#### **Legislative Directive**

Session Law 2021-180, Part V, Section 7.19, directed the Superintendent of the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction to establish the N.C. School Safety Grant program with the purpose of improving safety in public school units by providing grants for services for students in crisis, school safety training, and safety equipment in schools.

Specific allocations for the 2022-23 school year include:

- \$33 million for School Resource Officers
- \$41 million for Services for Students in Crisis, School Safety Training and Safety Equipment in Schools

This report will serve as the required reporting by the Superintendent of Public Instruction to the Joint Legislative Education Oversight Committee, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services, the Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Justice and Public Safety, the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations, and the Fiscal Research Division as indicated in SECTION 7.19 (j) of Session Law 2021-180.

Per legislation, this report includes:

- Identity of each entity that received a grant through the program.
- Amount of funding provided to each entity that received a grant.
- Use of funds by each entity that received a grant.
- Recommendations for the implementation of additional effective school safety measures. (2021-180, s. 7.19 (j)).

Appendix A of this report includes the identity of each entity that received a grant through the program and the amount of funding provided to each entity.

#### **Grant Details**

For 2022, the School Safety Grant Program made available \$74.6 million in school safety funding with \$33 million earmarked for the hiring and training of school resource officers and \$41 million to public school units for services for students in crisis, school safety training, and safety equipment in schools. These funds were available to district, charter, and other independent public schools.

Two hundred twenty-three (223) Public School Units and individual schools were awarded \$74.5 million. (Appendix A).

#### **Eligible Uses of 2022 School Safety Grant Funds:**

- School Resource Officers for elementary and middle schools
- Services for Students in Crisis
- School Safety Training
- School Safety Equipment

#### **Matching Funds Requirement:**

The School Resource Grant has a 2:1 match requirement for non-low wealth and a 4:1 match for low wealth Districts. Low wealth-eligible PSUs are those located in counties in which the county wealth (per the legislated formula) is less than 100% of the state average wealth.

The Safe Schools Grant for Equipment, Services for Students in Crisis and School Safety Training (SET Grant) do not have a match-fund requirement.

#### **Grant Information**

As a result of the N.C. School Safety Grant Program, 801 SROs were placed in middle and elementary schools. Many PSUs would have not had the funding to do so without this program. Based on the SRO census conducted in 2022, the SROs have seen an increase in criminal behavior in schools, thus solidifying the need for additional SROs. SROs are a critical part of schools, often being the first interaction that students have with law enforcement. SROs across the state have taken on the role as mentor and coach, all while maintaining a law enforcement presence.

PSUs across the state have requested and received over \$3 million in Services for Students in Crisis. Services that have been requested include the hiring of Social Workers, Peer to Peer Mentoring Services, Mental Health-trained Therapists and Mental Health Clinicians who can provide early identification, screening, referrals, individual therapy, case management and support, staff training and risk assessment consultation. According to the N.C. State Center for Health Statistics, suicide is now the leading cause of death in youth ages 10-14 in our state. The need for mental health services is now more crucial than ever.

The most common requests for School Safety Training include Youth Mental Health First Aid and Restorative Justice Training. Youth Mental Health First Aid teaches adults how to recognize when a youth is having a mental health crisis and the appropriate response to best support the youth. Restorative Justice Training enables PSUs to address the effect of behavior while still holding the person accountable for said behavior. This is a training that aims to reduce student suspension and expulsion.

School Safety Equipment is the most-requested category in the School Safety Grant Program. The PSUs requested over \$82.7 million in equipment alone. PSUs have requested items such as door access controls, fencing to enclose school property, vape detectors, radios, communication devices, cameras, visitor sign in kiosks, window screens and door locks. Most of these items are the first line of protection for students, and without the upgrades and improvements, it places students in a more vulnerable state.

#### **Anticipated Future Needs**

The School Safety Grant Program began with \$12 million and today totals \$74 million, with \$33 million for SROs and \$41.5 million for Safety Equipment, Services for Students in Crisis and Training to Increase School Safety (SET Grant). We are appreciative that the General Assembly can see the increasing need for school safety funding.

The PSUs requested over \$89.2 million in SET Grant funding. It is our request that the General Assembly will increase the School Safety Grant funding to \$90 million in fiscal year 2025. The increase in funding is vital to keep up with rising supply costs, as well as the continuously needed safety improvements throughout the state.

#### Recommendations

The following changes would help improve the effectiveness of the School Safety Grant Program and advance toward the goal of strengthening school safety across the state:

- 1. In addition to recurring funding for SROs, the creation of recurring funding for staff training, safety equipment and services for students in crisis.
- 2. Permit carryforward of encumbered, unexpended funds for 60 days. This allows public school units to finish critical trainings over the summer, extend services for students in crisis during the summer months and complete procurement processes. This is particularly critical due to the ongoing challenges with the supply chain.
