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How We Got Here

Why a Common Numbering System?

- The number of students enrolling at a UNC institution with transfer credit will continue to increase, and their success is critical to the overall success of the system
- Transfer comes in many forms; existing statewide policies, particularly the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA), focus on transfers between NCCCS and UNC
- Credit loss is more prevalent for students who transfer between UNC institutions, since there are fewer rules governing transferability.
- Prior NC Transfer Policies were primarily focused on NCCCS to UNC for students who have earned the AA/AS

Credit loss can lead to stop-out or extended time to degree

Policy Recommendation from TAC

- The UNC-NCCCS Transfer Advisory Committee (TAC), which is charged with oversight of the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) and making recommendations leading to optimal transfer, included the following in their 2020 annual report:
- “TAC continues to promote ongoing support of the following efforts: Technological and operational solutions that create greater continuity, clarity, accessibility, and transparency for advising and the processing of transfer students and informing course, program, and institution selection (e.g., **a common course-numbering or common course equivalency system**, the electronic transfer of transcripts, etc.) among the NCCCS and UNC System institutions.”

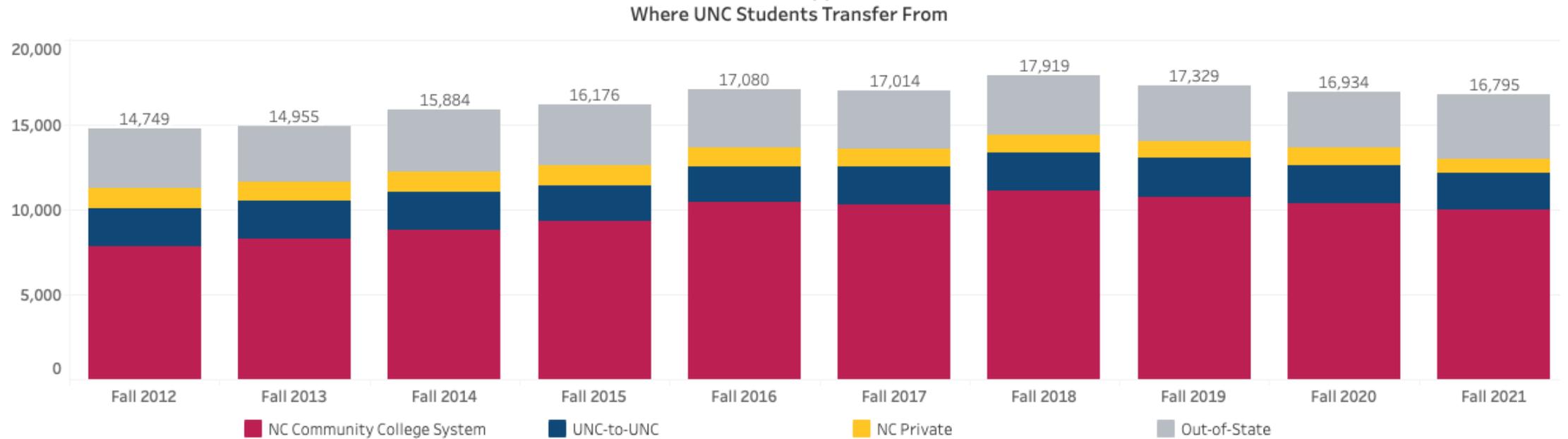
National Policy Recommendations

Education Commission of the States (ECS) identified four statewide policies intended to enhance the seamless transfer of college credits:

Policies	North Carolina	
Transferable Core of Lower-Division Courses		Universal General Education Transfer Component (UGETC): a set of general education courses that are transferable for lower-division credit at UNC universities with a grade of C or higher.
Guaranteed Transfer of Associate Degree		Comprehensive Articulation Agreement (CAA) guarantees transfer of AA/AS earned at NCCCS to UNC (and junior standing).
Reverse Transfer		Transfer students who do not complete an AA/AS <i>prior</i> to transferring but earn sufficient credit to qualify for an AA/AS <i>after</i> transferring receive an award.
Common Course Numbering/Coding		A uniform numbering convention used at all public postsecondary institutions for lower-division courses.

17 states have adopted some form of common numbering

UNC Board of Governors Action

- UNC Policy 400.1.5, Policy on Fostering Undergraduate Student Success, amended 12/17/2020

The UNC System Office shall, in consultation with faculty and staff from the constituent institutions, establish and maintain a common course numbering system for undergraduate lower division courses, which shall be mapped to the unique course numbers used at each respective institution of higher education. The president shall approve regulations to describe and implement this common undergraduate course numbering system, which shall be established and operational by the 2022-23 academic year.

1600 Courses



A unique number at the UNC System level...

UNC System institutions have aligned over 1600 course descriptions and syllabi across 34 disciplines and almost 160 unique CNS course titles to a number that maps to the equivalent courses at all UNC System institutions who offer the course.

