MINUTES HOUSE EDUCATION SUBCOMMITTEE ON UNIVERSITIES MAY 8, 1997

The House Education Subcommittee on Universities met May 8, 1997, at 11:00 a.m., Room 1425 with the following in attendance: Reps. Crawford, Boyd-McIntyre, Dickson, Ives, McMahan, Nichols, Oldham, Russell, Smith, and Wilkins. Rep. Crawford, Chairman, welcomed guests and introduced the Page, Gary Vance Nichols, Wilkes County.

HB 1180 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO EXPAND THE MODEL TEACHER EDUCATION CONSORTIUM TO INCLUDE CUMBERLAND, ROBESON, AND HOKE COUNTIES, FAYETTEVILLE STATE UNIVERSITY, THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA AT PEMBROKE, ROBESON COMMUNITY COLLEGE, AND FAYETTEVILLE TECHNICAL COLLEGE. Rep. McAllister presented the bill and a proposed committee substitute. Rep. Wilkins moved to consider the proposed committee substitute and the motion passed. Jean Murphy, Executive Director, Model Teacher Education Consortium explained the purpose of the consortium and responded to questions. Rep. Dickson moved for a favorable report as to the proposed committee substitute and unfavorable as to the original bill and re-refer to the House Committee on Appropriations. The motion passed.

SB 265 Committee Substitute for A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE STATUTES ON SPECIAL REPSONSIBILITY CONSTITUTENT INSTITUTIONS IN THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA SYSTEM TO CLARIFY THE ROLE OF THE OFFICE OF THE STATE AUDITOR. Senator Lee presented the bill. Rep. Dickson moved for a favorable report to the House floor. The motion passed. Rep. Boyd-McIntyre was identified to manage the bill on the floor.

The committee adjourned at 11:30.

Section 1 expands the Model Teacher Education Consortium to include Cumberland, Robeson and Hoke Counties, Fayetteville State University, the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, Robeson Community College, and Fayetteville Technical Community College.

The emphasis of the expansion will be to provide qualified teacher assistants to those counties by expanding access to educational programs. Special emphasis will be on the recruitment of minority teacher assistants to participate in subject areas of critical teacher shortages.

The program shall offer up to 300 teacher assistants up to \$500 each for tuition and books. The Model Teacher Education Consortium shall administer the grant program. Local school administrative units shall enter into an agreement with each participant in accordance with policies adopted by the Model Teacher Education Consortium's Policy Board.

Section 2 appropriates \$150,000 to the State Board of Education for the 1997-1998 fiscal year to implement the act. No more than 25% of these funds shall be used for administrative purposes.

RE: Summary SB 265 - UNC Flexibility Procedures

Background: The Board of Governors may designate a constituent institution as a special responsibility institution if it has the management staff and internal financial management to administer additional management discretion. All of the 16 constituent institutions are currently special responsibility institutions. Among other areas of financial discretion, special responsibility institutions have the authority to transfer funds between categories. For example, a special responsibility institution may transfer funds from lapsed salaries to purchase library books. Special responsibility institutions also have additional flexibility under State purchase and contract law.

Section 1 amends G.S. 116-30.1 regarding special responsibility constituent institutions in two substantive ways. First, it expands the scope of information that the President of the University may review to determine whether a special responsibility institution needs to revise its financial management. The proposed change would allow the President to review special reports, electronic data processing reports, and management letters in addition to annual financial audit reports and performance audit reports. If any of these documents indicate a weakness in the internal control structure, deficiencies in the accounting records, or noncompliance with rules and regulations, the President must take immediate action. Second, it clarifies that the President of the University, rather than the State Auditor, is responsible for determining whether an institution is making satisfactory progress towards resolving issues related to any significant findings. This change resolves a number of issues. It removes the State Auditor from making management recommendations to entities that he must later audit.

The act is effective upon becoming law.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 116-30.1 reads as rewritten:

"§ 116-30.1. Special responsibility constituent institutions.

The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, acting on recommendation made by the President of The University of North Carolina after consultation by him with the State Auditor, may designate one or more constituent institutions of The University as special responsibility constituent institutions. That designation shall be based on an express finding by the Board of Governors that each institution to be so designated has the management staff and internal financial controls that will enable it to administer competently and responsibly all additional management authority and discretion to be delegated to it. The Board of Governors, on recommendation of the President, shall adopt rules prescribing management staffing standards and internal financial controls and safeguards, including the lack of any significant exceptions or audit findings in the annual financial audit by the State Auditor's Office, that must be met by a constituent institution before it may be designated a special responsibility constituent institution and must be maintained in order for it to retain that designation. These rules shall not be designed to prohibit participation by a constituent institution because of its size. These rules shall

1 establish procedures for the President and his staff to review the annual financial 2 audit reports or any other reports, special reports, electronic data processing reports. 3 or performance reports reports, management letters, or any other report issued by the 4 State Auditor's Office for each special responsibility constituent institution. 5 The President shall take immediate action regarding reported weaknesses in the 6 internal control structure, deficiencies in the accounting records, and noncompliance 7 with rules and regulations. In any instance where such audit exceptions significant 8 findings are identified, the President shall notify the Chancellor of the particular 9 special responsibility constituent institution that such exceptions must be resolved to 10 the satisfaction of the State Auditor and the institution must make satisfactory 11 progress in resolving the findings, as determined by the President of The University 12 University, after consultation with the State Auditor, within a three-month period 13 commencing with the date of receipt of the published financial audit report. report, 14 any other audit report, or management letter. If the exceptions are not satisfactorily 15 resolved satisfactory progress is not made within a three-month period, the President 16 of The University shall recommend to the Board of Governors at its next meeting 17 that the designation of the particular institution as a special responsibility constituent 18 institution be terminated until such time as the exceptions are resolved to the satisfaction of the State Auditor and the President of The University of North 20 Carolina, Carolina, after consultation with the State Auditor. However, once the 21 designation as a special responsibility constituent institution has been withdrawn by 22 the Board of Governors, reinstatement may not be effective until the beginning of the 23 following fiscal year at the earliest. Any actions taken by the Board of Governors 24 with respect to withdrawal or reinstatement of an institution's status as a special 25 responsibility constituent institution shall be reported immediately to the Joint 26 Legislative Education Oversight Committee. 27

The rules established under this section shall include review by the President, after and consultation with the State Auditor, the Director of the Office of State Personnel, and the Director of the Division of State Purchasing and Contracts in ascertaining whether or not a constituent institution has the management staff and internal financial controls to administer the additional authorities authorized under G.S. 116-32 30.2, 116-30.4, and 143-53.1. Such review and consultation must take place no less frequently than once each biennium."

Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
