Collier have accepted the grant award within the COPS Office portal, effective 5 November 2014.	30 Purpose of grant or amendment	This grant will fund \$302,851 worth of equipment purchases, travel costs, training costs, and overtime expenses, dedicated lowards the intervention, enforcement, and reduction of methamphetamine laboratories, associated criminal conspiracies, and methamphetamine trafficking in North Carolina. The grant will fund \$220,719,60 worth of covertime costs, so that investigations employed by the North Carolina State Bureau of investigation (SBI) can have extra time to work these cases. The grant will also fund \$20,000 worth of travel to national cardierences, where SBI Agents will germ about national best practices in this field or meth lab intervention, enforcement, sete mitigation, and reduction. The grant will also fund up to \$40,000 in training fees to help recruit experts in the field of Hazardous Waste Operation, enforcement, sete mitigation, and tactical entry knot bese labs. The instructors will shere insights and instruct both Bureau Agents and local law enforcement officers regarding the best ways to safely investigate, enter; secure, operate in, search, and clean these labs, in accordance with federal environmental regulations and protocots. Finally, the grant will fund up to \$21,481.79 worth of computer equipment, digital cameras, lights, and generators. This equipment will be used during the clean-up phase on location, at the site of these labs, and also in office locations while reports about these investigations are produced. Meth labs and other methamphetamine seitures and crimes in North Carolina have increased substantially in recent years. Federal grant monitors employed by the US Department of Justice, and the SBI Agents who work these cases are hopeful that this grant will infinitely cut the growing trend of meth labs operating in our state.
