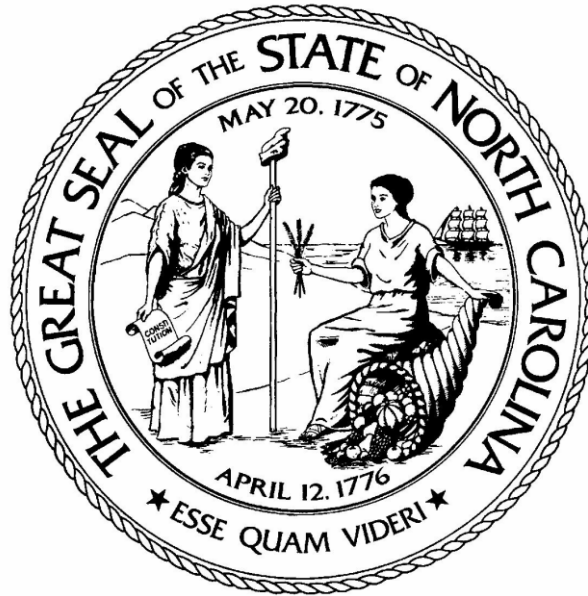

Each entry includes: the establishing legal authority; reporting requirements when applicable; scope of duties; additional studies assigned or referred; and, for legislative commissions and committees, the membership appointed to date along with their names, addresses and telephone numbers, and committee staff and their telephone numbers.

### **ABANDONED/DERELICT VESSELS**

Authority: SL2021-180 §15.1(b), SB 105.  
Report by: Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Agriculture and Natural and Economic Resources  
Report to: General Assembly  
Report due: 2022 Regular Session of the 2021 General Assembly upon its convening.  
Scope: Shall assess the problem of abandoned and derelict vessels in the waters of the State and upon the lands of the State and determine measures needed to facilitate the identification of owners or other responsible persons for abandoned or derelict vessels for the purpose of requiring those persons to take responsibility for their vessels and in cases where no responsible owner may be found, to provide the State with adequate authority and funding to expeditiously remove or otherwise dispose of the abandoned and derelict vessels. Shall also consider the efficacy and need for new or revised insurance requirements for private vessel owners and for enhancement to civil or criminal remedies with respect to owners of abandoned or derelict vessels.

### **ACCESS TO HEALTHCARE AND MEDICAID EXPANSION**

Authority: SL2021-180 §5.13, SB 105.  
Report by: Joint Legislative Committee on Access to Healthcare and Medicaid Expansion  
Report to: General Assembly  
Report due: The Committee may submit proposed legislation before the sine die adjournment of the 2021 GA by filing a copy of proposed legislation with the Pro Tem's Office and the Speaker's Office.  
Scope: The Committee shall study issues related to education in elementary and secondary schools, including but not limited to the following: requirements of the standard course of study, outcomes of the standard course study, opportunities for students to demonstrate competency at their own pace, funding and outcomes of current programs, any other issues deemed relevant.

### **ADVANCED COURSE AND CTE BONUSES EFFECTIVENESS**

Authority: SL2021-180 §7A.4(h), SB 105.  
Report by: State Board of Education Shall study the effect of the Advanced Course and CTE Bonus Program on teacher performance and retention.  
Report to: Shall report to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, and the Fiscal Research Division.  
Report due: By March 15 of each year bonuses are awarded.  
Scope: Shall study the effect of the program on teacher performance and retention.

### **ANTI-SPIKING CONTRIBUTION-BASED BENEFIT CAP**

Authority: SL2021-72 §4, SB 668; SL2022-70 §1(b).  
Report by: Anti-Pension-Spiking Contribution-Based Benefit Cap Working Group of the Department of State Treasurer and the N.C. School Boards Association.  
Report to: Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on General Government.

Report due: No later than December 15, 2022.  
Scope: Shall convene a working group to review the anti-pension-spiking contribution-based benefit cap established. The working group may produce findings and recommendations on the following issues: (1) Reducing the incidence of future litigation regarding the anti-pension-spiking contribution-based benefit cap; (2) Reducing the incidence of unfunded pension liabilities associated with compensation decisions; (3) Assessing the feasibility of using mediation, arbitration, or non-jury trials to settle disputes with local boards of education and other entities regarding the anti-pension-spiking contribution-based benefit cap; and (4) Any other issues the working group wishes to address.

