proclaim an "**EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY**" commencing Tuesday, October 9, 2018, at two o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of addressing Hurricane recovery, response, and relief.
