Analysis of: First Edition Committee Counsel

SUMMARY: House Bill 83 would provide that students who receive full scholarships from certain entities and are thereby considered residents of the State for all purposes (including tuition) would only be considered residents of the State for all purposes if the scholarships are based on academic merit.

CURRENT LAW: G.S. 116-143.6 allows the Board of Trustees of a constituent institution of The University of North Carolina, if it elects to do so, to consider as residents of North Carolina all persons who (1) receive full scholarships to the institution from entities recognized by the institution and (2) attend the institution as undergraduate students. These persons must be considered residents of North Carolina for all purposes by The University of North Carolina and must be given in-State tuition status.

The statute specifies that this law must not be applied in any manner that violates federal law and must be administered by the electing constituent institution so that it has no fiscal impact. In administering the statute, the electing constituent institution must maintain at least the current number of North Carolina residents admitted to that constituent institution.

Definitions. — "Full scholarship" means a grant that meets the full cost for a student to attend the constituent institution for an academic year. "Full cost" means an amount calculated by the constituent institution that is no less than the sum of tuition, required fees, and on-campus room and board.

BILL ANALYSIS: House Bill 83 would restrict the granting of resident status for all purposes, including in-State tuition, to students who receive full scholarships based on academic merit.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill would become effective when it becomes law and would not affect the receipt of full scholarships for the 2008-2009 and 2009-2010 academic years by persons who received the scholarships prior to the effective date of the bill.

SUMMARY: The Proposed Committee Substitute (PCS) for House Bill 256 would require that certain undergraduate students who receive full scholarships to a UNC constituent institution shall count as residents of North Carolina for tuition purposes only. The PCS clarifies that these undergraduate students would count as out-of-state students for any policy limiting out-of-state undergraduate enrollment that is adopted by the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina. The PCS also amends the long title of the bill.

CURRENT LAW: The General Assembly has delegated to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina (Board of Governors) the authority to set enrollment levels for the constituent institutions. The Board of Governors adopted Policy 700.1.3 Out-of-State Undergraduate Enrollment that required each constituent institution, except the North Carolina School of the Arts, to take action to limit the proportion of out-of-state freshmen to not more than 18 percent of the entering freshman class.

In 2005, the General Assembly enacted into law G.S. 116-143.6 which allows a board of trustees of a UNC constituent institution to consider as North Carolina residents all persons who receive full scholarships from certain recognized entities and attend the institution as undergraduates. These persons are considered residents of North Carolina for all purposes by The University of North Carolina.

BILL ANALYSIS: The Proposed Committee Substitute for House Bill 256 would require that undergraduate students who currently receive a full scholarship from entities recognized by one of the UNC constituent institutions, according to the provisions of G.S. 116-143.6, will continue to be considered as North Carolina residents for tuition purposes. Those undergraduates would no longer be considered as North Carolina residents but shall be counted as out-of-state students for any policy adopted by the UNC Board of Governors that limits out-of-state undergraduate enrollment.

The Proposed Committee Substitute also makes clarifying and technical changes.

EFFECTIVE DATE: The bill is effective when it becomes law.