### **COMMUNITY COLLEGE ECONOMIC IMPACTS**

Authority: SL2021-180 §6.1(a)-(d), SB 105.  
Report by: Community Colleges System Office, Central Piedmont Community College Center for Applied Research (CFAR), the NC Association of Community College Presidents, and the Belk Center.  
Report to: Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the Senate Appropriations Committee on Education/Higher Education, the House Appropriations Committee on Education, and the Fiscal Research Division.  
Report due: By April 15, 2022.  
Scope: Shall partner with the System Office, the North Carolina Association of Community College Presidents, and the Belk Center for Community College Leadership and Research at North Carolina State University (Belk Center) to provide for studies of the overall regional economic impacts of community colleges in the State. CFAR shall contract with Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI), an affiliate of the Strata Education Network, to conduct the studies required by this section. Shall evaluate labor dynamics within the State and the impact community colleges have on students and businesses within certain regions and the resulting return on investment (ROI) for taxpayers. EMSI shall also conduct an analysis of high-demand programs in regional areas of the State, such as nursing, teacher education, and information technology. EMSI shall evaluate the ROI and the success of those programs in improving career opportunities for students as well as their impact on the labor market. As part of its analysis, EMSI shall focus on potential areas for increased investment or targeted support by the State and recommendations for future growth.

Report due: Shall submit a preliminary report by March 15, 2022, and a final report by December 15, 2022.  
Scope: DPI to contract with a third-party entity to collect, analyze, and report data related to the overall impacts of COVID-19 on public school units, students, and families of the State, including the State's responsiveness to the COVID-19 pandemic, the transition to remote learning and return to in-person instruction, the systems in place for flexibility in education delivery, assessment of student performance, addressing issues of learning loss, teacher

effectiveness and supports, and implementation of best practices and improvements for any significant future challenges.

The Committee shall identify, with respect to each service identified as having an insufficient fee, the amount of the fee that was or could have been charged, the cost incurred by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services in performing the service, and, if applicable, the reason for not charging the fee or for the fee shortfall.

**DIRECT CARE WORKERS SERVING INDIVIDUALS IN THE INNOVATIONS WAIVER PROGRAM**

Authority: SL2021-180 §9D.15C, SB 105.  
Report by: Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Benefits.  
Report to: Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Medicaid and NC Health Choice  
Report due: No later than March 1, 2022, and annually thereafter for the next five years.  
Scope: Shall submit a report to the that contains all of the following information regarding direct care workers who serve Medicaid beneficiaries receiving services through the North Carolina Innovations waiver program: (1) Statewide data on the number of these licensed and non-licensed direct care workers by worker classification. (2) Identification of providers that employ these direct care workers. (3) The weekly average number of hours worked by individuals serving in these positions. (4) The average and range of wages paid to these workers. (5) The average length of employment of these workers by any one provider. (6) An assessment of whether the wages of licensed direct care workers, non-licensed direct care workers, or both need to be increased. If DHB determines that there is a need for an increase in wages, then DHB shall develop a plan, or update to a previously submitted plan as applicable, for such increase.

**DUAL ENROLLMENT/OPPORTUNITY**

Authority: SL2021-180 §7.85, SB 105; SL2022-6 §2.6.  
Report by: State Board of Education  
Report to: Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the Fiscal Research Division, and the Office of State Budget and Management.  
Report due: By July 15, 2022.  
Scope: Shall partner with a third-party entity to conduct a study examining the factors impacting all students' ability to complete high school courses leading to college credit, an associate degree, or a career-ready credential, including an examination of opportunity, resources, fees, and personnel. The study shall also include an examination of all dual enrollment courses offered as part of the Career and College Promise Program that satisfy basic high school graduation requirements to ensure that the content and skills taught in those courses is aligned to the content and skills outlined in the Standard Course of Study for the requisite courses that meet graduation requirements. The study shall identify if dual enrollment courses are or are not aligned with the Standard Course of Study and, if not aligned, what content or skills are not aligned.

