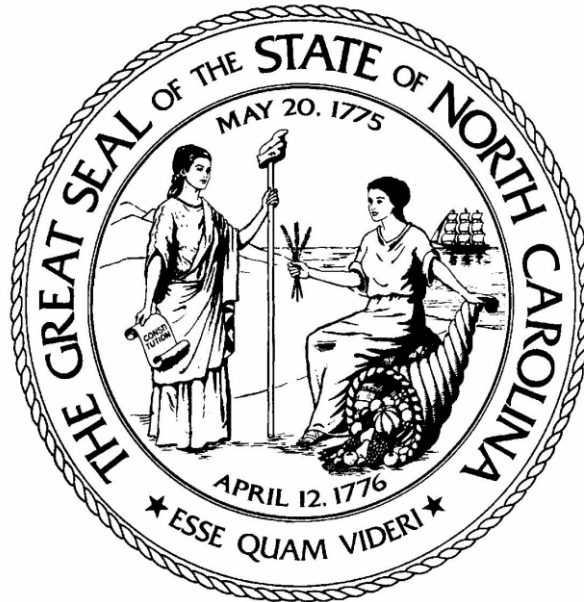

Legislative committee or commission contact information can be found in Part II under the listing for that committee.

Part II, printed on green paper, is ‘Study Commissions, Committees, and Task Forces’. Each entry includes: the establishing legal authority; reporting requirements when applicable; scope of duties; additional studies assigned or referred; and, for legislative commissions and committees, the membership appointed to date along with their names, addresses and telephone numbers, and committee staff and their telephone numbers.

CAPACITY FOR INCREASING FERRY MAINTENANCE

Authority: SL2023-134 §41.11E, HB 259.
Report by: Ferry Division of the Department of Transportation
Report to: Chairs of the Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee, the chairs of the House and Senate Transportation Appropriations Committees, and the Fiscal Research Division.
Report due: No later than March 1, 2024.
Scope: Shall study increasing in-house capacity for vessel maintenance, including maintenance related to credit dry-dock examinations required by the United States Coast Guard. This study shall include all of the following: (1) An evaluation of all of the following options for increasing in-house capacity for vessel maintenance: a. Expanding berths and staffing at Manns Harbor. b. Using existing State-owned properties for dry-dock availability. c. Purchasing or leasing additional property elsewhere along the North Carolina coast. The evaluation of this option shall include the identification of specific sites or regions where potential additional shipyard capacity may be found and whether the local population of that site or region possesses sufficient skilled labor to support vessel maintenance. d. Any other option that could potentially increase in-house capacity for vessel maintenance. (2) For each option evaluated pursuant to subdivision (1) of this subsection, the Division shall assess both of the following: a. The total costs the Division will incur for each option. b. The steps that would be necessary to implement each option and a proposed time line for implementation. (3) An assessment of whether the presence of skilled employment in the local population is sufficient to support vessel maintenance.

Scope: Shall convene a group of stakeholders, including representatives from the Conference of District Attorneys, the State Bureau of Investigation, the NC Justice Center, attorneys who represent clients seeking expunctions, clerks and other court personnel, sheriffs, the Division of Motor Vehicles, and individuals with criminal records who are members of the NC Second Chance Alliance to examine and make recommendations to resolve the issues that have arisen with the implementation of G.S. 15A-146(a4), including issues related to notice to all relevant agencies and file retention. The stakeholder group may consider and recommend solutions for issues related to the expunction of records that do not require the

total destruction of all court files and that would allow access to these particular expunction records by additional parties.

GREEN INDUSTRY ECONOMIC IMPACT

Report due: Shall report by January 15, 2025.
Scope: Shall study the statewide, regional, and county-level economic impact of the green industry in the State. CALS shall perform the study in consultation with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and The North Carolina Green Industry Council. For purposes of the study required pursuant to this section, the green industry refers to the production, design, installation, maintenance, and sale of plants, including trees, shrubs, flowers, sod, and related goods and services, to enhance, beautify, and protect human environments and to provide jobs and economic growth, including at least the following: (1) Nursery and tree production. (2) Turfgrass production. (3) Horticulture input and equipment suppliers. (4) Landscaping and landscape design services. (5) Nursery, florists, garden center, and farm supply retailers. (6) Composting. (7) Urban forestry. (8) Parks and airports. (9) Christmas tree production. (10) Botanic gardens and arboretums.