Over 500 faculty and staff

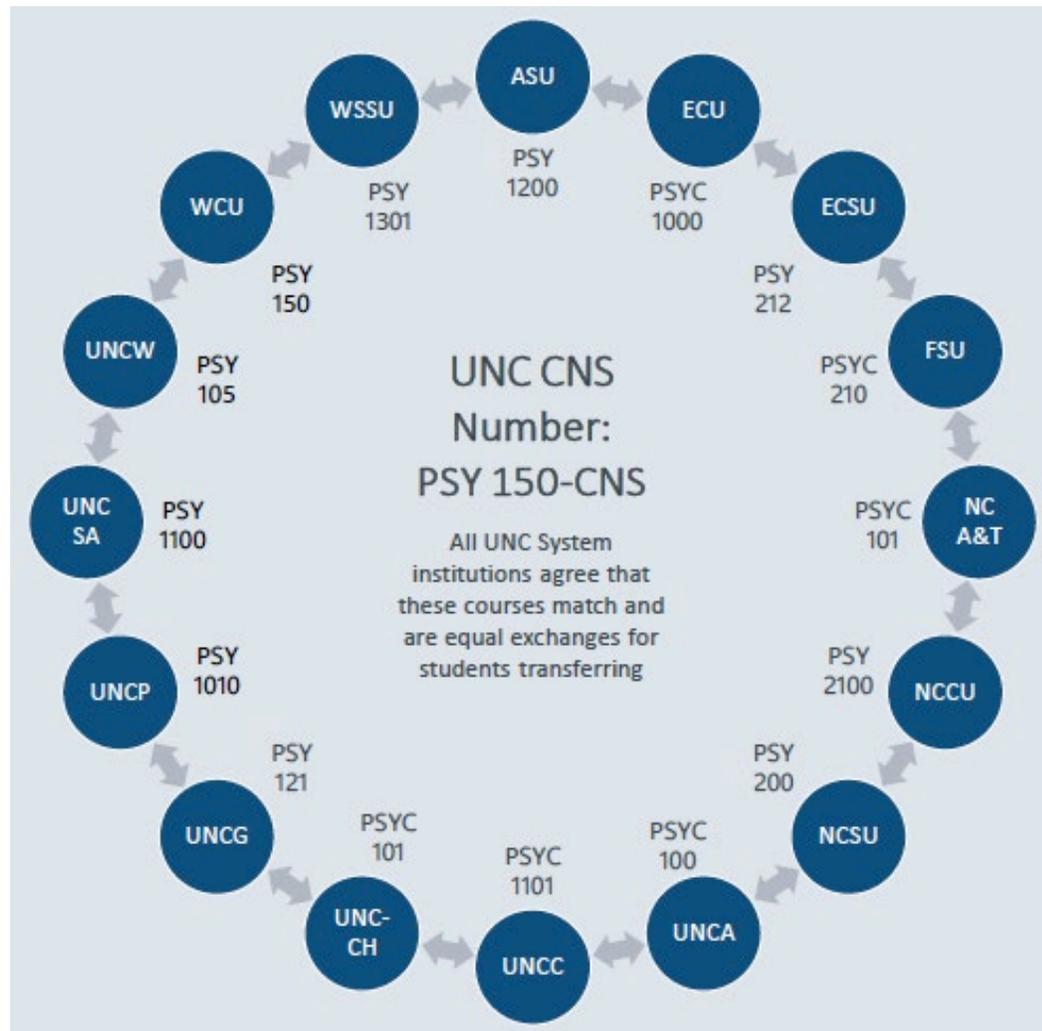

Students, faculty, and advisors will easily search course equivalencies between UNC System institutions...

The UNC CNS is a planned, deliberately-aligned, searchable database through which students, advisors, registrars, and others can identify transferable courses to support degree and graduation planning for student transfers between UNC System institutions.

How does the UNC CNS Work?



UNC CNS courses have a unique three-letter prefix and three-digit course number that represents the direct course equivalency at any UNC institution that offers the course.

Each UNC institution retains its original course catalog, but uses the UNC CNS to indicate system-wide commonality



How were Courses Selected?

- Looked first at the most often transferred courses between the North Carolina Community Colleges and UNC System institutions
- Began with courses in the NCCCS Common Catalog that the TAC has identified as Universal General Education Transfer Courses (UGETC) and other General Education Courses – ultimately identified roughly 150 courses from this set as the initial list
- Brought faculty and academic leadership from the 16 UNC System institutions together to determine course equivalencies and identify additional UNC CNS Courses

UNC CNS Course Equivalencies by Institution

Number of Possible UNC CNS Courses	189
Average Number of Course Equivalencies	114

Over 1,800 course equivalencies are represented across the 189 UNC CNS Courses

These were identified through intense review and analysis by faculty and staff at the individual institutions and UNC System Office

- Review course content and structure between the UNC CNS and the NCCCS Common Course Catalog
- More granular alignment of course content should lead to transfer students better prepared for the next level of coursework
- Identify structure for ongoing review and coordination between different educational systems
- Need significant investment in data system technologies – seamless electronic movement of student transcripts and course history
