Why ecourts and Online Access to Justice?

N.C. Constitution, Article 1, Section 18: "The Courts shall be open"



- Replaces isolated paper files with online access to justice.
- Saves countless trips to the courthouse.
- Empowers the public with electronic search and filing.
- Guides users through filing common legal actions.
- Supports remote proceedings, access to court records, case events and court dates.
- Provides cloud-hosted infrastructure and storage.
- Integrates system applications and processes statewide.
 - Ensures business continuity during emergencies.

24/7 ELECTRONIC ACCESS **BENEFITS ALL NORTH CAROLINIANS**

- Provides 24/7 statewide access to the court system for all North Carolinians
- Small business owners (after-hours access)
- Law enforcement officers (remote appearances)
- Rural North Carolinians (reduced travel to courthouses) and Urban North Carolinians (avoided traffic and parking fees)

- Victims of domestic violence (reduces the emotional trauma of in-person appearance)
- Sheriffs and corrections officers (inmates appearing virtually reduces security risks and transportation costs)
- Families (remote appearances for children and guardians ad litem in custody disputes)
- Doctors and expert witnesses (remote appearances means less time waiting in court and cost reduction)
















COURTROOM AUDIO VIDEO EXPERIENCE (CRAVE)


Digital Records and Remote Proceedings

- Funded by NCGA in 2021 budget
- Video Conferencing platform designed for access by most major vendor video end-points.
- Courtroom video infrastructure integrates with cloud hosted video platform to provide a virtual courtroom
 - Multiple HD-Audio sensing courtroom cameras and displays
 - Provides an immersive courtroom experience
 - Ability to Pre-Schedule Court Sessions with Local Jails prior to Court (Inmate confirm appear)
 - Remote Proceedings (CRAVE) + Digital Records
 Access (eCourts) = Combined Convenience



eFILING IS REQUIRED FOR ATTORNEYS

The Supreme Court of North Carolina requires that all filings made in those counties with Odyssey by an attorney must be filed electronically via File & Serve or Guide & File. Paper filings will not be accepted.

Self-represented litigants are permitted to file electronically or in paper. Please see Rule 5 of the North Carolina General Rules of Practice for more information.





PREPARE COURT DOCUMENTS ONLINE TO FILE CASES IN THREE STEPS

- Answer online questions to prepare the case filing
- Automatically create legal documents for free
- File documents with the clerk of court (eFiling available for select case types in eCourts counties only)





ACCESS COURT RECORDS ON COURTHOUSE KIOSKS OR ONLINE

- · View court dates and hearings
- View case information, records, judgments and documents
- Pay fines and fees for criminal cases and infractions online

RECENT INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATES

- In early March, vendor released major configuration code software which has contributed to improved processing timeframes and enhanced system stability.
- AOC required vendor to migrate AOC cloud hosting infrastructure to an Enhanced-High-Availability AWS architecture, design and implement segmented data base integration infrastructure of which has also improved processing timeframes and enhanced system stability.
- After review of past Infrastructure Capacity and Utilization metrics, AOC had the vendor add server and data base server infrastructure to meet current/forecasted AOC utilization requirements.
- Prior to each Track Go-Live, AOC and vendor review forecasted server/storage capacity requirements to scale cloud hosted environment to meet infrastructure need.

CONFIGURATIONS VS. CUSTOMIZATIONS

- Configuration examples:
 - Inputting all 2,000+ criminal offense codes into Odyssey
 - Providing all disposition outcomes as options for end users to select
 - Case Types and related Rights & Roles (for example, Clerks as recordkeeper for all case types and as Judicial Official for Probate and Special Proceedings)
 - eFiling options
 - Rights & Roles for all end users



CONFIGURATIONS VS. CUSTOMIZATIONS

- Customization examples:
 - External integrations (SHP, GDAC, DMV, DST, DOR, DPS/DAC, NICS, State Bar, etc.)
 - NC-specific citation, probation, and restitution templates
 - NC Judgment Search
 - Service of electronic service
 - Localized subpoena form options
 - Courtroom video monitor extract



CONFIGURATIONS VS. CUSTOMIZATIONS

- Examples of pending customizations:
 - Debt-set off automation
 - Bond forfeiture automation
 - Auto-notification of case events
 - Judgment Search enhancements
 - Additional options for court start/end time
 - Auto-cancellation of future hearings in certain closed cases
 - Online payment of judgments
 - Business Court case management



FUTURE PLANNING

- Focus on streamlining processes and automation
- Judicial stakeholder meetings
- Continued collaboration with NCBA's eCourts Working Group
- Post-implementation review and strategic planning
