#### **Executive Summary**

Session Law 2021-180, Senate Bill 105, directed the Department of Health and Human Services' (DHHS) Office of Rural Health (ORH) to use \$10,000,000 in non-recurring funds to award competitive grants to hospitals for expanded telepsychiatry capabilities to respond to the COVID-19 public health emergency by allowing patients being served in primary care settings to access hospital-based virtual psychiatric assessments and consultations.

ORH awarded seven (7) hospitals up to \$1.5 million each through a Request for Applications process that was made available to eligible sites via notification on ORH's website. Applicants were scored based on their responses to eight (8) granted-based criteria. Each application's ranking and selection for award was scored using weighted values with a possible maximum cumulative score of 100 points. Selection was achieved by a panel of five (5) ORH staff members who scored each applicant individually. Final scores were tabulated, and seven applications were found to meet the minimum requirements for the grant award.

SECTION 9B.8A.(b) of S.L.2021-180 further directed DHHS to announce the recipients of the competitive grant awards authorized under subsection (a) and report to the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services on the following:

- (1) The amount awarded to each grantee
- (2) The anticipated number of persons to be served by each grantee
- (3) The geographic area to be served as a result of each grantee's expanded telepsychiatry services

The table below identifies those hospitals across the state that have been selected to expand telepsychiatry capabilities through facilitating patient access to hospital-based virtual telepsychiatry services from a primary care provider's office, from home, or from another nonhospital setting.
