## **Historical Budget Overview**


State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2022 final results continued NC Medicaid's trend of finishing the year under budget.

#### **Current Year NC Medicaid Spending: On Track**

Through December (1/2 of SFY 2023), NC Medicaid has spent approximately 1/2 of the operating budget for the fiscal year.

### Current Year NC Medicaid Budget (SFY 2023)

#### **Key Factors:**

- Continuation of the public health emergency (PHE) relieved pressure
- COVID rate increases for Skilled Nursing Facilities (SNF), Hospice, Personal Care Services (PCS) extension to June 30
- Tailored Care Management (12/1) and Tailored Plans (4/1) Launch

#### **Looking Ahead to Next Year (SFY 2024)**

#### **Key Factors:**

- Decrease in regular federal match % (67.71 → 65.91)
- Continuous Coverage Unwinding
- Pressure on capitation rates (acuity, care cost inflation)
- New high-cost pharmaceuticals
- Direct care workforce
- Medicaid Expansion (reduces state expenditures)

#### Medicaid Enrollment at an All-time High

Medicaid Enrollment by Eligibility Category since the start of the PHE 3.500



Partial Duals and Other Limited Benefit (up 75%) Family Planning (up 30%)

Parents and Other Adults (up 139%)

Aged/Blind/Disabled (up 9%)


Medicaid and Health Choice Children (up 21%)

# Monthly Medicaid Enrollment by Month, Actual & Forecast (Excluding Family Planning)

Following the Continuous Coverage unwinding, Medicaid enrollment is projected to remain at an elevated level compared to March 2020.

## **Upward Pressure on Capitation Rates**

Two factors driving upward pressure on Per Member Per Month (PMPM) rates:

#### 1. Higher "acuity mix" of remaining members

Medical needs and costs of individuals projected to remain in Medicaid are expected to be higher on average compared to needs/costs for those whose coverage ends

#### 2. Health Care cost inflation

Various goods and services cost more than the prior year
