#### **Minutes**

April 13, 2011

The House Committee on Ethics met on Wednesday, April 13, 2011 at 4:10 pm in Room 425 of the Legislative Office Building. The following members were present: Chairperson Howard; and Representatives Current, Avila, Current, Farmer-Butterfield, Ross and Setzer. Also present were Sergeant-at-Arms Bill Bass and Billy Jones. SUMMARY: House Bill 436 would require members of sanitary districts to file a statement of economic interest (SEI) with the clerk of superior. The SEI is to be filed in accordance with the provisions of Article 2 of Chapter 138A on a form prescribed by the State Ethics Commission.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** House Bill 436 becomes effective July 1, 2011.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Sanitary Districts

Sanitary Districts are created by the Commission for Public Health for the purpose of preserving and promoting the public health and welfare. No municipality may be included in a sanitary district except at the request of the governing board of the city. A sanitary district may be incorporated upon the petition of 51% of the resident freeholders or 51% of the freeholders to the county board of commissioners of the county in which all or the largest portion of the land in the proposed district is located.

The sanitary district board is composed of 3 to 5 members and is appointed by the county board of commissioners until the next regular election for municipal officers occurring more than 90 days after appointment. The board members are then elected. If the General Assembly incorporates a town that includes 50% or more of the sanitary district, the city council may serve as the sanitary district board with the approval by resolution of the sanitary district board.

Sanitary district boards have broad powers, including the power to levy taxes, compel connection to water and sewer lines, establish fire departments, establish zoning, and assess and condemn property.

Board members may be removed for malfeasance or nonfeasance upon a petition to the county board of commissioners by 25% or more of the voters in a district for an election on the questions of removal.

Ethics and Statements of Economic Interest

Pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 138A, a statement of economic interest must be filed no later April 15 of every year and shall be current as of the last day of the year preceding the date the statement of economic interest is due.

G.S. 160A-86 requires certain governing boards of local governments, including sanitary district boards, to adopt a resolution or policy containing a code of ethics. In addition, G.S. 160A-87 requires members of these governing boards to receive a minimum of two hours of ethics education within 12 months after initial election or appointment and thereafter within 12 months of every subsequent election.