HEALTH INFORMATION EXCHANGE NETWORK

Authority: SL2022-74 §9B.3, HB103.
Report by: Health Information Exchange Advisory Board
Report to: Joint Legislative Oversight Committee on Health and Human Services
Report due: By March 31, 2023.
Scope: Shall submit a report on the statewide health information exchange network (HIE Network) known as NC HealthConnex. The report shall include at a minimum: (1) An update regarding the connectivity status of providers and entities required by G.S. 90-414.4 to connect to and submit data through the HIE Network. This update shall be based on an analysis conducted by the North Carolina Health Information Exchange Authority, with assistance as necessary from the Department of State Treasurer, State Health Plan Division, and the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Health Benefits. (2) As a supplement to the recommendations provided pursuant to Section 7(a) of S.L. 2021-26, additional recommendations regarding appropriate features or actions, including legislative or administrative proposals, to support enforcement of the Statewide Health Information Exchange Act and enhancement of the HIE Network. Notwithstanding any provision of Article 29B of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes or any other provision of law to the contrary, connecting to and submitting data through the HIE Network known as NC HealthConnex shall not be a condition precedent to the receipt of State funds, including Medicaid funds, by any provider or entity subject to subsection (b) of G.S. 90-414.4 until a bill designating a lead agency responsible for enforcement of the Statewide Health Information Exchange Act is enacted into law.

INTEROPERABLE AND INTERCONNECTED STUDENT DATA SYSTEMS

Report due: No later than March 15, 2023.
Scope: In consultation with the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority, the Department of Public Instruction, the Community College System Office, and The University of North Carolina System Office, in partnership with their respective public school units, community colleges, and universities, shall submit a report on requirements necessary to create an interconnected and interoperable real-time data system to facilitate communication, collection, and transition of student data between public school units, community colleges, and universities and to provide students access to their own data, including after the student leaves the institution. The goal of such a system would be to share data more efficiently among educational institutions using existing student information management systems, to assist students in earning postsecondary credentials that could assist the student in finding employment, and to eliminate redundant efforts and expenses among the institutions. The report shall include at least the following: (1) Current instances of best practices regarding data warehouses, school district-community

partnerships, and relationship management systems. (2) Technology necessary to create such an interconnected and interoperable system and to create a working prototype. (3) Legal considerations for sharing data across institutional systems that would conform with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), specifically focusing on student support services. (4) Human capital and machine capabilities, such as artificial intelligence, needed to develop data and analytical capacity across institutions. (5) Any issues that may arise with cultural views on data as an individually owned resource, as opposed to a collaborative tool. (6) As applicable, the potential role of existing State longitudinal data systems.

Scope: Shall review 15A NCAC 02B .0208 (Standards for Toxic Substances and Temperature) to determine if the standards and methodologies for establishment of water quality criteria for specific pollutants included therein are scientifically sound, protective of human health and the environment, and result in water quality criteria that are technologically achievable without placing undue economic burdens on publicly owned treatment works and their ratepayers. In its review, the Commission shall examine (i) other states' narrative water quality standards and identify other states with more stringent and less stringent narrative standards and (ii) requirements established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency for development of narrative water quality standards and water quality criteria by states, as well as any discretion given to states to set standards and criteria.

The Committee shall review and examine the grievance and complaint process of the North Carolina State Bar, including any rules, procedures, and policies to address the following issues of concern: (1) The grievance process, including the role of the Grievance Committee, grievance review panel, and the Disciplinary Hearing Commission. (2) Right to due process, right to be heard, and other rights consistent with G.S. 84-30 of the accused person during the grievance and discipline process. (3) Sufficiency and thoroughness of the screening, decision making, and review of grievances and complaints. (3) Review alternative ways to capture and recover the costs of information technology goods and services that DIT provides to State agencies. (4) Examine how replacement costs are accounted for and built into State agency operating budgets. (5) Review whether some State agencies should pay for information technology using the current or a similar rate system or if some should have information technology charges and costs funded differently.