### **EDUCATION SYSTEM FOR NORTH CAROLINA'S FUTURE**

Authority: Letter of December 16, 2021, pursuant to G.S. 120-19.6, House Rule 26(a).  
Report by: House Select Committee on an Education System for North Carolina's Future  
Report to: General Assembly  
Report due: May submit an interim report by May 1, 2022. Then submit a final report by December 17, 2022.  
Scope: The Committee shall study issues related to education in elementary and secondary schools, including but not limited to the following: requirements of the standard course of study, outcomes of the standard course study, opportunities for students to demonstrate competency at their own pace, funding and outcomes of current programs, any other issues deemed relevant.

### **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT NEEDS**

Authority: SL2021-117 §7, HB 366.  
Report by: Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management  
Report to: Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety, the Joint Legislative Emergency Management Oversight Committee, and the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee.  
Report due: No later than March 1, 2022.  
Scope: Shall study the needs of law enforcement, emergency medical and emergency management personnel, and firefighters to improve access to or within the interstate system of this State for the benefit of public safety. In conducting the study, the Division may consult with the Department of Transportation, the Office of State Fire Marshal of the Department of Insurance, the Office of Emergency Medical Services of the Department of Health and Human Services, and any other State or local government organizations the Division determines may be of assistance in the course of the study. In performing the study, the Division shall, at a minimum, take the following steps: (1) Consult with county fire marshal divisions, emergency management offices, and emergency medical service divisions to determine potential sites of interest for construction or improvement relevant to the study. (2) Establish criteria to prioritize sites of interest for either construction or improvement. (3) Review applicable federal and State laws, codes, standards, and studies relevant to the study. The specific matters for review include, but are not limited to, whether those rates and fees are (i) understandable, (ii) priced on usage, (iii) predictable for planning purposes, (iv) related to value received, (v) priced competitively with open market services, and (vi) readily adjustable to factor in unplanned events. (2) Focus on the internal service rates and fees charged by DIT for State agency internet service, Wide Area Network costs, and any other costs of information technology goods and services that the JLOCIT deems appropriate. (3) Review alternative ways to capture and recover the costs of information technology goods and services that DIT provides to State agencies. (4) Examine how replacement costs are accounted for and built into State agency operating budgets. (5) Review whether some State agencies should pay for information technology using the current or a similar rate system or if some should have information technology charges and costs funded differently.

This proposal shall clearly highlight the differences between the current administrative procedures and the proposed new procedures. (6) Evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of the current administrative procedures and the proposed new procedures. (7) Examine the applicable federal and State law, noting any due process implications. (8) Provide a plan for implementing the transfer of hearings. The plan shall address (i) anticipated workload changes, (ii) anticipated changes to staffing needs for any entity affected by the transfer, (iii) estimated one-time and annual costs to the Division or any other State agency resulting from the transfer, (iv) estimated cost-savings for the Division or any other State agency resulting from the transfer, (v) changes in revenue for the Division or any other State agency resulting from the transfer, (vi) legislative changes necessary to implement the plan, and (vii) an estimated time line for implementation, including steps required to facilitate the transfer. (9) Provide separate statements from the Division, the Attorney General, and the Office of Administrative Hearings indicating whether they are in favor of or opposed to implementing the transfer. (10) Explore any other issue deemed relevant.

Instructional requirements, including student monitoring, attendance and testing requirements, measures for completion of instructional days and hours requirements, synchronous instruction minimums, and measures of course credit accrual, progress toward graduation, and course completion. c. Personnel requirements, including professional development. d. Participation requirements, including student eligibility and agreements for participation from students and parents. e. Special education requirements. f. Term of years for approval for a virtual academy and criteria for initial approval and renewal. g. Distinctions in requirements for different types of public school units. h. A means for identifying students participating in virtual instruction that will allow assessment of that subgroup's performance and EVAAS scores for students receiving virtual instruction in a school that does not exclusively provide virtual instruction.
