HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
Tuesday, October 2, 2018

Pursuant to a call of His Excellency, Governor Roy Cooper, hereinafter recorded, the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of North Carolina convenes in its Hall in Extra Session, at the hour of ten o'clock a.m., Tuesday, October 2, 2018, and is called to order by the Speaker of the House, Tim Moore.

The following prayer is offered by Representative Jimmy Dixon:

"Our kind Father in Heaven, we thank Thee for the opportunity to assemble here today. And we thank Thee for our desire to help one another face the adversities of life.

"We thank Thee for the freedoms and liberties passed to us by former generations. We thank Thee for the greatness of America, as a beacon of hope for many who are downtrodden by circumstances beyond their control.

"Please hear our prayer as we assemble in this special session to consider how our State government might properly respond to the needs of our citizens as they begin to recover from the effects of the recent hurricane.

"Please help us find the proper balance between government and individual responsibility to be prepared for the storms of life.

"Bless us to know that a pound of gold may be less important than an ounce of compassionate service to our fellow man.

"Father, we love Thee and Thy Son. Bless us that we might love one another.

"In the Name of Jesus Christ. Amen."

The Speaker leads the Body in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Leaves of absence are granted Representatives J. Bell, Blackwell, Bert Jones, G. Martin, S. Martin, and Reives for today. Representatives Earle and Gill are excused for a portion of the Session.

PROCLAMATION OF AN EXTRA SESSION

WHEREAS, Hurricane Florence ("the Hurricane") made landfall off the coast of North Carolina on or about 14 September 2018 and has claimed the lives of thirty-six people in our State; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane has inflicted severe damage on public and private property; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane's impacts constitute a State of Emergency, as defined in N.C. Gen. Stat. § 166A-19.3(19), and declared in Executive Order No. 51 on 07 September 2018; and

WHEREAS, the State's residents have suffered losses and will likely suffer imminent further widespread damage within the scope of N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 166A-19.3(3) and 166A-19.2 1 (b); and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane's impacts are extraordinary circumstances requiring the North Carolina General Assembly to convene in an extra session to respond to the damage created by the Hurricane; and

WHEREAS, the Governor, pursuant to N.C. Const. art. III, § 5(7) issued a proclamation on 21 September 2018 for an extra session of the North Carolina General Assembly commencing Tuesday, 09 October 2018 at two o'clock in the afternoon to address the Hurricane's impacts; and

WHEREAS, after further consultation with the Speaker of the North Carolina House and the President Pro Tempore of the North Carolina Senate, all parties agree that the General Assembly should return in an extra session on Tuesday, 02 October 2018 at ten o'clock in the morning; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina has a constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed and uphold the Constitution and laws of the United States and the State of North Carolina;

October 2, 2018

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, pursuant to Article III, Section 5(7) of the North Carolina State Constitution, RESCIND THE EXTRA SESSION PROCLAMATION ISSUED 21 SEPTEMBER 2018 and hereby proclaim an "EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY" commencing Tuesday, 02 October 2018 at ten o'clock in the morning to address Hurricane Recovery.

**CONGRATULATING THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF DALLAS
ON ITS ONE HUNDREDTH FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY**

WHEREAS, in 1864, the practice of an integrated worship service was part of the Long Creek Baptist Church in the Village of Dallas, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the membership rolls of Long Creek Baptist Church included 74 slaves, who worshipped in the "Loft" of the church along with the white members; and

WHEREAS, on July 4, 1868, three years after the Emancipation Proclamation, the Church's clerk, E.H. Withers, and members, Brethren H. Jenkins and William Withers, gave letters dismissing all the black members of the Church to form a church of their own and ending the era of joint worship between blacks and whites; and

WHEREAS, the black members established the First Baptist Church and until their church was completed, the black members were granted use of the Long Creek Baptist Church for worship whenever the white members were not using it; and

WHEREAS, in 1922, a building was erected on the current site of the First Baptist Church that housed both a school and a place to worship, which served the black community well until the building was destroyed by fire; and

WHEREAS, during the 1930s, the first brick church was built with two impressive bell towers, however, the church sustained damage due to a fire in the 1940's and was later restored with only one bell tower; and

WHEREAS, under the leadership of the late Rev. Dr. Roscoe W. Ramsey, Sr., a new church was built and dedicated on March 23, 2001, adjacent to the historic structure, which now serves as a youth and community center;

NOW, THEREFORE, the First Baptist Church deserves to be recognized for 150 years of continuous service to the Dallas community and its congregation.

