NORTH CAROLINA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES UNIVERSITY BOARD OF GOVERNORS NOMINATING COMMITTEE

March 14, 2001 11:00 AM – 12:00 PM

The North Carolina House of Representatives, University Board of Governors Nominating Committee met on Wednesday, March 14, 2001, at 11:00 am in Room 415 of the Legislative Office Building.

The following members were present: Representative Warren Oldham, Chair; Representative Boyd-McIntyre, Vice-Chair; Representatives Allen, Barbee, Barnhart, Bonner, Crawford, Gray, Gulley, Haire, Hensley, Holmes, Justus, McComas, McLawhorn, McMahan and Sherrill.

Chairman Oldham called the meeting to order. Introductions of members, staff, committee assistant, pages, and House sergeant at arms were made.

The purpose of this meeting was to consider House Resolution 542, to approve The University of North Carolina Board of Governors nomination and questionnaire forms, and to discuss the possible use of a voting machine in the upcoming House election. Kory Goldsmith, Research Staff, gave an overview of HR542, which establishes the procedures for the House nomination and election of nine members to The University of North Carolina Board of Governors.

With no opposition to the procedures outlined in HR542, a motion was made by Representative Bonner and carried by the Committee to give the Resolution a favorable report. A motion was made by Representative Gray and carried by the Committee to approve the House nomination form as presented. A motion was also made by Representative Haire and carried by the Committee to accept the House questionnaire as written. House Resolution 542, the House nomination form, and the House questionnaire are attached and made a part of these minutes.

The Chairman introduced Mr. Root Edmonson from the North Carolina State Bar. Mr. Edmonson introduced the electronic (scantron) ballot to the Committee for consideration in the upcoming election.

A sample ballot is attached and made a part of these minutes.

With no other business to address, the meeting adjourned at 11:50 am. A Visitor Registration Sheet is also attached and made a part of these minutes.

A HOUSE RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH THE PROCEDURE FOR NOMINATING AND ELECTING MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

SECTION 1. The following procedures for nominating and electing nine members of the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina (hereinafter the "Board of Governors") are adopted:

I. COMMITTEE RESPONSIBILITIES.

- 1. It is the duty of the University Board of Governors Nominating Committee of the House of Representatives (hereinafter the "Committee") to conduct a process for nominating and electing persons for each opening in each category of seats on the Board of Governors to which the House of Representatives is to elect members.
- 2. The Committee shall receive nominations for election to the Board of Governors through March 29, 2001. Each Representative may nominate up to two persons. In order for a person to have standing as a nominee, that person must be formally nominated by a member of the House of Representatives. Only a written nomination that includes all the requested information, which is submitted on a form provided by the Chair of the Committee for that purpose, and that is received in the Office of the House Principal Clerk no later than 5:00 P.M. on March 29, 2001, shall constitute a formal nomination. Delivery by facsimile transmission shall constitute valid receipt if the communication or submission is in fact received in the Office of the House Principal Clerk no later than 5:00 P.M. on March 29, 2001. An individual cannot be a nominee or be nominated in more than one category. An individual is not eligible for nomination if he or she was nominated and not elected to the Board of Governors by the Senate during the 2001 Session.
- 3. A Representative may nominate persons only for the categories available for election by the House of Representatives. In the 2001 Session, the House of Representatives will elect:

1 (a) Six persons in the at-large category, for four-year terms; 2 (b) Two persons in the political minority party category, for four-year 3 terms: and 4 (c) One person in the minority race category, for the remainder of the 5 unexpired term that ends on June 30, 2003. 6 4. On or after April 3, 2001, the Committee shall list all nominees by 7 category. The Committee shall screen the nominees as to their qualifications, 8 experience, opinions, and statutory suitability. The Committee may screen nominees by 9 interviewing, or by soliciting written information, or by both means. On completion of the screening process, the Committee shall conduct a vote to ensure that the slate of 10 11 legally qualified candidates lists no more than twice the number of candidates for the 12 total seats open in each category. 5. Each nominee shall confirm his or her willingness to serve if elected. Any 13 14 nominee may withdraw without the approval of the sponsor. II. ELECTIONS IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. 15 1. A ballot shall be prepared under the supervision of the Chair of the 16 Committee for the use of the House of Representatives. The ballot shall include no more 17 than twice the number of legally qualified candidates for the total seats open in each 18 19 category. 20 2. The names of the nominees shall be arranged on the ballot (a) by category 21 and (b) within each category by alphabetical order. 22 3. The House of Representatives shall hold its election no later than the beginning of the daily session on April 5, 2001. Before the voting begins, the Speaker of 23 the House shall explain the voting rules, which are: 24 No nomination shall be received from the floor. 25 (a) In order to be elected, a nominee must receive the votes of a majority 26 (b) of all members present and voting in the nominee's category. 27 (c) Each member present and voting shall vote for as many nominees as 28 there are positions to be filled in each category, and any ballot not so 29 marked shall be deemed void as to that category. 30 31 When fewer than one nominee in the minority race category, two (d) nominees in the political minority party category, or six nominees in 32 the at-large category receive the votes of a majority of all members 33 34 present and voting for positions in those categories, a runoff to fill the 35 open position or positions shall be conducted among the nominees who were not elected but who received the highest number of votes 36 cast in each category; and the number of nominees eligible to be voted 37 on in the runoff shall be twice the number of positions to be filled. 38 If there is a tie for the last position between two nominees who are 39 (e) eligible for the next runoff, both nominees shall be included in the next 40 runoff balloting, even though there would be more than two nominees 41 per available position. 42 When more than one nominee in the minority race category, two 43 (f)

nominees in the political minority party category, or six nominees in

the at-large category receive the votes of a majority of all members present and voting for positions in those categories, then the one nominee in the minority race category, two nominees in the political minority party category, or the six nominees in the at-large category receiving the highest number of votes in that category shall be deemed to have been elected.

- 4. The members of the House of Representatives shall proceed to mark their ballots for the following:
 - Six persons in the at-large category, for four-year terms; (a)
 - (b) Two persons in the political minority party category, for four-year terms; and
 - One person in the minority race category, for the remainder of the (c) unexpired term that ends on June 30, 2003.

Every ballot shall be signed by the member of the House of Representatives casting it, and no unsigned ballots shall be counted.

- 5. The Chair of the Committee is responsible for canvassing the vote and declaring the results and may designate members of the Committee to assist. All ballots shall be retained by the Principal Clerk as part of the permanent records of the House of Representatives and shall be open for immediate public inspection.
- 6. When the Chair of the Committee has determined that the House of Representatives has elected two members from the political minority party category and six members from the at-large category for terms of four years, and one member from the minority race category for the remainder of the unexpired term, the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall declare those nine persons to have been elected to the Board of Governors by the House of Representatives to the indicated positions and for the indicated terms.
- 7. The results of the election in the House of Representatives shall then be sent by Special Messenger to the Senate.

III. NOTIFICATION OF ELECTION RESULTS.

When the election process is complete, the Chair of the Committee shall notify the Secretary of the Board of Governors of the names of the persons elected by the House of Representatives and the category and term for which each person was elected.

SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption.

SUMMARY: House Resolution 542 establishes the procedures for the House nomination and election of nine members to The University of North Carolina Board of Governors. The resolution is effective upon adoption.

The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina has thirty-two **CURRENT LAW:** elected members serving staggered four-year terms. During each odd-numbered year, the General Assembly elects sixteen individuals to the Board of Governors - eight by the House and eight by the Senate. Each chamber separately prepares a resolution governing its nomination and election procedure. The chambers alternate electing members from among four categories: at-large, racial minority, political minority party and female.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Resolution 542 provides that the House will elect 9 members to the Board of Governors. There are 6 seats in the at-large category; 2 seats in the political minority party category and 1 seat in the minority race category to fill a vacant position with a term that ends on June 30, 2003.

