A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO MODIFY PENALTIES AND DEFINITIONS FOR CERTAIN SEX OFFENSES  
AGAINST STUDENTS, TO INCREASE THE PENALTIES FOR THE FAILURE OF  
SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS TO REPORT CERTAIN MISCONDUCT TO THE STATE  
BOARD OF EDUCATION, AND TO REQUIRE PUBLIC SCHOOL UNITS TO SHOW  
STUDENTS IN GRADES SIX THROUGH TWELVE A VIDEO PRODUCED BY THE  
CENTER FOR SAFER SCHOOLS CONTAINING AGE-APPROPRIATE  
INFORMATION ABOUT SEXUAL ABUSE, AS RECOMMENDED BY THE  
DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

**PART I. MODIFY PENALTIES AND DEFINITIONS FOR CERTAIN SEX OFFENSES  
AGAINST STUDENTS**

**SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 14-27.32 reads as rewritten:

**"§ 14-27.32. Sexual activity with a student.**

(a) If a defendant, who is a teacher, school administrator, student teacher, school safety officer, or coach, at any age, or who is other school personnel, and who is at least four years older than the victim engages in vaginal intercourse or a sexual act with a victim who is a student, at any time during or after the time the defendant and victim were present together in the same school, but before the victim ceases to be a student, the defendant is guilty of a Class G felony, except when the defendant is lawfully married to the student. The term "same school" means a school at which the student is enrolled and the defendant is employed, assigned, or volunteers.

(b) A defendant who is school personnel, other than a teacher, school administrator, student teacher, school safety officer, or coach, and is less than four years older than the victim and engages in vaginal intercourse or a sexual act with a victim who is a student, is guilty of a Class ~~I~~G felony.

(c) This section shall apply unless the conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing for greater punishment.

(d) Consent is not a defense to a charge under this section.

(e) For purposes of this section, the terms "school", "school personnel", and "student" shall have the same meaning as in G.S. 14-202.4(d). For purposes of this section, the term "school safety officer" shall include a school resource officer or any other person who is regularly present in a school for the purpose of promoting and maintaining safe and orderly schools. following definitions apply:



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- 1           (1) School. – As defined in G.S. 14-202.4(d)(2).  
 2           (2) School personnel. – As defined in G.S. 14-202.4(d)(3).  
 3           (3) School safety officer. – A school resource officer or any other person who is  
 4           regularly present in a school for the purpose of promoting and maintaining  
 5           safe and orderly schools.  
 6           (4) Student. – A person enrolled in kindergarten, or in grade one through grade  
 7           12 in any school within six months of any violation of this section."

8           **SECTION 1.(b)** G.S. 14-202.4 reads as rewritten:

9           **"§ 14-202.4. Taking indecent liberties with a student.**

10          (a) If a defendant, who is a teacher, school administrator, student teacher, school safety  
 11 officer, or coach, at any age, or who is other school personnel and is at least four years older than  
 12 the victim, takes indecent liberties with a victim who is a student, at any time during or after the  
 13 time the defendant and victim were present together in the same school but before the victim  
 14 ceases to be a student, the defendant is guilty of a Class I-G felony, unless the conduct is covered  
 15 under some other provision of law providing for greater punishment. A person is not guilty of  
 16 taking indecent liberties with a student if the person is lawfully married to the student.

17          (b) If a defendant, who is school personnel, other than a teacher, school administrator,  
 18 student teacher, school safety officer, or coach, and who is less than four years older than the  
 19 victim, takes indecent liberties with a student as provided in subsection (a) of this section, the  
 20 defendant is guilty of a Class I-G felony.

21          (c) Consent is not a defense to a charge under this section.

22          (d) For purposes of this section, the following definitions apply:

- 23           (1) ~~"Indecent liberties" means:~~ Indecent liberties. – Means any of the following:  
 24           a. Willfully taking or attempting to take any immoral, improper, or  
 25           indecent liberties with a student for the purpose of arousing or  
 26           gratifying sexual ~~desire; or~~ desire.  
 27           b. Willfully committing or attempting to commit any lewd or lascivious  
 28           act upon or with the body or any part or member of the body of a  
 29           student.

30           For purposes of this section, the term indecent liberties does not include  
 31 vaginal intercourse or a sexual ~~act as defined by G.S. 14-27.20.~~ act.

