Minutes EDUCATION/Subcommittee on Universities April 22, 1999

The EDUCATION/Subcommittee on Universities met on Thursday, April 22, 1999 in Room 424 Legislative Office Building 15 minutes after House Session. The following members were present: Representatives Haire, Fox, Hensley, Insko, Michaux, and Thompson. Chairman Insko presided. Kory Goldsmith, Committee Counsel, was in attendance. Visitor Registration sheet is attached as part of the record. Chairman Insko called the meeting to order at 6:10 pm.

HB 72 - AN ACT TO PROVIDE A MEMBER OF THE MILITARY WHO ATTENDS A CONSTITUENT INSTITUTION OR A COMMUNITY COLLEGE SHALL ONLY BE CHARGED IN-STATE TUITION. Rep. McAllister, the bill sponsor, was recognized to explain the bill. Rep. McAllister presented a Proposed Committee Substitute for HB 72. Rep. Hunter moved to adopt the Proposed Committee Substitute for discussion. The Proposed Committee Substitute being before the committee for discussion, Rep. McAllister explained that the bill addresses an equity issue as it relates to active duty military personnel. Current statutes allow for in-state tuition rates for dependents and spouses, but does not automatically allow the active duty military personnel that right. The change would grant in-state tuition rates to all active duty military personnel. North Carolina is one of the few states that does not provide in-state tuition to active duty personnel.

The committee discussed Rep. Haire's suggestion to add non-residents attending an institution in the University of North Carolina system on a full scholarship be granted an in-state tuition rate vs. being charged a non-resident tuition rate. Rep. McAllister commented that HB 72 deals strictly with military personnel and she preferred the bill move forward on that basis only.

Rep. Hensley expressed concerns about schools near military bases having difficulty absorbing students and lessening fees. Rep. McAllister said Fayetteville State University requested the bill, and she knew of no opposition.

David Edwards, UNC-General Administration, was asked to comment on the bill. He stated that institutions now do carry the rate under a complicated formula, and Fayetteville State was involved early on in a change in the statute that would allow them to account differently to soften the economic impact. Military entitlement funds have tended to shrink over the years.

Rep. Hunter moved the Committee Substitute for HB 72 be given a favorable report and unfavorable to the original bill and be re-referred to the Committee on Appropriations. The motion passed and HB 72 Committee Substitute was reported out of committee as such.

There being no further business, Chairman Insko adjourned the meeting at 6:25 pm.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 116-143.3(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Any member of the armed services qualifying for admission to an institution 8 of higher education as defined in G.S. 116-143.1(a)(3) but not qualifying as a resident 9 for tuition purposes under G.S. 116-143.1 shall be charged the out-of-State tuition 10 rate: provided, that the out-of-State tuition shall be forgiven to the extent that the 11 out-of-State tuition rate exceeds any amounts payable to the institution or the service 12 member by the service member's employer by reason of enrollment pursuant to such 13 admission while the member is abiding in this State incident to active military duty, 14 plus the amount that represents the percentage of the out-of-State tuition rate paid to 15 the institution or the service member by the service member's employer multiplied by 16 the in-State tuition rate and then subtracted from the in-State tuition rate. Any 17 member of the armed services who does not qualify for any payment by the 18 member's employer shall be eligible to be charged the in-State tuition rate and shall 19 pay the full amount of the in-State tuition rate. in-State tuition rate for enrollments 20 while the member of the armed services is abiding in this State incident to active 21 military duty in this State."

Section 2. This act becomes effective August 1, 1999.