If adopted, House Resolution 542 provides the following nomination and election procedure:

- 1. The House University Board of Governors Nominating Committee ("Committee") is responsible for receiving and screening the proposed Board of Governors nominations.
- 2. The nomination process closes at 5 p.m. on March 29, 2001. Only nominations submitted on a form provided by the Committee chair and received by the deadline in the Office of the House Principal Clerk shall be eligible for consideration. Nominations may be received via facsimile transmission. The nomination form requires that candidates provide a resume and answers to several questions. All these documents will be public records.
- 3. Each representative may nominate up to 2 individuals. Individuals who were nominated but not elected to the Board of Governors by the Senate during the 2001 Session are not eligible for nomination in the House.
- 4. On or after Tuesday, April 3, 2001, the Committee will screen the nominees as to their qualifications, experience, opinions, and statutory suitability. No member of the General Assembly, no officer or employee of a constituent institution, and no spouse of any of those persons is eligible to serve. The Committee will vote on the nominees. The final slate of candidates will include no more than twice the number of candidates in each category as there are seats to fill in each category.
- 5. The House will hold its election no later than the beginning of the daily session on **Thursday**, April 5, 2001. No floor nominations will be accepted. The ballot will list the nominees alphabetically within each category. Each member shall vote for as many nominees as there are positions to be filled in a category or the ballot will be deemed void as to that category.

- 6. In order to be elected, a candidate must receive the votes of a majority of the Representatives present and voting. In order to be counted, a ballot must be signed by the Representative casting it.
- 7. The chair of the Committee is responsible for canvassing the ballots and may designate members of the Committee to assist him. After the ballots have been counted, the chair will declare the results. All ballots are retained by the House Principal Clerk's Office and are public documents open to public inspection.
- 8. After the House finishes the election, the chair will forward the results to the Secretary of the Board of Governors.


QUESTIONS TO THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS NOMINEES

Answers should be succinct and limited to no more than one typed page per question. The completed nomination form, the nominee's vitae, and the nominee's responses are all due in the Office of the House Principal Clerk no later than 5:00 pm, Thursday, March 29, 2001.

- 1. The UNC system anticipates an increase in enrollment of 48,000 students over the next 10 years. What policy initiatives would you recommend to provide for these students?
- 2. What do you see as your role as an individual member of the Board of Governors? What special abilities or characteristics can you bring to the Board of Governors?
- 3. What do you think are some of the major issues facing the University system?
 - a. How would you propose to address those issues given current budgetary constraints?
 - b. What policy initiatives would you propose to address those issues?
- 4. The law provides that "all members [of the Board of Governors] shall be deemed members-at-large, charged with the responsibility of serving the best interests of the whole State." Please discuss how you think this obligation relates to the unique missions of each of the 16 constituent universities.



The North Carolina House of Representatives, University Board of Governors Nominating Committee met on Tuesday, April 3, 2001, at 5:30 pm in Room 415 of the Legislative Office Building.

The following members were present: Representative Warren Oldham, Chair; Representatives Allen, Barnhart, Bonner, Crawford, Goodwin, Gray, Gulley, Haire, Hensley, Holmes, Justus, McComas, McLawhorn, McMahan and Sherrill. Ex-Officio Member Joe Hackney and Research Staff, Kory Goldsmith and Sara Kamprath were also present.

Chairman Oldham called the meeting to order and introduced the House sergeant at arms.

The purpose of this meeting was to vote for the nominees that will appear on the final ballot as the House of Representatives nominees for the UNC Board of Governors.

Kory Goldsmith, Research Staff, gave an overview of the results of each nominee's statutory disability (based solely upon the information provided in the nominee's application). The final review is attached and made a part of these minutes.

Chairman Oldham gave the final voting instructions and stressed the importance of voting for the correct number of nominees for each category. The final slate of nominees should include no more than twice the number of nominees in each category as there are seats to fill in each category. The categories were At-Large (6 seats, 12 possible nominees); Political Minority Party (2 seats, 4 possible nominees) and Unexpired Minority Race (1 seat, 2 possible nominees). Chairman Oldham also noted that one nominee, Mr. Jake H. Froelick, Jr., withdrew his application. Mr. Froelick was sponsored by Representative Maggie Jeffus.
