
Service Definition

 Lactation evaluation and breastfeeding counseling for children through two years of age when there is a chronic, episodic, or acute condition for which lactation therapy is a critical component of medical management provided by International Board Certified Lactation Consultants, Physicians and Physician Extenders.

Breastfeeding as Public Health

- Important Public Health Concepts:
 - Breastfeeding is a short term health care intervention that can benefit both mother and child immediately and for the duration of their lives
 - Breastfeeding, unlike other health care practices, is extremely vulnerable to disruption if problems are not addressed rapidly and appropriately

# of Women on Medicaid initiating breastfeeding (Assuming 80% initiation goal is met)	48,960
Estimated Number of women who need lactation support visit (Estimated at 75%)	36,720
Estimated number of lactation support visits (1.3 visits)	47,736
Estimate cost of visits (assuming \$100/visit)	\$4.77 Million
