RE: Report of Board Activities for Year Ended March 31, 2022

As required by Chapter 93B of the North Carolina General Statutes, the North Carolina State Board of Certified Public Accountant Examiners submits the following report of the Board's activities for the year ended March 31, 2022:

1) ADDRESS OF THE BOARD

1a) LICENSEES SUPERVISED BY THE BOARD

The number of licensees supervised by the Board as of March 31, 2022, was 22,363.

2) EXAMINATION APPLICATIONS RECEIVED

The Board received 2,485 applications (711 initial and 1,774 re-exam) for the Uniform CPA Examination (Exam) sections administered between April 1, 2021, and March 31, 2022.

3) EXAMINATION APPLICATIONS DENIED

The Board denied five (5) applications for the Exam sections administered between April 1, 2021, and March 31, 2022. The Board denied these applications for failure to meet the requirements for examination established by North Carolina General Statute 93-12 and Title 21, Chapter 08F of the North Carolina Administrative Code.

4) EXAMINATION APPLICANTS TAKING THE EXAM

Between April 1, 2021, and March 31, 2022, the Board approved 1,447 applicants to take the Exam, and candidates took 3,228 sections of the examination.

5) INITIAL LICENSES ISSUED

During the fiscal year, the Board issued 502 original CPA licenses.

5a) EXAMINATION APPLICANTS FAILING THE EXAMINATION

Between April 1, 2021, and March 31, 2022, 866 individuals failed at least one of the four Exam sections.

6) RECIPROCAL LICENSES APPLIED FOR

During the fiscal year, the Board received 340 applications for licensure by reciprocity.

7) RECIPROCAL LICENSES ISSUED

During the fiscal year, the Board issued 340 reciprocal CPA licenses.

7a) COMPLAINTS

During the fiscal year, the Board received 256 complaints against licensees and non-CPAs.

7b) DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

During the fiscal year, the Board took disciplinary or other action against 42 licensees and non-CPAs. The Board issued 39 Consent Orders and three (3) Board Orders.

8) LICENSES SUSPENDED OR REVOKED

During the fiscal year, the Board suspended zero (0) licenses. The Board revoked three (3) licenses during the fiscal year.

9) LICENSES TERMINATED

During the fiscal year, the Board terminated zero (0) CPA licenses for reasons other than failure to pay the required renewal fee.

9a) LICENSE APPLICANTS

During the fiscal year, 842 individuals applied for a North Carolina CPA license (502 original and 340 reciprocal), and 842 individuals were granted a North Carolina CPA license.

9b) APPLICANTS WITH A CONVICTION RECORD

During the fiscal year, 883 applicants had a conviction record; of that number, the Board granted 883 licenses. Zero (0) applicants were denied a license because of a conviction.

9c) APPLICANTS WITH MILITARY TRAINING

For the year ended March 31, 2022, the Board did not separately identify applicants with military training. However, the Board's licensure processes allow any holder of a CPA license from any other state or jurisdiction to obtain reciprocal licensure in NC easily. In addition, a temporary practice permit is provided to the applicant at the time of application to allow the applicant to begin use of the CPA title immediately and until such time that the Board issues the reciprocal license.

9d) APPLICANTS WHO ARE MILITARY SPOUSES

For the year ended March 31, 2022, the Board did not separately identify applicants who are military spouses in its database. However, the Board's licensure processes allow any holder of a CPA license from any other state or jurisdiction to obtain reciprocal CPA licensure in NC easily. In addition, a temporary practice permit is provided to the applicant at the time of application to allow the applicant to use the CPA title immediately and until the Board issues the reciprocal license.

10) ANTICIPATED AMENDMENTS TO BOARD STATUTES

The Board does not anticipate any amendments to Board statutes.

11) ANTICIPATED CHANGES OR ADOPTIONS TO BOARD RULES

The Board anticipates amending the Board rules for clarification and to address changes necessitated by the CPA Evolution process.
