 - 9a) The number of applicants for a license and, of that number, the number granted license: 960
- 9b) The number of applicants with a conviction record and, of that number, the number granted a license, denied a license for any reason, and denied a license because of a conviction: 414 applicants in the FY had criminal records, 392 of which



were approved to continue licensure process. Twenty-two (22) applicants were denied based on their criminal history or based on still serving probation.

- (9c) The number of applicants who are active-duty military or military veterans, the number granted a license, the number denied a license for any reason, and a summary of the reasons for denial. The Board has not asked for this previously, but in the reporting period added this as a demographic attribute to its database. So far, 421 licensees have been identified as veterans, and 14 have identified as active duty.