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H.R. 1, A HOUSE RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE PERMANENT RULES OF THE 2018 THIRD EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives:

SECTION 1. The permanent rules of the 2017 Regular Session of the House of Representatives, with the following amendments, are adopted as the permanent rules of the 2018 Third Extra Session:

- (1) **RULE 1 shall read as follows: "RULE 1. Convening Hour.** The House shall convene each legislative day at the hour fixed by the House. In the event the House adjourns on the preceding legislative day without having fixed an hour for reconvening, the House shall convene on the next legislative day at 10:00 A.M."
- (2) Notwithstanding **RULE 26**, the Committee on Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House, the Ethics Committee, the Finance Committee, and the Appropriations Committee (not including the Appropriations Committees for budget-specific areas) shall be comprised of the members who were appointed during the Regular Session and other members as the Speaker may appoint at the beginning of the Third Extra Session. The Chairs and Vice-Chairs of those committees shall be those who were appointed by the Speaker during the Regular Session.
- (3) Notwithstanding **RULE 27**, the standing committees of the House are:
 - Committees
 - a. Rules, Calendar, and Operations of the House
 - b. Ethics
 - c. Appropriations
 - d. FinanceAll rules of the 2017 Regular Session applicable to standing committees of the House other than the committees named in this subdivision are inoperative. The Speaker may appoint select committees and fill vacancies of standing committees under **RULE 26**.
- (4) Notwithstanding **RULE 31(a)**, any bill or resolution shall be introduced by submitting the bill or resolution to the Principal Clerk's Office.
- (5) Notwithstanding **RULES 31 and 31.1**:
 - a. The only resolutions that may be introduced or considered in the House are resolutions adjourning the 2018 Third Extra Session sine die.
 - b. All bills shall be excluded from introduction or consideration in the House, other than bills addressing emergency management and disaster recovery related to Hurricane Florence and resiliency planning for future natural disasters.

- (6) RULE 31.1 shall not apply to resolutions adjourning the 2018 Third Extra Session sine die and bills addressing emergency management and disaster recovery related to Hurricane Florence and resiliency planning for future natural disasters.
- (7) Notwithstanding RULES 32 and 41, a resolution or bill may be placed on the calendar without being referred by the Speaker to a committee and on the same legislative day of its introduction or receipt from the Senate.
- (8) Notwithstanding RULE 34(b), the Principal Clerk may accept a bill for introduction if the draft contains names preprinted on the bill jacket and body of the bill as primary sponsors without the signature of each member listed.
- (9) Notwithstanding RULE 36(b) and (b1), a bill reported favorably by a committee or received for concurrence may be placed on the favorable calendar on the same day it is reported and a proposed committee substitute does not have to be distributed electronically to committee members prior to being considered by the committee.
- (10) Notwithstanding RULE 38(b), a bill that in any way reduces revenue or waives a fee may be reported to the Standing Committee on Appropriations instead of the Committee on Finance and does not need to be reported to the Committee on Finance.
- (11) Notwithstanding RULE 41:
 - a. The first reading and reference to a standing committee of a House bill shall occur on the legislative day of its introduction. The first reading and reference to a standing committee of a Senate bill shall occur on the legislative day of its receipt on messages from the Senate. The Speaker shall give notice at each subsequent reading whether it is the second or third reading.
 - b. Except for a bill governed by Section 23 of Article II of the North Carolina Constitution, a bill may be read more than once on the same day.
- (12) Notwithstanding RULE 44(d), a conference report may be placed on the calendar for the legislative day on which the report is received.
- (13) Notwithstanding RULE 59:
 - a. These rules do not limit the number of members who may be listed as primary sponsors.
 - b. Any member wishing to cosponsor a bill or resolution that has been introduced may do so on the day during which the bill or resolution was first read and referred, but only while the bill or resolution is in the possession of the House.

SECTION 2. This resolution is effective upon adoption.

WHEREAS, the weather events and impacts associated with the Hurricane are extraordinary circumstances and require the North Carolina General Assembly to convene in an extra session to consider Hurricane recovery, response, and relief; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of North Carolina has a constitutional duty to take care that the laws be faithfully executed and uphold the Constitution and laws of the United States and of the State of North Carolina;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ROY COOPER, Governor of the State of North Carolina, pursuant to Article III, Section 5(7) of the North Carolina State Constitution, do hereby proclaim an "**EXTRA SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY**" commencing Tuesday, October 9, 2018, at two o'clock in the afternoon, for the purpose of addressing Hurricane recovery, response, and relief.
