Student data collection changed to meet U.S. Department of Education requirements

To satisfy the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requirement that the immigrant headcount be determined in the year in which the grant is going to be administered, the immigrant headcount was changed from February to October. All students who are enrolled in a public school by October 1st who meet the following definition are included in the headcount.

US Department of Education allocates a portion of funding to states based on the state's share of immigrant children and youth. The term "immigrant children and youth" is defined in Title III, Section 3201(5) as individuals who:

- 1. are aged 3 through 21;
- 2. were not born in any state; and
- 3. have not been attending one or more schools in any one or more States for more than 3 full academic years.

The field "country of birth" is now a required field in the PowerSchool enrollment process. A data quality review discovered that when the field was optional, only 60 percent of Public School Units provided this information for students. By making the field mandatory as part of the enrollment process, DPI is ensuring that we have reliable and consistent data for the immigrant headcount. The immigrant headcount data is used by DPI's Financial and Business Services group to award funds under PRC 111 – Title III – Language Acquisition – Significant Increase.

•	Country of Birth Code - The unique two-digit International Organization for Standardization (ISO) code for the country in which a person is born.
