SUMMARY: Senate Bill 565 would create an exception to the Umstead Act that would allow private companies that have loaned or donated instructional equipment to the community college to use community college facilities to demonstrate that equipment to potential customers. The use of the college facilities would be in accordance with policies adopted by the board of trustees of the college.

The Proposed Committee Substitute adds Section 3 which would require the State Board of Community Colleges to report annually to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on the use of community college facilities by private businesses.

CURRENT LAW: As a general rule, G.S. 66-58 (the Umstead Act) prohibits State agencies from competing with private businesses in certain commercial activities. However, there are a number of exceptions that have been made including allowing a community college to permit the use of its personnel or facilities in support of or by a private business enterprise located on a community college campus or in its service area for specific services in support of economic development. Those specific services are small business incubators, product testing services, and videoconferencing services provided to the public for occasional use.

BILL ANALYSIS: Section 1 of Senate Bill 565 would authorize a community college to permit the use of its facilities by private business enterprises that have loaned or donated instructional equipment to the college. The private business enterprises would be able to use the facilities to demonstrate the loaned or donated instructional equipment to its potential customers. The board of trustees would be required to adopt policies on the use of the facilities.

Section 2 of Senate Bill 565 would make conforming changes to the statute pertaining to the powers and duties of the local boards of trustees.

Section 3 would require the State Board of Community Colleges to report to Ed Oversight on the use of community college facilities by private businesses.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would become effective when it became law.

BACKGROUND: Private companies loan or donate equipment to community colleges for training and educational uses. There are situations where the companies would like to use the community college facilities to demonstrate the equipment to their potential customers.

SUMMARY: House Bill 677 would authorize the Treasurer to designate a person to represent the Treasurer on the State Board of Community Colleges.

CURRENT LAW: The State Board of Community Colleges consists of 21 members:

- The Lieutenant Governor (or a person designated by the Lieutenant Governor)
- The Treasurer
- 10 members appointed by the Governor (4 from the State at large and 1 members from each of the 6 Trustee Association Regions)
- 8 members elected by the General Assembly
- The President of the North Carolina Comprehensive Community College Student Government Association (does not have a vote)

No member of the General Assembly, no officer or employee of the State, and no officer or employee of an institution under the jurisdiction under the jurisdiction of the State Board are eligible to serve on the State Board and no spouse of any of these persons are eligible to serve on the State Board. Moreover, no person who within the prior five years has been an employee of the Community Colleges System Office is eligible to serve on the Board.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 677 would allow the Treasurer to designate a person to represent the Treasurer on the State Board of Community Colleges. The bill would give the same authority to the Treasurer to appoint a designee as the Lieutenant Governor currently has the authority to do.

SUMMARY: House Bill would authorize the State Board of Community Colleges to set nonacademic criteria for admissions into certain programs.

CURRENT LAW: In G.S. 115D-1, the General Assembly states that the major purpose of each and every NC community college is the "offering of vocational and technical education and training, and of basic, high school level, academic education needed in order to profit from vocational and technical education". The State Board of Community Colleges has the authority to "adopt and execute such policies, regulations and standards concerning the establishment, administration, and operation of institutions as the State Board may deem necessary to insure the quality of educational programs, to promote the systematic meeting of educational needs of the State". (G.S. 115D-5(a)). The trustees of each community college in G.S. 115D-20(4) are charged with applying the standards and requirements for admissions and graduation of students and other standards established by the State Board.

- 23 NCAC 2C.0301(a) provides that each college must maintain an open door admission policy to all applicants who are high school graduates or who are at least 18 years of age.
- 23 NCAC 2C.0301(b) provides that boards of trustees may adopt policies regulating admission and graduation of students in courses required by the North Carolina Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission and the North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 833 would allow the State Board of Community Colleges to adopt standards for admission that include both academic and nonacademic criteria for any curriculum program or continuing education program that traditionally leads into an occupation or practice that requires licensure or certification under State law.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would become effective July 1, 2005.

BACKGROUND: Programs such as nursing often have criminal background check required by the State agency that grants and regulates the licenses. In addition, many clinical sites such as hospitals require background checks of all persons that work or train at the sites, including students. It is quite possible that person who is in these types of program may fail the required background check after having completed a substantial part of the coursework and then be ineligible for training at the site or for a license.