- 32           (1a) ~~"Same school" means a~~ Same school. – A school at which (i) the student is  
 33           enrolled or is present for a school-sponsored or school-related activity and (ii)  
 34           the school personnel is employed, volunteers, or is present for a  
 35           school-sponsored or school-related activity.  
 36           (2) ~~"School" means any~~ School. – Any public school, charter school, or nonpublic  
 37           school under Parts 1 and 2 of Article 39 of Chapter 115C of the General  
 38           Statutes.  
 39           (3) ~~"School personnel" means any~~ School personnel. – Any person included in  
 40           the definition contained in G.S. 115C-332(a)(2), including those employed by  
 41           a nonpublic, charter, or regional school, and any person who volunteers at a  
 42           school or a school-sponsored activity.  
 43           (3a) ~~"School safety officer" means any~~ School safety officer. – Any other person  
 44           who is regularly present in a school for the purpose of promoting and  
 45           maintaining safe and orderly schools and includes a school resource officer.  
 46           (3b) Sexual act. – As defined in G.S. 14-27.20.  
 47           (4) ~~"Student" means a~~ Student. – A person enrolled in kindergarten, or in grade  
 48           one through grade 12 in any school within six months of any violation  
 49           of this section."

50           **SECTION 1.(c)** This section becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to  
 51 offenses committed on or after that date.

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2 **PART II. INCREASE PENALTIES FOR FAILING TO REPORT MISCONDUCT**  
3 **TOWARD CHILDREN**

4 **SECTION 2.(a)** Article 22 of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes is amended by  
5 adding a new Part to read:

6 "Part 3B. Reporting Misconduct of Licensed School Employees.

7 **"§ 115C-326.20. Reporting misconduct of licensed school employees.**

8 (a) For the purposes of this section, "misconduct" includes any of the following:

9 (1) Conduct that justifies automatic revocation of a license under  
10 G.S. 115C-270.35(b).

11 (2) The infliction of a physical injury against a child other than by accident or in  
12 self-defense.

13 (b) Any superintendent, assistant superintendent, associate superintendent, personnel  
14 administrator, or principal who knows or has reason to believe that an employee licensed under  
15 Article 17E of this Chapter has engaged in misconduct resulting in dismissal, disciplinary action,  
16 or resignation shall report the misconduct to the State Board of Education within five days of  
17 dismissal, determination of disciplinary action, or acceptance of resignation. Failure to report  
18 misconduct pursuant to this section is a Class I felony.

19 (c) School personnel shall not threaten, harass, or retaliate against any other person for  
20 making a report as required by this section."

21 **SECTION 2.(b)** This section becomes effective December 1, 2023, and applies to  
22 offenses committed on or after that date.

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24 **PART III. PRODUCE AND DISTRIBUTE CFSS TRAINING VIDEO**

25 **SECTION 3.(a)** G.S. 115C-105.57(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to  
26 read:

27 "(2a) Develop and produce age-appropriate videos to be shown to students in grades  
28 six through 12 that include at least the information listed in G.S. 115C-12(47).  
29 The videos shall be distributed to all public school units and may be provided  
30 to nonpublic schools at the request of the nonpublic school."

31 **SECTION 3.(b)** G.S. 115C-12(47) reads as rewritten:

32 "(47) Duty Regarding Child Abuse and Neglect. – The State Board of Education, in  
33 consultation with the Superintendent of Public Instruction, shall adopt a rule  
34 requiring information on child abuse and neglect, including age-appropriate  
35 information on sexual abuse, to be provided by public school units to students  
36 in grades six through 12. This rule shall also apply to high schools under the  
37 control of The University of North Carolina. Information shall be provided in  
38 the form of (i) a document provided to all students at the beginning of each  
39 school year and year, (ii) a display posted in visible, high-traffic areas  
40 throughout each public secondary school, and (iii) a video, produced  
41 in accordance with G.S. 115C-105.57(c)(2a), shown to all students no more  
42 than five days after the first day of the school year. The document and display  
43 document, display, and video shall include, at a minimum, the following  
44 information:

45 ...."

46 **SECTION 3.(c)** The Center for Safer Schools shall produce and distribute the videos  
47 required by this section no later than June 30, 2024.

48 **SECTION 3.(d)** This section is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning  
49 with the 2024-2025 school year.

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51 **PART IV. EFFECTIVE DATE**

1                   **SECTION 4.** Except as otherwise provided, this act is effective when it becomes  
2 law.
