*For the purposes of determining adoption assistance eligibility, "special needs" are defined as the following:

- 1. Six years of age or older
- 2. Two years of age or older and a member of minority race or ethnic group
- 3. A member of a sibling group of three or more children who are placed together to be adopted
- 4. A member of a sibling group of two children who are placed together to be adopted and the sibling meets at least one of the other criteria for special needs
- 5. A medically diagnosed disability
- 6. Diagnosis of a psychiatric condition
- 7. Diagnosis of a behavioral or emotional disorder
- 8. Diagnosis of Intellectual Disability
- 9. Meeting the medical and disability requirements of SSI
- 10. Documented to be at risk of any of the above due to prenatal exposure to toxins, a history of abuse or serious neglect, and genetic history