SUMMARY: This bill would establish the Customized Industry Training Program (CIT) within the Community College System, and appropriate funds for the Program. The State Board of Community Colleges would adopt rules and policies to implement the Program and would report annually to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on specific aspects of the CIT Program.

The act would become effective when it becomes law.

The PCS adds the September 1 reporting date, and makes technical changes.

A new section would be added to the Community College statute to establish the North Carolina Customized Industry Training (CIT) Program, and the State Board would have to adopt rules and policies to implement the Program. One purpose of the Program would be to help keep existing business and industry in the State. CIT would offer programs and training services to assist existing business and industry to remain profitable and productive. The President of the North Carolina Community College System must determine that, based on specified criteria, a business or industry would qualify to receive assistance under the CIT Program. The business or industry must:

- make an appreciable capital investment;
- deploy new technology;
- enhance the skills of the workers through the CIT assistance; and
- increase measurably the average wage of the workers receiving the training.

The State Board would report September 1 every year to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee on:

- the amount of funds a company received under the CIT Program;
- the amount of funds per trainee received by both the company and the community college delivering the training;
- the number of trainees trained by the company and by the community college; and
- the number of years that the company has been funded.

This reporting requirement is very similar to the statutory reporting requirement for the New and Expanding Industry Training (NEIT) Program.

This new CIT Program is separate from and complementary to the New and Expanding Industry (NEIT) Program and the Focused Industrial Training (FIT) Program that already exist.

BACKGROUND: The New and Expanding Industry (NEIT) Program assists companies that create 2 or more full-time production jobs. Eligible industry categories include manufacturing, biotechnology, regional or national warehousing and distribution centers, customer services, and others. Eligible trainees are full-time production workers involved in direct production of goods and services. All training is customized to meet specific company needs.

The Focused Industrial Training (FIT) Program provides dedicated resources that are essential to meet the retraining needs resulting from technological or process advances within existing companies. It is designed to provide customized training assistance, focused upon skills required for both highly skilled and semi-skilled occupations.



SUMMARY: The PCS for House Bill 576 would allow Community College Capital Improvement Projects to be exempted from the public advertising requirements for design services where the expenditure of public funds is less that \$100,000. The PCS would also allow an exemption from the public advertising requirements for design services for a community college capital improvement project that uses less than \$300,000 of public funds in certain situations.

For the procurement of design services such as architectural, engineering, and **CURRENT LAW:** surveying services. North Carolina law allows agencies to advertise their requirements without regard to fees and then negotiate the price with the best qualified company. State Capital Improvement Projects under the State Building Commission that are estimated to cost less than \$100,000 of public funds are exempted from the public advertising requirements. However, all community college capital improvement projects are subject to the advertising requirements regardless of the cost of the project. Capital improvement projects of the University of North Carolina are also exempt from the announcement requirement for projects less than \$300,000 if the design services are to be rendered under an open-end design agreement that has been publicly announced and complies with the procedures adopted by the University and approved by the State Building Commission.

BILL ANALYSIS: The PCS would bring Community College Capital Improvement Projects under the same exemption from the public advertising requirements for design services that is allowed for State Capital Improvement Projects for projects with estimated public expenditures of less than \$100,000. The PCS would also allow an exemption from the advertising requirements for a community college capital improvement project that is estimated to cost less than \$300,000 if the following criteria are met:

- 1. the design services to rendered are under an open-end design agreement;
- 2. the open-end design agreement has been publicly announced; and
- 3. the open-end design agreement complies with policies and procedures adopted by the State Board of Community Colleges.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would become effective when it becomes law.

The major purpose of each and every institution operating under the provisions of this Chapter shall be and shall continue to be the offering of vocational and technical education and training, and of basic, high school level, academic education needed in order to profit from vocational and technical education, for students who are high school graduates or who are beyond the compulsory age limit of the public school system and who have left the public schools, provided, juveniles of any age committed to the Department of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention by a court of competent jurisdiction may, if approved by the director of the youth development center to which they are assigned, take courses offered by institutions of the system if they are otherwise qualified for admission.

The North Carolina Community College System is designated as the primary lead agency for delivering workforce development training, literacy, and adult education programs in the State."
